Lauria sempronii (a snail)



1 CURRENT STATUS

- 1.1 The only UK population of *Laurii sempronii* occurs at Edgeworth in the Cotswolds in two small stretches of vegetated dry-stone limestone wall. *L sempronii* is present in small numbers for most of the sixty metres of stone wall, under *Sedum acre*, among dead leaves and under the less dense areas of ivy, and on a nearby dry-stone cottage garden wall.
- 1.2 *L. sempronii* was first discovered at a site on Haresfield Beacon in 1894 but has not been refound at this site since. Another notable snail species, *Vertigo pusilla*, occurs at the extant site.
- 1.3 Links with Habitat Action Plans Since *L. sempronii* is restricted to two dry-stone walls is not associated with any Habitat Action Plans.

2 CURRENT FACTORS AFFECTING SPECIES

- 2.1 Any disturbance, such as excessive defoliation or removal of stones, of the walls where this species occurs could severely affect the population.
- 2.2 Excessive ivy encroachment on the wall; there is some evidence that it is associated with *Sedum* species here.

3 CURRENT ACTION

- 3.1 The site is regularly monitored, although not currently managed through agreement with the Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust.
- 3.2 Other walls in the Central Cotswolds were surveyed by English Nature in 1996 but no further populations were discovered.

4 **OBJECTIVES**

4.1 Maintain, and where possible increase the size of the only *Lauria sempronii* population in the UK
