### JOINT SUMMARY OF THE CHAIRS GEF COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 10-12, 2009

#### **OPENING OF THE MEETING**

1. The meeting was opened by Ms. Monique Barbut, Chief Executive Officer/Chairperson of the Facility.

#### **ELECTION OF A CHAIRPERSON**

2. The Council elected Ms. Asa Andrae, the Council Member representing the constituency of Estonia, Finland, and Sweden, as its elected Co-Chair.

#### **ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA**

3. The Council approved the provisional agenda set forth in document GEF/C.36/1.

### **REPORT BY THE CHAIR OF STAP**

4. Mr. Thomas Lovejoy, Chair of STAP, reported on the recent achievements of STAP and received comments from the Council on STAP's plans for advising on cross-focal integration and climate resilience of GEF investments and invited Mr. Paul Ferraro, a STAP panel member, to make a presentation on evidence-based learning to improve the effectiveness of GEF.

### STATEMENTS BY THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARIES OF THE CONVENTIONS

5. The Council heard statements from Mr. Luc Gnacadja, the Executive Secretary of the UN Convention to Combat Desertification, Mr. Yolando Velasco, on behalf of Yvo de Boer, Executive Secretary of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, and Ms. Marcia Levaggi, Manager of the Adaptation Fund Board Secretariat. A printed version of the statement of Mr. Ahmed Djoghlaf, the Executive Secretary of the Convention on Biological Diversity was made available at the Council meeting.

### **OPS4** AND UPDATE ON GEF-5 REPLENISHMENT DISCUSSIONS

6. Mr. Robert van den Berg, Director of the GEF Evaluation Office, delivered a presentation on the findings of OPS4, and Ms. Monique Barbut, Chief Executive Officer/Chairperson of the Facility, reported on the progress made during the first three meetings of the fifth replenishment of the GEF.

# DECISIONS

7. The Council approved the following decisions with respect to the items on its agenda.

Decision on Agenda Item 6 Relations with the Conventions

8. The Council considered document GEF/C.36/3, *Relations with the Conventions and Other International Institutions*, and welcomed the proposed activities to implement the guidance and decisions that have been approved by the Conferences of the Parties to the global environmental conventions. The Council requested the Secretariat and the GEF Agencies to continue to work with recipient countries to reflect the guidance and national priorities in their GEF programming and activities.

Decision on Agenda Item 7 Report of the Evaluation Office Director

9. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/ME/C.36/1 *GEF Evaluation Office: Progress Report from the Director*, took note of the on-going work of the Office, the extra efforts made for OPS4 and the expanding work needed in the coming months and approved an additional amount of \$400,000 for the work program of the Office in fiscal year 2010, which will be subtracted from the upcoming budget proposal for fiscal year 2011, so that the Office will remain within the overall budget cap of \$15.869 million as agreed. In this way the Office will be able to accommodate the "peak" in expenditure in the years in which an overall performance study is implemented. The Council requested the Office to prepare a revised four-year work plan and budget cycle for GEF-5 for presentation at the June 2010 Council meeting which will take the experiences of the current cycle into account.

Decision on Agenda Item 8 Annual Impact Report 2009

10. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/ME/C.36/2, "*GEF Annual Report on Impact* –2009," and document GEF/ME/C.36/3, "*Management Response to the GEF Annual Report on Impact*–2009," took note of the Annual Report's findings and decided that:

- (a) GEF-5 strategy proposals, prepared by the Secretariat, should include further investment and capacity development to assist countries with economies in transition to address the remaining threats to the ozone layer.
- (b) The Secretariat should incorporate lessons from the positive private sector engagement in the Ozone Layer Depletion focal area into its efforts to engage the private sector, where possible and as appropriate, in other focal areas.

# Decision on Agenda Item 9 Small Grants Programme

11. The Council considered document GEF/C.36/4, *Small Grants Programme: Execution Arrangements and Upgrading Policy for GEF-5*, and approved the proposed execution arrangements and upgrading policy for country programs of the Small Grants Program.

12. As a transitional arrangement, Council decided that category three countries could, during the first year of GEF-5, access country allocations under the conditions stated in paragraph 71.

13. Furthermore, an information document should be prepared by the Secretariat to update the Council at its June 2010 session on the progress made to implement the proposed execution arrangements by UNOPs, as well as on the status of the preparation of the full-size project documents for the category three countries, as described in paragraph 73.

Decision on Agenda Item 10 Adhering to the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness

14. The Council reviewed GEF/C.36/5, *Proposal for the GEF to Formally Adhere to the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness.* The Council welcomed the GEF's continued support for the principles outlined in the Paris Declaration and the Accra Agenda for Action and encouraged the GEF to participate in ongoing discussions.

Decision on Agenda Item 11 System for a Transparent Allocation of Resources

15. The Council, having reviewed document *GEF/G.36/6.Rev.1*, *System for a Transparent Allocation of Resources (STAR):* Options and Scenarios, decide that the GEF Secretariat shall proceed with the following design elements for the STAR:

a) The STAR for GEF-5 is to be applied to the focal areas of biodiversity, climate change, and land degradation – all other focal areas and programs to be outside the STAR.

b) Country allocations are to be based on the criteria for access, as stated in Paragraph 10 of the above document.

c) Full flexibility will be provided to allow countries with a total allocation under a certain threshold to program resources across focal areas included in the STAR. The threshold will be developed to ensure that at least 90% of total resources programmed under biodiversity and climate change is protected.

d) For all other countries, marginal adjustments between focal areas will be allowed to complement GEF funding for focal areas lacking resources.

e) If the expected resources for GEF-5 are not realized, the reallocation exercise that Council will undertake will allow for reallocations across focal areas for a country, to take into account a specific country's circumstances.

f) The level of focal area set-asides from the STAR allocations is to be set at up to 20 %. This set-aside will be used to finance regional and global projects, enabling activities, and sustainable forest management.

g) Other programs and activities excluded from the STAR allocation process will include:

i. Corporate budgets of the Secretariat, the Trustee, Evaluation Office, and STAP;

ii. Small Grants Program;

iii. Country Support Program, National Dialogue Initiative, and Sub-Regional Consultations;

iv. International Waters;

v. Ozone Layer Depletion;

- vi. Persistent Organic Pollutants;
- vii. Sound Chemicals Management, including mercury; and
- viii. GEF Earth Fund.

h) Floors are set at \$2 million for climate change, \$1.5 million for biodiversity, and \$0.5 million for land degradation.

i) Ceilings are set at 11% for climate change and 10% for the other two focal areas.

j) The methodology for the calculation of country allocations, including the revised Global Performance Index, the revised Global Benefits Indices for each focal area, and the new GDP Index is as per the above document.

16. The Council further agreed that work would continue with a view towards developing a GEF-wide STAR in the future, if feasible, based, among other things, on a review of the STAR design and implementation to be carried out by the Office of Evaluation towards the end of the 3rd year of GEF-5.

17. A subsequent Council meeting will provide further details regarding implementation procedures.

Decision on Agenda Item 12 Work Program

18. The Council reviewed the proposed work program submitted to Council in document GEF/C.36/7 and approved the work program<sup>1</sup> comprising 34 project concepts, subject to comments made during the Council meeting and additional comments that may be submitted, in writing, to the Secretariat by November 26, 2009.

19. Total resources requested in this work program amount to \$159.29 million, which include GEF project grants and Agency fees. The approved work program is comprised of the following 34 Project Identification Forms (PIFs), of which 5 are free-standing PIFs and 29 are submitted under 12 programmatic approaches previously endorsed by Council:
