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539	What is the most important information I should know about VOTRIENT?
540	• VOTRIENT can cause serious liver problems including death. Your healthcare provider
541	will do blood tests to check your liver before you start and while you take VOTRIENT.
542	Tell your healthcare provider right away if you have any of these signs of liver problems:
543	 yellowing of your skin or the whites of your eyes (jaundice)
544	dark urine
545	• tiredness
546	 nausea or vomiting
547	 loss of appetite
548	 pain on the right side of your stomach

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551	What is VOTRIENT?
552	VOTRIENT is a prescription medicine used to treat advanced renal cell cancer in adults.
553	It is not known if VOTRIENT is safe or effective in children under 18 years of age.
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555	What should I tell my healthcare provider before taking VOTRIENT?
556	Before you take VOTRIENT, tell your healthcare provider if you:
557	 have or had liver problems
558	 have high blood pressure
559	 have heart problems or an irregular heartbeat including QT prolongation
560	 have a history of a stroke
561	 have coughed up blood in the last 6 months
562	 had bleeding of your stomach or intestines in the last 6 months
563	• have a history of a tear (perforation) in your stomach or intestine, or an abnormal connection
564	between two parts of your gastrointestinal tract (fistula)
565	 have thyroid problems
566	 had recent surgery (within the last 7 days) or are going to have surgery
567	 have any other medical conditions
568	• are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. VOTRIENT can harm your unborn baby. You
569	should not become pregnant while you are taking VOTRIENT

• are breast-feeding or plan to breast-feed. It is not known if VOTRIENT passes into your breast milk. You and your healthcare provider should decide if you will take VOTRIENT or breast-feed. You should not do both.

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Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take including prescription and non-prescription medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. VOTRIENT may affect the way other medicines work and other medicines may affect how VOTRIENT works.

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Especially, tell your healthcare provider if you:

- take medicines that can affect enzyme metabolism such as:
 - some antibiotics (used to treat infections)
 - some drugs used to treat HIV
 - some drugs used to treat depression
- drugs used to treat irregular heart beats
- drink grapefruit juice

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Ask your healthcare provider if you are not sure if your medicine is one that is listed above.

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Know the medicines you take. Keep a list of them and show it to your healthcare provider and pharmacist when you get a new medicine.

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How should I take VOTRIENT?

- Take VOTRIENT exactly as your healthcare provider tells you. Your healthcare provider will tell you how much VOTRIENT to take.
- Your healthcare provider may change your dose.
- Take VOTRIENT on an empty stomach, at least 1 hour before or 2 hours after food.
- Do not crush tablets of VOTRIENT.
- Do not eat grapefruit or drink grapefruit juice at the same time as tablets of VOTRIENT.

 They may change the amount of VOTRIENT in your body.
- If you miss a dose, take it as soon as you remember. Do not take it if it is close (within 12 hours) to your next dose. Just take the next dose at your regular time. Do not take more than 1 dose of VOTRIENT at a time.
- Your healthcare provider will test your blood and heart before you start and while you take VOTRIENT.

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- What are the possible side effects of VOTRIENT?
- 606 **VOTRIENT** may cause serious side effects including:

- high blood pressure
 - irregular or fast heartbeat or fainting

- 610 heart attack or stroke: chest pain or pressure, pain in your arms, back, neck or jaw, shortness of breath, numbness or weakness on one side of your body, trouble talking, 611 612 headache, or dizziness. 613 **bleeding problems:** unusual bleeding, bruising, wounds that do not heal. 614 tear in your stomach or intestinal wall (perforation) or bleeding: pain, swelling in your 615 stomach-area, vomiting blood, and black sticky stools. 616 • thyroid problems 617 618 Call your healthcare provider right away, if you have any of the symptoms listed above. 619
- 620 The most common side effects of VOTRIENT include:
- 621 diarrhea
- 622 change in hair color
- nausea or vomiting
- loss of appetite
- feeling tired

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- Tell your healthcare provider if you have any side effect that bothers you or that does not go away. These are not all the possible side effects of VOTRIENT. For more information, ask your healthcare provider or pharmacist.

 - How should I store VOTRIENT tablets?
- Store VOTRIENT between 59°F to 86°F (15°C to 30°C).
- 637 Keep VOTRIENT and all medicines out of the reach of children.
- 639 General information about the safe and effective use of VOTRIENT:
- Medicines are sometimes prescribed for purposes other than those listed in a Medication Guide.
- Do not use VOTRIENT for a condition for which it was not prescribed. Do not give VOTRIENT
- to other people even if they have the same symptoms that you have. It may harm them.
