4. CITY COUNCIL CONSENT CALENDAR

a. **Authorizing** – rejection of sole bid by Northern American Fence and Supply, Inc., of Oakland, for RFB #2029, Supply and Install Fencing as Needed. Bids were opened at 1:00 p.m. on February 6, 2006. Recommended by Director of Public Works.

5. CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING

a. **Esplanade General Plan Amendment and Municipal Code Amendment** – consideration of an application by DeNova Homes to amend the General Plan land use designation from Community Office to High Density Residential and to amend the Zoning Ordinance, Map A "Land Use in the Downtown Business District" from Office overlay to Residential overlay to allow up to 332 condominium units on property located at 1765 Galindo Street, APN's 126-062-011; 126-143-001 through 003,-008 through -001; and 126-153-006,-007. This application proposes the demolition of the Masonic Temple Building. A Mitigated Negative Declaration was prepared and a Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration was posted and circulated for comments from December 2, 2005 to January 3, 2006. Further, if you challenge an action taken by the City Council in court, you may be limited, by California law, including but not limited to Government Code Section 65009, to raising only those issues you or someone else raised in the public hearing, or in written correspondence delivered to the City Council prior to or at the public hearing. The City Council may be requested to reconsider a decision if the request is made prior to the next City Council meeting, regardless of whether it is a regular or special meeting (Policy and Procedure No. 2, Section 4.24).
