Because a lot of comments were received we have only included a limited number.

- When forms are simplified its easier for people to understand
- I hope that you don't pass on my details to other companies. We do not disclose any details regarding dates of birth or signatures to other companies
- No chasing around for a signature
- Brilliant idea, as long as no fraudulent dealings can come from this new way!
- Forward thinking
- Arranging for a witness to the signature was a serious inconvenience
- Not really!!
- As long as you cut out fraud the postal vote is easier for older people
- It leaves the system open to abuse from undesirables and fraudlulents.
 Every signature and date of birth on the security statement are checked against that on the original application form, if one or both do not match the vote is not accepted.
- No difference don't believe either method really protects against someone using your vote.
- Still feel that some kind of independent witness would keep down possible chicanery as reported in daily papers.
- This helped my elderly mother vote (by post) as she didn't need to find a witness. Im also confident it is sufficient as a security measure.
