Gérard Borel became ACI EUROPE General Counsel in 2000 after a career of over 20 years in Air transport. He joined ACI EUROPE from the European Commission (1994-2000) where he was Senior Administrator responsible for economic regulation relating to airports, dealing especially with ground handling, airport charges, taxes, State aids, but also with hush kitted aircraft and open skies.

He has also worked for Aéroports de Paris (1990-94) in charge of the legal aspects of specific dossiers such as the creation of the Group, the Air France headquarters in CDG, the railway station in CDG or the Business Center Roissypole, and for the International Civil Aviation Organisation.

Gérard Borel has been a member of several groups of the European Civil Aviation Conference (ECAC) especially relating to capacity and security. He also worked as an expert in international agreements and as a solicitor in business law.

Dr Borel holds Doctorates in both International Public Law and in international Business Law, is postgraduate in Law of the Sea and in Law of Defence, graduate in Political Science, and a former of the Institute of Air and Space Law from Mc Gill University (Montreal).
