Geriatric Subjects

In GL1, GL2, and GL3, there were 8 subjects aged 65 and older who were randomized to DYSPORTTM 50 Units in 5 equal aliquots of 10 Units (4) or placebo (4). None of the geriatric DYSPORTTM subjects were a treatment success at maximum frown at Day 30.

16 HOW SUPPLIED/STORAGE AND HANDLING

DYSPORTTM for Injection is supplied in a sterile, single-use, 3 mL glass vial. DYSPORTTM must be stored under refrigeration at 2–8°C (36–46°F). Protect from light.

Administer DYSPORTTM within 4 hours of reconstitution; during this period reconstituted DYSPORTTM should be stored under refrigeration at 2–8°C (36–46°F). Do not freeze after reconstitution.

Do not use after the expiration date on the vial. All vials, including expired vials, or equipment used with DYSPORTTM should be disposed of carefully as is done with all medical waste.

17 PATIENT COUNSELING INFORMATION

The physician should provide a copy of the FDA-Approved Patient Medication Guide and review the contents with the patient. Patients should be advised to inform their doctor or pharmacist if they develop any unusual symptoms (including difficulty with swallowing, speaking or breathing), or if any known symptom persists or worsens.

Patients should be counseled that if loss of strength, muscle weakness, blurred vision or drooping eyelids occur, they should avoid driving a car or engaging in other potentially hazardous activities.

MEDICATION GUIDE

DYSPORTTM (DIS-port)

(abobotulinum toxin A)

Injection

Read the Medication Guide that comes with DYSPORTTM before you start using it and each time DYSPORTTM is given to you. There may be new information. This information does not take the place of talking with your doctor about your medical condition or your treatment. You should share this information with your family members and caregivers.

What is the most important information I should know about DYSPORTTM?

DYSPORTTM may cause serious side effects that can be life threatening. Call your doctor or get medical help right away if you have any of these problems after treatment with DYSPORTTM:

• **Problems swallowing, speaking, or breathing.** These problems can happen hours to weeks after an injection of DYSPORTTM usually because the muscles that you use to breathe and swallow can become weak after the injection. Death can happen as a complication if you have severe problems with swallowing or breathing after treatment with DYSPORT.TM

- People with certain breathing problems may need to use muscles in their neck to help them breathe. These patients may be at greater risk for serious breathing problems with DYSPORT.TM
- Swallowing problems may last for several weeks. People who can not swallow well may need a feeding tube to receive food and water. If swallowing problems are severe, food or liquids may go into your lungs. People who already have swallowing or breathing problems before receiving DYSPORTTM have the highest risk of getting these problems.
- **Spread of toxin effects.** In some cases, the effect of botulinum toxin may affect areas of the body away from the injection site and cause symptoms of a serious condition called botulism. The symptoms of botulism include:
- loss of strength and muscle weakness all over the body
- · double vision
- blurred vision and drooping eyelids
- hoarseness or change or loss of voice (dysphonia)
- trouble saying words clearly (dysarthria)
- · loss of bladder control
- trouble breathing
- trouble swallowing

These symptoms can happen hours to weeks after you receive an injection of DYSPORT.TM These problems could make it unsafe for you to drive a car or do other dangerous activities. See "What should I avoid while receiving DYSPORTTM?".

What is DYSPORTTM?

DYSPORTTM is a prescription medicine that is injected into muscles and used:

- to treat the abnormal head position and neck pain that happens with cervical dystonia (CD) in adults
- to improve the look of moderate to severe frown lines between the eyebrows (glabellar lines) in adults younger than 65 years of age for a short period of time (temporary)

CD is caused by muscle spasms in the neck. These spasms cause abnormal position of the head and often neck pain. After DYSPORTTM is injected into muscles, those muscles are weakened for up to 12 to 16 weeks or longer. This may help lessen your symptoms.

Frown lines (wrinkles) happen because the muscles that control facial expression are used often (muscle tightening over and over). After DYSPORTTM is injected into the muscles that control facial expression, the medicine stops the tightening of these muscles for up to 4 months.

It is not known whether DYSPORTTM is safe or effective in children under 18 years of age.

It is not known whether DYSPORTTM is safe or effective for the treatment of other types of muscle spasms. It is not known whether DYSPORTTM is safe or effective for the treatment of other wrinkles.

Who should not take DYSPORTTM?

Do not take DYSPORTTM if you:

- are allergic to DYSPORTTM or any of the ingredients in DYSPORT.TM See the end of this Medication Guide for a list of ingredients in DYSPORTTM
- are allergic to cow's milk protein
- had an allergic reaction to any other botulinum toxin product such as Myobloc^{® 1} or Botox^{® 1}
- have a skin infection at the planned injection site

What should I tell my doctor before taking DYSPORTTM?

Tell your doctor about all your medical conditions, including if you have:

- a disease that affects your muscles and nerves (such as amyotrophic lateral sclerosis [ALS or Lou Gehrig's disease], myasthenia gravis or Lambert-Eaton syndrome). See "What is the most important information I should know about DYSPORTTM?"
- allergies to any botulinum toxin product
- had any side effect from any botulinum toxin product in the past
- a breathing problem, such as asthma or emphysema
- swallowing problems
- · bleeding problems

- · diabetes
- a slow heart beat or other problem with your heart rate or rhythm
- plans to have surgery
- · had surgery on your face
- weakness of your forehead muscles (such as trouble raising your eyebrows)
- drooping eyelids
- any other change in the way your face normally looks

Tell your doctor if you:

- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if DYSPORTTM can harm your unborn baby
- are breast-feeding or planning to breast-feed. It is not known if DYSPORTTM passes into breast milk

Tell your doctor about all the medicines you take, including prescription and nonprescription medicines, vitamins and herbal and other natural products. Using DYSPORTTM with certain other medicines may cause serious side effects. Do not start any new medicines while taking DYSPORTTM without talking to your doctor first.

Especially tell your doctor if you:

- have received any other botulinum toxin product in the last four months
- have received injections of botulinum toxin, such as Myobloc[®] (Botulinum Toxin Type B)¹ or Botox[®] (Botulinum Toxin Type A)¹ in the past; be sure your doctor knows exactly which product you received
- have recently received an antibiotic by injection
- · take muscle relaxants
- · take an allergy or cold medicine
- take a sleep medicine

Ask your doctor if you are not sure if your medicine is one that is listed above.

Know the medicines you take. Keep a list of your medicines with you to show your doctor and pharmacist each time you get a new medicine.

How should I take DYSPORTTM?

- DYSPORTTM is an injection that your doctor will give you
- DYSPORTTM is injected into the affected muscles
- Your doctor may give you another dose of DYSPORTTM after 12 weeks or longer, if it is needed
- If you are being treated for CD, your doctor may change your dose of DYSPORT,TM until you and your doctor find the best dose for you
- The dose of DYSPORTTM is not the same as the dose of any other botulinum toxin product

What should I avoid while taking DYSPORTTM?

DYSPORTTM may cause loss of strength or general muscle weakness, blurred vision, or drooping eyelids within hours to weeks of taking DYSPORT.TM If this happens, do not drive a car, operate machinery, or do other dangerous activities. See "What is the most important information I should know about DYSPORTTM?"

What are the possible side effects of DYSPORTTM?

DYSPORT TM can cause serious side effects. See "What is the most important information I should know about DYSPORT TM ?"

Other side effects of DYSPORTTM include:

- dry mouth
- injection site discomfort or pain

- tiredness
- · headache
- · neck pain
- muscle pain
- eye problems: double vision, blurred vision, decreased eyesight, problems with focusing the eyes (accommodation), drooping eyelids, swelling of the eyelids
- allergic reactions. Symptoms of an allergic reaction to DYSPORTTM may include: itching, rash, red itchy welts, wheezing, asthma symptoms, or dizziness or feeling faint. Tell your doctor or get medical help right away if you get wheezing or asthma symptoms, or if you get dizzy or faint

Tell your doctor if you have any side effect that bothers you or that does not go away. These are not all the possible side effects of DYSPORT.TM For more information, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. You may report side effects to FDA at 1-800-FDA-1088. General information about DYSPORTTM:
