## Oracle Real Application Clusters Special Interest Group

The Oracle Real Application Cluster (RAC) SIG is a forum to advance RAC awareness and adoption while enhancing the experience of current RAC users by providing a forum for technical interchange.

The RAC-SIG was officially launched at Oracle World 2003 in San Francisco and was attended by members of the user community, members of the RAC development team, and executive board members of the IOUG. The SIG took an international focus with its kick off meeting at the Oracle World in Paris in October of 2003. The meeting held in Paris France was attended by the user community, members of the RAC development team, executive board members of the EOUG and board members of the RAC-SIG.

Oracle9i Real Application Clusters (RAC) provides a highly available, scalable and manageable solution by sharing complete access to a single database among nodes in a cluster. This shared access removes any single point of failure from the database solution. Even during a system fault in one of the nodes, data can continue to be accessed from any of the remaining nodes. Committed work on the failed node is recovered automatically without administrator intervention and without data loss. RAC is an Oracle Corporation exclusive technology that enables building large systems from commodity components and is the foundation for Enterprise GRID computing.

Oracle9i RAC has been licensed by thousands of Oracle customers worldwide. To date, there are over 560 documented production installations in 47 countries.

The primary function of the RAC-SIG is to provide a forum and networking opportunity for users to exchange and share information pertaining to the RAC technology. The RAC SIG will:
