**LOW VISION REHABILITATION ASSISTANT PROFESSOR AND
CLINICAL LOW VISION STAFF POSITION**

Full-Time Tenure Track

Primary Functions: Teaches Low Vision Courses for the College of Education and Rehabilitation, Salus University and Provides Clinical Low Vision Services at William Feinbloom Low Vision Clinic.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Teaches LVR specific courses (on-line and face-to-face):
2. Recruits and advises LVR students
3. Teaches and assists with supervision in other certified areas (e.g., O&M, Low Vision, or TVI as appropriate)
4. Serves as a member of the College of Education and Rehabilitation management team
5. Assures that the LVR program meets State, Middle State and ACVREP Standards
6. Maintains records and prepares all reports for accreditation, grant, and program approval.
7. Coordinates curriculum development and design of LVR courses and assists in other program development.
8. Develops and manages LVR extramural grant efforts including collection of data and preparation of state, federal and other required reports for LVR and assists in other extramural grant efforts.
9. Arranges and supervises LVR internships and assists in other certification areas, including community and in-house student/client/patient assessment and instruction.
10. Provides clinical expertise in the William Feinbloom Low Vision Clinic, which also provide opportunities for research and scientific inquiry.
11. Conducts and reports on research and other program activities.

REQUIREMENTS: Master's Degree Required, doctorate preferred and current ACVREP certification in Low Vision Rehabilitation and minimum of 3 years of full-time direct low

vision rehabilitation services individuals who are visually impaired. One additional certification in another area of blindness/visual impairment such as Vision Rehabilitation Teaching, Orientation & Mobility or Teacher of Children who are Blind or Visually Impaired.

Skills and Other Requirements: Team collaboration and professional writing.

Other Desirable Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: Higher education teaching, knowledge and experience in human development, rehabilitation and multiple disabilities, Grantsmanship, curriculum development, program development, advocacy activities, and disability consumer groups.
