

## NDCC UPDATE

### Sitrep 6: Re Effects of Typhoon "Karen"

#### 1. Situation Overview

- Typhoon "Karen" entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility on August 17, 2008 as a Tropical Depression with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph; gained strength and intensified into a storm as it moved closer to Northern Luzon; gained more strength and further intensified into a typhoon with maximum sustained winds ranging from 120-140 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150 kph. It made landfall over the northern tip of Cagayan in the evening of 20 August 2008 and exited out of the country towards South China sea on 21 August 2008
- Typhoon Karen enhanced the southwest monsoon and brought rains over Central and Northern Luzon which triggered sea mishaps, flooding and landslides in some areas of Regions I, II and CAR. The provinces affected were Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur and La Union (Region I), Cagayan (Region II) and Benguet and Mt. Province (CAR). The most devastated provinces in terms of effects on population and damages to infrastructure and agriculture are Ilocos Norte and Cagayan
- A Motor Banca named "St Joseph" was reported missing while anchored at the vicinity of Naguilian, Calayan, Cagayan since 20 August 2008 at the height of Typhoon "Karen" with five (5) persons on board namely Ernie Payas, Dennis Galalde, Teofilo Cadiz, Christopher Irece and Dexter Calapini all crew members
- Another Motor Banca named "Perpetual" reportedly sunk while anchored at the vicinity of Sitio Mangarubat, Camiguin, Calayan Island with three (3) persons missing namely Nelson and Alfredo Bumagat and Gilbert Manalo, all of Naguilian, Calayan, Cagayan

## 2. Effects

### 2.1 Areas and Population Affected (Tab A)

- There is an increase in the number of affected population from **48,639 families / 215,106 persons to 63,846 families / 274,285 persons in 876 barangays** of **71 municipalities and 4 cities** in 8 provinces of Regions I, II and CAR
- **86%** of evacuees have returned to their homes with **36 families / 177 persons** presently being served in **3 evacuation centers** (Ilocos Norte-2, Ilocos Sur-1) while **7,485 families / 27,359 persons** are being served outside evacuation centers thus, a total of **7,521 families / 27,536 persons** being served inside and outside evacuation centers as of latest report

### 2.2 Casualties (Tab B)

- There were **41 casualties: 12 dead, 12 injured and 17 missing**

### 2.3 Houses Damaged (Tab C)

- A total of 2,629 houses were damaged : **213 totally and 2,416 partially**

### 2.4 Damage to Properties (Tab D)

- The initial report on the cost of damage to infrastructure and agriculture in Regions 1, 2 and CAR is **Php461,263,790.00** broken down as follows: infrastructure (roads, bridges and school buildings) – **Php133,529,400.00** and agriculture – **Php327,734,390.00**
- DepEd reported that there were **248** school buildings damaged in Regions I, II, and CAR amounting to **Php64,294,400.00** : **Region I - Php 16,324,400.00** (100 schools); **Region II- Php25,570,000.00** (87 schools); and **CAR -Php22,400,000.00**

### 2.5 Damaged Roads and Bridges as a result of various landslides in Regions I and CAR

- **Ilocos Sur** - Manila North Road in Bantay is one lane passable to all types of vehicles due to collapsed box culvert (spanish arc type);
- **Ilocos Norte** - Batac-Banna Road is one lane passable to all types of vehicles due to scoured slope protection and shoulder in various sections;
- **Nueva Ecija** - Udiao Bridge along Pangasinan-Nueva Ecija Road is one lane passable to all types of vehicles due to damaged protection and hanging approach slabs;
- **Mt Province** – Mt. Province-Cagayan Road via Kalinga-Gawa section km. 402+650 is closed to traffic due to 80 meters length slide (expected to be opened by 25 Aug); and Mt-Province-Ilocos Sur Road via Tue Cabunagan Section km. 401+500 is closed to traffic due to slide;
- **Apayao** - Claveria–Calanasan Road is closed to traffic due to soil collapse; and
- **Abra** – Abra-Kalinga Road km436+000 is closed to traffic due to soil collapse in 2 sections; Abra-Cervantes Road is closed to traffic at Baay Bridge due to one meter span sinking

### 3. Humanitarian Assistance

- The estimated cost of assistance provided by the NDCC, DSWD, LGUs and NGOs amounted to **Php2,048,278.80** broken down as follows: NDCC (Php 1,323,125.00, DSWD (Php 302,192.80), LGUs (Php 390,461.00) and NGOs (Php 32,500.00). (Details on Tab E)

#### 3.1 National /Regional Response

- The NDCC-EOC is on full activation or red alert since 18 August 2008 to continuously provide and disseminate disaster preparedness guidelines and coordinate response in view of Typhoon "Karen"
- **DSWD CO** activated the Quick Response Teams (QRTs) at the regional and provincial levels to provide technical assistance in the disaster operations facilitated
- **DSWD RO1** alerted Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) teams to closely monitor the effects of Typhoon "Karen"
- **DOH-HEMS** activated all CHD Operations Centers in Regions I, II and III to closely monitor the effects of Typhoon "Karen" and to coordinate with DOH Regional Offices for validation of the reported casualties
- **RDCC II** Composite Team led by Chairman RDCC 2 conducted a rapid damage assessment and needs analysis (DANA) on August 20, 2008 in the coastal municipalities of Cagayan. The team reported that the farmlands in 6 coastal municipalities of Cagayan namely Camalaniugan, Buguey, Sta. Teresita, Gonzaga, Sta. Ana and Aparri were severely affected /inundated
- **DA RO I** Regional Command Center Roving teams were fielded to conduct assessment

#### 3.2 Response by Cluster

##### Food and NFIs

- **NDCC**, through the OCD, facilitated the release of 600 sacks of rice to Region I: PDCC Ilocos Norte (200 sacks); 2<sup>nd</sup> District Ilocos Norte (200 sacks); MDCC Dingras, Ilocos Norte (100 sacks); and 2<sup>nd</sup> District La Union (100 sacks).
- Also provided 600 sacks of rice to the six (6) affected coastal municipalities of Cagayan Province at 100 each municipality; and 250 sacks of rice to other affected municipalities of Cagayan, as initial support to the relief efforts of the RDCC and the concerned Local Government Units
- **DSWD CO** prepositioned sufficient standby funds and stockpile of relief commodities in all concerned DSWD FOs I, II, and CAR: Stand-by Funds (Php997,306.53 and stockpile of relief commodities (Php2,832,648.82;
- Released additional standby funds amounting to P1 Million at P500.00 each for DSWD-FOs I and II for ongoing disaster operations
- Transported /released 2,000 family packs to DSWD –FO I from the National Rescue Operations Center (NROC) on August 22, 2008 as

additional augmentation assistance to the affected families amounting to P577,540.00 at P288.77 pack

- **DSWD RO I** prepositioned 1,000 family food packs in case relief augmentation is needed
- **PDCC Benguet** provided coffins for the dead victims and 2 sacks of rice for the bereaved families in Brgy Ucab
- **CDCC Baguio** provided tarpaulin/plastic sheet to cover the slide area at Brgy Pinsao to prevent further soil erosion
- **DSWD F2** has provided relief assistance to the municipalities of Cagayan thru PDCC amounting to Php 135,000.00 for rehabilitation efforts

#### **Health**

- **DOH I and CAR** provided medical assistance to the 212 families in four (4) evacuation centers
- Two (2) injured persons were admitted in Baguio General Hospital and one (1) admitted in Amajadsak District Hospital
- **DOH CAR Provincial Health Teams** were activated and prepositioned medicines and supplies for possible distribution
- **DOH-CHD Regional Office II** is continuously conducting field assessment in Cagayan coastal municipalities for possible medical assistance

#### **Electrification/Power Supply**

- Electric cooperatives in Regions I and II have restored normal operations as of 21 August except for Naguillian, Burgos, Bagolin, San Fernando and Bauang in La Union being served by 5MVA substation which was damaged by Typhoon Karen
- Bauang, Naguillian 69KV line was restored 100 % as of 1900H 22 August 2008 after replacement of damaged 5MVA transformer at La Union Electric Coop (LUELCO)- Naguillian Substation (customer –side).
- Tuguegarao-Magapit 69kV line, Magapit-Camalnuigan, Magapit-Sta Ana and Magapit-Lucban 69 kV line segments is 39% restored. Areas without power are towns of Sta Ana, Sta Teresita and Gonzaga, Cagayn Economic zone authority (CEZA)
- CAGELCO I and II Distribution Utilities have partially restored its power supply except in Aparri, Cagayan

#### **Telecommunications**

- Smart and Globe communication lines in Batanes were restored as of 23 August 2008, 9:00 AM

#### **SAR Operations**

- PNP San Nicolas, Ilocos Norte conducted search and rescue operations for the recovery of the missing person at Padsan River, San Nicolas, Ilocos Norte

- Local DCC Sta Cruz, Ilocos Sur initially provided improvised raft used in evacuating 30 isolated families in Barangay Villa Hermosa
- Philippine Coast Guard Station Currimaoy deployed SOG Team to assist in the evacuation of families in Ilocos Sur and in La Union and successfully rescued 7 persons who were trapped in Amborayan River.
- **PCG Northern Luzon** in San Fernando, La Union conducted SAR operations for the recovery of 8 persons aboard 2 missing vessels

#### **Clearing Operations**

- DPWH-CAR conducted clearing operations on road network affected by landslides and its engineering crew with equipment are still on alert for immediate mobilization/deployment
- The Regional Mobile Group contingents of Police Regional Office II conducted road clearing operations and traffic management along major highways and other road networks in Cagayan Province on August 20, 2008
- DPWH Districts 1 and 2 in Ilocos Sur conducted clearing operations in the affected areas

#### **4. Areas Declared Under State of Calamity**

- The Provinces of Ilocos Norte and Benguet were declared under a State of Calamity
