




SERVICES FOR PLAYERS





The AFL Players' Association is the representative body of all AFL Footballers and seeks to protect and advance the collective interests of its members, AFL Players.



To act in a unified and professional manner, enhancing the security and personal development opportunities for past, present and future AFL Footballers.

WHAT SERVICES ARE THERE FOR PLAYERS?

In 1999, player feedback highlighted the need to promote and support the personal development of players off the field, both during their football careers and in the years immediately following their retirement.

To address this need, the AFLPA established a network of personal support and development services throughout Australia, for all AFL players. Past Players may access this service up to three years (Past Rookies up to one year) from their last playing year. All services offered to players fall under the umbrella of the AFLPA Player Development Program (PDP)

The program has been designed to focus on all aspects of a player's development, including education and training, career development, psychological and personal support, welfare, and the career transition process. As a result, all areas of the program are linked to ensure that each player maximises their involvement and has access to the full range of services available.

The AFLPA commits over \$1.8 million each year to the Personal Services, Career Transition, Indigenous Support, Career & Education and Grants & Scholarship programs under the AFLPA Player Development Program.

INDIGENOUS SUPPORT

Cross-Cultural Awareness

Education, awareness, and support for players and clubs in developing an Indigenous friendly environment

Indigenous Players Camp

Forum for Indigenous Players, held every 2 years

Mentor & Family Support

Support for players and their families

PERSONAL SUPPORT

Counselling

Strictly confidential service where players can get support for issues off field, this may include relationships, dealing with stress, transition, or injury management

Specialist Referral Network

Strictly confidential service where players can access specialist advice for support of the field, this may include gambling, depression, post-natal depression, alcohol or other drugs

Financial Education

Educational seminars and training on budgeting, tax, investing, superannuation and managing finances

Mens Health

Educational seminars and confidential advisory services for players and their nartners

Mental Health Education & Initiatives

Increase awareness and support of mental health and targeted initiatives

Support for Partners

Partners of players may access a range of services via the AFLPA; this may include counselling, specialist referral network, career counselling; educational guidance and indigenous support

GRANTS & SCHOLARSHIPS

Mike Fitzpatrick Scholarships

Annually \$50,000 is allocated to potential AFL footballers who require financial assistance in meeting their educational and financial commitments

Education & Training Grants

Grants to assist players in subsidising their education expenses

Computer Grants

Grants to assist players in subsidising a purchase of a computer

Past Player Hardship Fund

A fund to assist past players suffering from financial injury or health related hardship

Research Endorsement & Grants

Support for researchers undertaking relevant research within the AFL Industry
