UNIFIL Maritime Task Force is operational

On 15 October 2006, the UNIFIL Maritime Task Force led by Germany took over from the Interim Maritime Task Force. The official handover took place in Beirut Port. Italian Rear Admiral Giuseppe De Giorgi, who commanded the Interim Maritime Task Force, transferred command to German Rear Admiral Andreas Krause.

"The Maritime Task Force has an important job to do in line with UN Security Council Resolution 1701, ensuring, through supporting the Lebanese Navy, that this country's territorial waters are not utilized for any illegal or hostile activities," said UNIFIL Force Commander Maj.-General Alain Pellegrini.

The UNIFIL Maritime Task Force will support the Lebanese Navy in monitoring its territorial waters, securing the Lebanese coastline and preventing arms smuggling.

The UNIFIL Maritime Task Force, which will patrol its area of operations along the Lebanese coastline, will include assets from Bulgaria, Denmark, Germany, Greece, Norway, Sweden and Turkey.
