Notes:

1. Antarctica consists of the territory south of 60 degrees south latitude. This area includes claims by Argentina, Australia, Chile, France, New Zealand, Norway, and the United Kingdom, the legal status of which remains in suspense under the terms of the Antarctic Treaty of 1959. The United States recognizes no claims to Antarctica.
2. Bassas da India, Europa Island, Glorioso Islands, Juan de Nova Island, and Tromelin Island together make up the Îles Éparses and are part of the French Southern and Antarctic Lands. However, these islands are still physically administered from Reunion (These islands are claimed by Madagascar; Tromelin Island is also claimed by Mauritius and Seychelles).
3. Chagos Archipelago (including Diego Garcia).
4. Netherlands Antilles was dissolved on 10 October 2010. Curaçao and Sint Maarten (the Dutch two-fifths of the island of Saint Martin) (also see Note 14) gained greater autonomy (and their own digraphs), while Bonaire, Sint Eustatius, and Saba have become special municipalities within Netherlands.
5. Etorofu-tō, Kunashiri-tō, Shikoktan-tō and Habomai-shotō, the four southernmost islands and related drying features and adjacent waters in the Kuril Islands east of the Japanese island prefecture of Hokkaido are disputed by Japan and Russia. Japan calls them their

"Northern Territories"(Hoppō Ryōdo) while Russia refers to them as the "Southern Kuril Islands"(Yuzhnyye Kuril'skiye Ostrova). The islands were occupied by the Soviet Union in 1945, are administered by Russia, and are claimed by Japan.

6. Overseas territory of the United Kingdom (also claimed by Argentina).
7. French Southern and Antarctic Lands includes Île Amsterdam, Île Saint-Paul, Îles Crozet, and Îles Kerguelen in the southern Indian Ocean (also see note 2), along with the French-claimed sector of Antarctica, "Terre Adelie" (see note 1).
8. Israeli-occupied with current status subject to the Israeli-Palestinian Interim Agreement; permanent status to be determined through further negotiation.
9. The Department of Guadeloupe includes the nearby islands of Marie-Galante, La Desirade, and Les Saintes.
10. The Bailiwick of Guernsey includes the islands of Alderney, Guernsey, Herm, Sark, and nearby smaller islands.
11. The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region is a semi-autonomous entity that exists pursuant to international agreement and that maintains its own government apart from the People's Republic of China.
12. Under the Sino-Portuguese Joint Declaration on the Question of Macau signed in 1987, Macau reverted to Chinese control on December 20, 1999. It is now a semi-autonomous entity that exists pursuant to international agreement and maintains its own government apart from the People's Republic of China.
13. South China Sea islands occupied by China, but claimed by Vietnam.
14. Saint Martin is the northern three fifths of the island of Saint Martin (also see Note 4).
15. South China Sea islands claimed in entirety by China and Vietnam and in part by the Philippines and Malaysia; each of these states occupies some part of the islands.
