## **Anti-Doping Policy**

• Sets out the rules relating to Anti-Doping for your Sport, as of November 1 2005 AFL adopted a WADA compliant Anti-doping policy

• ASDA assists sport by conducting a drug testing program in accordance with their Anti-Doping Policy

## Substances prohibited at all times: 2005 Prohibited List

- Anabolic agents
- Hormones and related substances (LH and hCG now prohibited for males and females)
- Beta-2 agonists (now prohibited at all times)
- Agents with anti-estrogenic activity (now prohibited for males and females)
- Diuretics and masking agents





### Additional substances prohibited (OOC)

- Stimulants
- Narcotics
- Cannabinoids
- These substances when detected OOC are handled under the AFL Illicit Drug Policy





## Substances prohibited in-competition (IC) 2006 Prohibited List

- Stimulants
- Narcotics
- Cannabinoids
- Glucocorticosteriods (skin creams now permitted)
- Note that the above substances when detected on match day are dealt with under the AFL ADC





## **Anti-Doping Rule Violations**

- The presence of a prohibited substance detected in a sample
- Use or attempted use of a prohibited substance or method
- Failure to Comply or Evasion
- Tampering or attempting to tamper
- Failure to provide location information or being unavailable for testing
- Administration, assisting, involvement, covering up or any other type of complicity.
- Possession
- Trafficking





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## Sanctions

#### Presence of a prohibited substance Two years first offence or life ban for a subsequent offence.

#### Exceptional circumstances

At a minimum a warning for a first offence or one year ineligibility, two years for a second offence and life ban for a third offence.

#### Possession

Two years first offence or life ban for a subsequent offence.

#### Trafficking Minimum four year ban, maximum life ban.





# What is a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)?

• Permission is granted to use, for therapeutic purposes and where no alternative is available, drugs which are otherwise prohibited in sporting competition

• Please speak with your club doctor for further information and whether you require a TUE or ATUE





## **Strict Liability**

• Each athlete is responsible for the substances detected in their sample (**strict liability**).

Ignorance is no excuse!





## **Athlete Whereabouts Requirements**

- Under the 2006 AFL ADC there is requirement to provide whereabouts information to your Club
- •This information will include: A contact phone number and address when you away from your club
- •This information will also be collected for the holiday period to allow testing under the AFL ADC
- Failure to provide this information or the provision of innaccurate information could result in an Anti-doping rule violation for the player





## **Selection procedures**

- On match day selection is based on a random card draw between ASDA and club liaison
- Out of competition selection is based
  - All newly drafted players
  - Rookies promoted to the senior list
  - Long term injuries
  - Players who have not been tested in last 2 years
  - Club best & fairest and All Australians not tested in the previous year
  - Other more specific
  - Random draw

## **Blood Testing Procedures**



- ASDA may also collect blood samples for the purpose of detecting the presence and/or use of prohibited substances and methods
- Any athlete may be subject to blood testing
- Blood testing may involve provision of a bloodonly sample or both a blood and urine sample





## **Athlete Rights**

- Representative at a test
- Post game commitments
- Medical attention
- Elect the analysis of a B sample
- Note any concerns on the drug testing paperwork.





## **Athlete Responsibilities**

- 1. Be familiar and comply with the anti-doping policy of your sport
- 2. Be familiar with drug testing procedures
- 3. Ensure you fulfill your obligations to provide accurate athlete location information
- 4. Comply with testing requests.





## **Supplements**

- Multi-ingredient nature means that supplement use presents more risk to athletes than use of registered pharmaceutical products.
- ASDA is unable to accurately determine the status of supplement products.
- Supplements may contain impurities, such as ingredients that are not listed on packaging.
- Take precautions to reduce risk of a positive test.
