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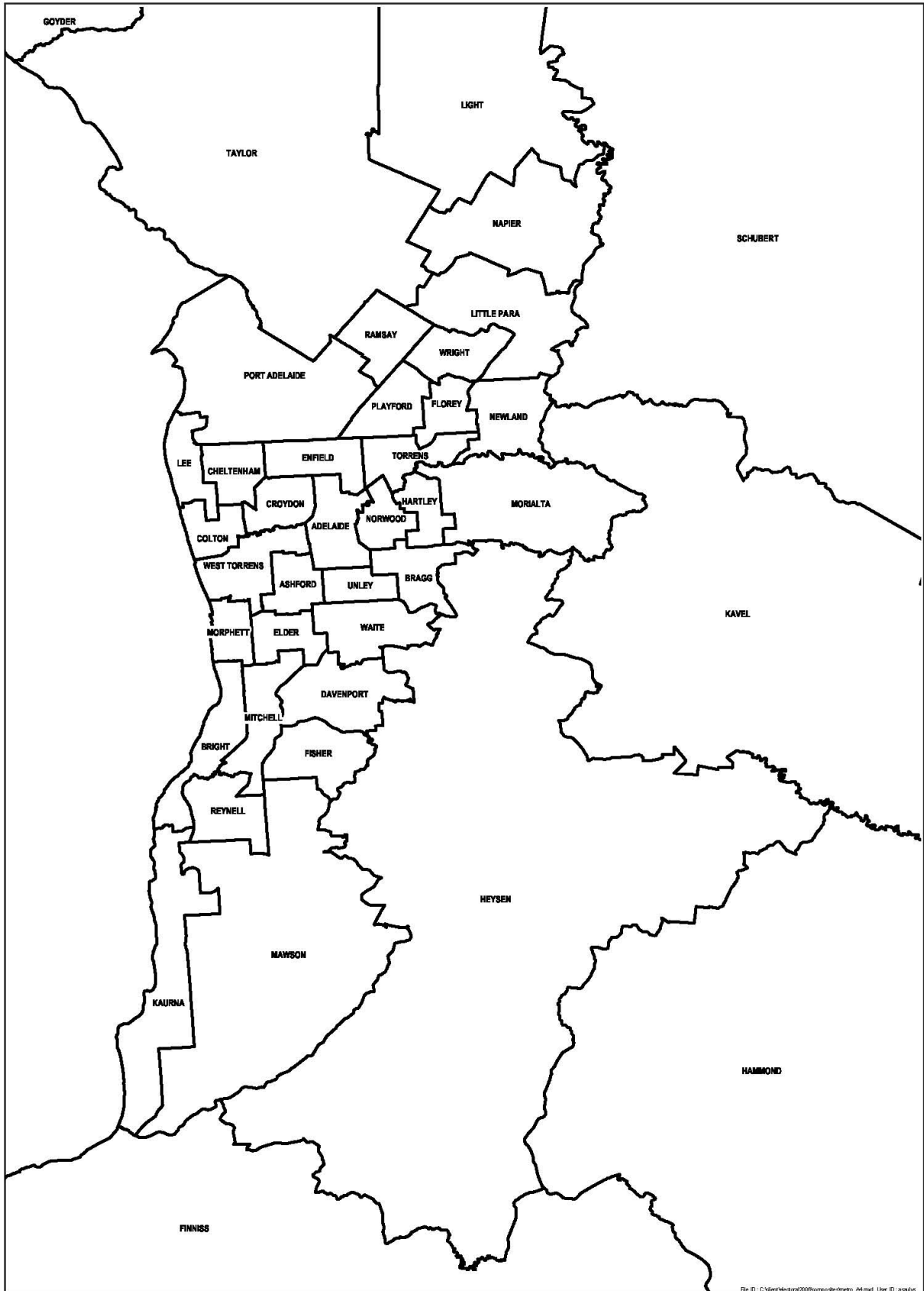

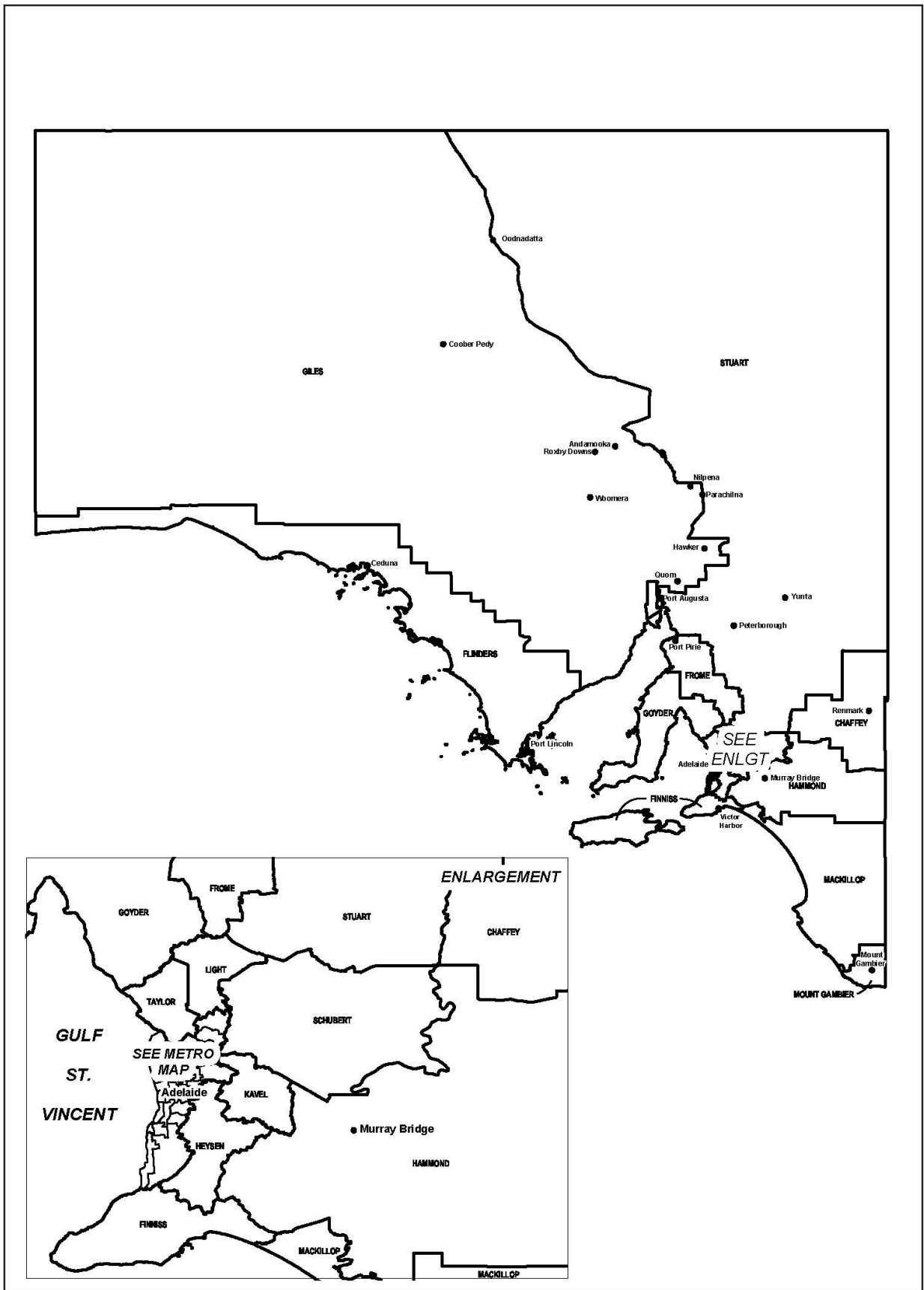
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ELECTORAL DISTRICTS BOUNDARIES COMMISSION - 2003 REDISTRIBUTION

- 1 any votes surplus to quota, 77573 votes, were transferred to the next continuing candidate according to preferences
- 2 the election of the eleven candidates took 2350 counts; all candidates achieved quota
- 3 two candidates remained in the count, Darley and Reynolds, with 34277 and 41762 votes respectively
- 4 deposits returned if a candidate was elected or, as sole candidate or member of a group, obtained > 4% of the formal vote; 4% = 37234 formal ballot papers.

### exhibition **'The Voice of the People': Democracy Comes to South Australia**

When the *White Swan* steamed into Port Adelaide on 24 October 1856, among her cargo was the official despatch giving royal assent to South Australia's Constitution and Electoral Acts. That despatch will feature in a new exhibition to open at the History Trust's Exhibition Gallery at Torrens Parade Ground on 24 October 2006. The exhibition, a collaborative project of the State Electoral Office and the History Trust of South Australia, will celebrate the sesquicentenary of responsible government in South Australia.

The exhibition will explore the making and the significance of the Constitution and its companion Electoral Act, placing them in the social and political context of the 1850s. It will examine how South Australia came to have the most radical Constitution and electoral system of the Australian colonies - a political system which included universal manhood suffrage, the secret ballot, and electoral districts based on population. The exhibition will tell the stories of some of those who worked at shaping the Acts, and explain the enduring significance of their work. It will also focus on the conduct of the first election under the new system, held on 9 March 1857, and the resulting wholly elected parliament.

The exhibition will go on to trace the evolution of democracy in South Australia over the following 150 years, including women's suffrage, the effect of Federation on Indigenous voters, and the eventual removal of property qualifications for the Legislative Council.

The exhibition will include original documents and artefacts, as well as images and text, to present the story of democracy in South Australia in an engaging and accessible manner.

### **two-day conference 150 Years of Democracy in South Australia** **8-9 March 2007**

To mark the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of South Australia's first election under the 1856 Constitution and Electoral Acts, the History Trust and the State Electoral Office will convene a two-day conference. Participants will reflect on the legacy of the 1856 Acts, and provide analysis of contemporary issues in the continuing evolution of democracy in South Australia.

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### 4.2 when democracy came to south australia

South Australia was first settled by migrants in 1836. Governance mechanisms for the young colony were as follows:

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1836 - 1843	Government of the colony was by a 'Council of Government' with five members appointed by the Crown
Mid 1843-1851	A Legislative Council was established consisting of the Governor, three official and four non-official members – all nominated
1851-1856	The original Council was replaced by 16 elected and eight nominated members, again four official and four non-official. Much debate in the new Legislative Council centred on self government for the colony, a new constitutional framework and provisions for elections for an expanded legislature. The passing of the Constitution and Electoral Acts of 1855-6 were the result of those deliberations
9 March 1857	Elections took place for a wholly elected parliament with an upper and lower house.

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The 1855-6 Constitution Act gave a vote 'to every man of the age of 21 years ...being a subject of Her Majesty'. As the Aboriginal people of the colony were proclaimed as British subjects in 1838, male Aborigines were also able to vote. Any man 'attainted or convicted of treason or felony' was denied the vote.

The 1855-6 Electoral Act provided for pre-printed ballot papers, a secret ballot and, for this election only, voters had to cross out the names of candidates they did not support. There were no political parties until the late 1890's so candidates won support based on their personality and standing in the community.

Although over twenty of the members were completely new to parliament, about one third of the men returned to the House of Assembly had sat in the previous Legislative Council and acquired considerable legislative experience. In addition Waterhouse and Hare had sat in earlier Councils.

The first parliament assembled 22 April 1857 and dissolved 1 March 1860, during which time there were four different governments. During the 1857 session, there were six resignations, the first occurring within a month of the April sitting date. A total of fourteen by-elections were held during the three parliamentary sessions.

<b>Torrens</b> Robert Richard	City of Adelaide	Most remembered for establishing the Torrens Title system of registering land ownership. Nominated Legislative Councillor as Collector of Customs 1851, Registrar General 1852-1854, Colonial Treasurer 1855-56 then briefly elected member for the City of Adelaide 1857-1858 and Premier September 1857

The districts of **Elder**, **Frome**, **Giles**, **Goyder**, **Hartley**, **Kavel**, **Reynell**, **Stuart**, **Waite** and **Wright** are all named after men who made notable contributions to the early days of the colony in the fields of exploration and surveying, education, religious settlement, winemaking, pastoral extension and architecture. Mary **Colton** worked for the welfare of women and children while **Kaurna** commemorates the indigenous inhabitants of the Adelaide Plains at the time of European settlement.

**Flinders**, named after the explorer and navigator, was one of the original 16 electorates for the partly appointed, partly elected Legislative Council from 1851 and is the only electoral district to have continued in existence since 1857.

**Light**, **Port Adelaide** and **West Torrens**, all electorates 1851 to 1856 and named as three of the districts for the House of Assembly in the 1857 Parliament, are electoral district names that are again in use today.
