CLASSIFICATION AND STATUS DESIGNATIONS

A. CLASSIFICATION

1. Way Corps

Active Way Corps (Way Corps II) and Way Corps in training.

2. Way Corps Alumni

Graduates of The Way Corps training for over a year-the finest examples of disciples and Advanced Class graduates.

3. DFAC (T)

Dropped from active Way Corps during their in-residence training.

4. **DFAC (G)**

Dropped from active Way Corps after graduating but are not at the caliber of being Way Corps Alumni.

5. Non-Way Corps

Never entered the in-residence Way Corps training. This group includes graduates of the foundational class on The Way of Abundance and Power and some nongraduates.

B. STATUS

1. Standing

Active in fellowships, receives ministry mail, abundantly shares, etc. May receive Bookstore items and subscribe to <u>The Way Magazine</u> and the Sunday Teaching Service tapes. Some listed under "standing" may be "mail-restricted by request." Sometimes these requests are made in light of family members who reside at the same address who may be hostile toward the ministry. We also receive these requests in situations like military personnel who are traveling.

2. Inactive

Not active in household fellowships; are willing to come but are not able to. For example: people who live in outlying areas, who are in the military, who have occupations that require a lot of travel, or who are incarcerated. Also, parents who support their children in the ministry but do not attend household fellowships. They may receive mail and Bookstore items, may subscribe to The Way Magazine and the Sunday Teaching Service tapes, and may abundantly share.

3. Not Standing

Not active in household fellowships and <u>not willing to come</u>, yet they are not antagonistic so as to warrant any action on the part of the ministry. This is a large number of people who have taken our classes but are no longer in the household. They <u>do not receive mail or Bookstore items but legally may subscribe to The Way Magazine and the Sunday Teaching Service tapes</u>, and may abundantly share.

4. Probation

Not allowed in household fellowships for a designated period of time but may receive mail and Bookstore items, may subscribe to <u>The Way Magazine</u> and the Sunday Teaching Service tapes, and may abundantly share.

5. Mark and Avoid

They receive no mail from the ministry, including no Bookstore items; they may not subscribe to <u>The Way Magazine</u> or the Sunday Teaching Service tapes. We do not accept their abundant sharing, and they are not allowed in the household fellowships for a designated period of time due to their antagonistic behavior.

Comment:

With the constant flow of people leaving The Way due to its aggressive mark and avoid policies, a new designation system had to be designed for tracking the status changes of its followers in their computer system.

Telephone callers to The Way will usually have their names cross checked with these status lists in the computer system.

This status checking will often determine if your call will b put through or not.
