The title "Premier" is recognized by custom and popular usage but not by statute. Normally, the Premier, or leader of the governing party in the Legislative Assembly, takes office as President of the Executive Council. The only exception to this practice in Saskatchewan occurred in the brief period October 20, 1916 to October 20, 1917 when the Honourable W.M. Martin, Minister of Education, was Premier and the Honourable J.A. Calder held the office of President of the Executive Council.
