3. CITY COUNCIL CONSENT CALENDAR

a. Accepting - improvements for RFB #2020 (Project #1095), Removal of Three Underground Storage Tanks in the Corporation Yard, by Controlled Environmental Services, of Oakley, and directing the filing of the Notice of Completion. Recommended by the Director of Public Works.

ACTION: Improvements accepted; Notice of Completion to be filed.

b. **Authorizing** - the acceptance and appropriation of a Federal Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) in the amount of \$29,226 to partially fund the Police Department's Family Violence-Victim Advocate position and authorizing the City Manager to execute the agreement. Recommended by the Chief of Police.

ACTION: Authorization approved; City Manager authorized to execute agreement.

Award - of contract for the 2006 Slurry Seal Program, RFB #2038, to Bond Blacktop of Union City, as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$778,937.22 and approve a related budget transfer in the amount of \$120,000. Bids were opened on February 22, 2006 at 2:00 p.m. Recommended by the Director of Public Works.

ACTION: Award of contract and related budget transfer approved.

d. **Approving** - the designation of the City Engineer as the appropriate person and authorizing the City Engineer to execute right-of-way certifications for public projects. Resolution 06-15 for adoption. Recommended by Director of Building, Engineering and Neighborhood Services.

ACTION: Resolution 06-15 adopted.

 e. Authorizing - the application to the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection for an allocation of Proposition 12 California Urban & Community Forestry Program funds in the amount of \$13,350 to be used to plant 133 trees in seven parks and other landscaped areas maintained by the City; committing the necessary match for the project in the amount of \$6,518; and stating the assurance of the City to complete the project. Resolution 06-14 for adoption. Recommended by the Director of Building, Engineering and Neighborhood Services.

ACTION: Resolution 06-14 adopted.

Resolution 06-6 for adoption. Recommended by the Director of Public Works.

4. CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING

a. **Proposed Amendment to the Concord Municipal Code** - to repeal Article VI, Condominiums, Section 94-171, et seq., and enacting new Article VI, Condominium Conversions, Section 94-171, et seq., to incorporate new open space standards, inclusionary housing requirements, annual conversion and percent leasing caps, and other changes to make consistent with Concord's multi-family development and building standards. This project is categorically exempt pursuant to Section 15301, Existing Facilities, of the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended. Recommended by the Planning Commission (4-1; Brumley - No)

ACTION: Public Hearing opened; continued to April 25, 2006.

There is a 90-day limit for the filing of a challenge in the Superior Court to certain City administrative decisions and orders which require a hearing by law, the receipt of evidence, and the exercise of discretion. The 90-day limit begins on the date the decision is final (Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6). Further, if you challenge an action taken by the City Council in court, you may be limited, by California law, including but not limited to Government Code Section 65009, to raising only those issues you or someone else raised in the public hearing, or in written correspondence delivered to the City Council prior to or at the public hearing. The City Council may be requested to reconsider a decision if the request is made prior to the next City Council meeting, regardless of whether it is a regular or special meeting (Policy and Procedure No. 2, Section 4.24).
