PETER M. HOLT

Chairman and CEO, Spurs Sports & Entertainment



Now in his 15th season as Chairman and CEO ... he and his wife, Julianna Hawn Holt, bought into the Spurs ownership group in 1996 ... since that time the organization has enjoyed unprecedented growth and success ... four NBA championships, a successful campaign for a new arena and two new San Antonio-based sports franchises are among the accomplishments achieved during Holt's tenure ... thanks in part to the AT&T Center - which opened in November of 2002 - the organization is now known as Spurs Sports & Entertainment ... with over 200 fulltime employees, Spurs Sports & Entertainment runs four professional sports franchises – the Spurs, the Silver Stars, the Rampage and the Austin Toros – while also managing the day-to-day operations of the AT&T Center ... over the last 12 seasons (since Tim Duncan joined the team in 1997–98) the Spurs have posted a regular season record of 669-283 ... the team's winning percentage of .703 during that span is the best of any team in the four major sports (MLB, NBA, NFL and NHL) ... during the Duncan era the Spurs have captured four NBA championships (1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007) ... the Spurs organization has twice been named the best franchise in professional sports (2003 and 2005) in the annual ESPN The Magazine Ultimate Standings survey (each year the Ultimate Standings ranks every professional team in a formula using analysis of team financial data combined with fan feedback in which over 30,000 fans judge teams by eight factors including players, bang for the buck, ownership, and stadium experience ... in June of 2007 SS&E purchased the Austin Toros of the NBA Development League (the Spurs are one of three NBA teams – along with the Lakers and the Thunder – to own and operate their own D-League team) ... the great-grandson of Benjamin Holt, inventor of the first track-type tractor which became the basis for Caterpillar Inc. ... serves as the CEO of San Antonio-based HOLT CAT (the firm still displays several of Ben Holt's early tractors outside its headquarters) which is the largest Caterpillar dealership in the United States ... born in Peoria, Illinois ... lived in San Antonio as a child before moving to Corpus Christi, where he graduated from high school ... served two years in the U.S. Army during which time he earned a Silver Star,

three Bronze Stars and a Purple Heart from his one-year tour of duty in Vietnam ... ended his military service as a Sergeant E5 ... in 2009 named Fundraising Chairman for an Education Center to be built at the Wall of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial ... a staunch believer in community service ... is proud of the Spurs commitment to South Texas and its residents (in 2000 the Spurs earned the Pro Team Community Award presented by the World Sports Humanitarian Hall of Fame, an award presented annually to the professional sports franchise that best illustrates exceptional community involvement and fosters community pride and spirit) ... among the Spurs community efforts are the Spurs Youth Basketball League, the annual countywide United Way campaign and a variety of educational outreach programs which service over 85 percent of the elementary schools in Bexar County (during the 2007–08 season over 200,000 area students were touched by the various SS&E education programs) ... Holt's own efforts include a lengthy list of community service positions ... in July of 2007 was appointed chairman of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission by Governor Rick Perry ... a member of the World Presidents' Organization ... is the corporate chair of the Consortium of Partners OwnUp SA No Kill initiative ... 2009 recipient of Woodrow Wilson Award for Public Service ... serves as a board member for Free Trade Alliance San Antonio, the San Antonio Economic Development Foundation, the Trust Company and the Texas State Aguarium ... serves as board member of the Bexar County Performing Arts Center Foundation ... is a trustee of Trinity University and serves on the advisory board of the McCombs School of Business at the University of Texas ... past chairman of the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County ... named to the Texas Business Hall of Fame in 2004 ... he and Julianna have been Spurs season ticket holders since 1988.

In his 18th season with the Spurs ... leads the business operations for all four sports franchises owned and operated by Spurs Sports & Entertainment which includes the Spurs (NBA), the Rampage (AHL Hockey), the Silver Stars (WNBA), and the Austin Toros (NBA Development League) as well as the operations of the AT&T Center ... includes marketing, corporate partnerships and ticket sales, finance and administration, communications, corporate development, community relations, and facilities management as well as all corporate business and player planning and new initiatives on behalf of the organization and ownership ... over 34 years of financial and business management experience in public accounting, banking, real estate, and sports and entertainment ... named the Spurs chief financial officer in 1993 ... promoted to executive vice president in 2000 and president of business operations in 2008 ... in 1995 started a development, financial and operating study for a new multipurpose arena that would eventually be the new home to the Spurs ... was named in 1999 as the chief development officer for the AT&T Center ... managed the successful county referendum in 1999 that provided public funding to build the AT&T Center and again in 2008 a second referendum that will provide funds for additional improvements starting in 2012 ... directed all aspects of the AT&T Center development project ... led negotiations with Bexar County in finalizing the arena's development and operating agreements ... negotiated and arranged adequate credit capacity to provide SS&E's contribution to the construction project as well as ongoing franchise funding ... oversaw a team of architects, contractors, and project managers in the design and construction of the AT&T Center which opened on time and on budget in October 2002 ... led the organization's efforts to bring hockey to the AT&T Center ... in 2002 negotiated the purchase of an American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate and then entered into a joint venture and affiliation with the Florida Panthers to play in San Antonio ... in the summer of 2005 led SS&E's effort to become the sole owner of the San Antonio Rampage and negotiated a new affiliation agreement with the Phoenix Coyotes that was renewed in 2008 ... past chairman of the AHL

Executive Committee and is the current Board of Governors representative ... in the summer of 2007 led the negotiations to purchase the NBA Development League team in Austin, Texas, the Austin Toros ... a member of the Board of Directors of the San Antonio Sports Foundation dating back to 1989 ... was part of the organization's efforts to bring major sporting events to San Antonio, including the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1993, the 1995 National Senior Olympics, the 2002 NCAA Women's Final Four and the 1998, 2004, and 2008 NCAA Men's Final Four, and the bid for the 2007 Pan Am Games ... serves on the Executive Committee and Board of Trustees of Via Metropolitan Transit, Executive Committee and Board of the San Antonio Economic Development Foundation and the Board of the San Antonio Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone ... holds a degree in accounting from Fairfield University and is a CPA ... has a 23-year-old son, Zack who played two seasons of junior hockey in the AJHL and is now attending Hamilton College in Clinton, NY.

Named president of sports franchises for Spurs Sports & Entertainment in July of 2008 ... in his current position continues to serve as the general manager of the Spurs while overseeing the sports administration for the other three teams in the SS&E family (the Austin Toros, the San Antonio Silver Stars and the San Antonio Rampage) ... in his 20th season with the Spurs ... started his coaching career at the University of Kansas in 1983 ... during each of his five seasons at Kansas, the Jayhawks participated in the NCAA Tournament ... was an assistant coach for the team that won the 1988 NCAA Championship as well as the 1985–86 squad that advanced to the Final Four ... made the move to the NBA in the summer of 1988 joining the Spurs as an assistant coach on Larry Brown's staff (other assistants on that staff included Gregg Popovich, Alvin Gentry and Ed Manning) ... spent four seasons as an assistant with the Spurs ... during that time San Antonio won back-to-back Midwest Division titles (1990 and 1991) ... joined the Los Angeles Clippers in the summer of 1992 as the first assistant for Coach Brown ... the Clippers posted a 41-41 record during the 1992–93 season and earned a spot in the 1993 Playoffs ... served as an assistant coach at the University of Florida during the 1993–94 season (as the team advanced to the Final Four for the first time in school history) ... returned to San Antonio in the summer of 1994 when Gregg Popovich hired him as the team's head scout ... in the summer of 1997 he became the Spurs director of scouting ... promoted to vice president/assistant general manager in the summer of 1999 ... was named the Spurs general manager in July of 2002 ... there are four NBA general mangers who either worked or played for the Spurs during his tenure in San Antonio: Danny Ferry (Cleveland), Steve Kerr (Phoenix), Sam Presti (Oklahoma City) and Kevin Pritchard (Portland) ... played collegiate basketball at Texas A&M University and Oklahoma State before receiving his degree from Friends University ... involved in the NBA Basketball Without Borders Africa camp ... served as a Board Member for Roy Maas' Youth Alternatives ... serves on the Board of Directors of PeacePlayers International ... his wife, Beth, is a former player on the LPGA Tour ... they are both active with the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation ...

they have three children: a son, Chase, a daughter, C.C. and in 2004 they welcomed Alexis Wangmene to their family ... Wangmene is from Cameroon and met the Bufords in September of 2004 during the Basketball Without Borders program in Johannesburg ... Chase is a junior basketball player at Kansas and Alexis is a junior basketball player at Texas.

Lawrence Payne joined Spurs Sports & Entertainment in 1976 after graduating from the University of Texas School of Law. Under his direction, SS&E has built one of the most extensive broadcast lineups in professional sports. Between Spurs, Rampage and Silver Stars, Payne's department is responsible for more than 600 productions each year. Under Payne's direction, the Spurs were among the first in the NBA to bring inventory and sales completely in-house. An executive producer for each and every project, Payne is involved in all aspects from

contract rights negotiations to the look of the broadcasts. He also manages the organization's sponsorship sales efforts and inventory, including radio and TV inventory, print, Internet, signage, corporate suites and in-arena and out-of-arena promotions/licensing. Payne also oversees all aspects of Spurs Sports & Entertainment's Game Operations and Community Relation efforts. He has won two national ACE Awards, the Silver Medal at the International Film and Television Festival of New York and several local Addy awards. Payne was selected as a charter member of the NBA Broadcast Advisory Board and is a member of the University of Texas Law School Non-Practicing Advisory Council. DAN HUGHES

Head Coach and General Manager



Antonio Silver Stars history, Dan Hughes resumes his dual roles as head coach and general manager in 2011. In his dual appointment, Hughes oversees the Silver Stars' basketball staff, the team's roster development and all player acquisitions, while also coaching the team. Hughes stepped aside as head coach to assume a full-time general manager role for the 2010 season.

In 10 years as Head Coach – of the Charlotte Sting, the Cleveland Rockers and San Antonio -Hughes has led his teams to seven

playoff appearances, four Western Conference Finals and one WNBA Final. He has collected the third most wins in WNBA history and also is the winningest coach in the history of both the San Antonio and the Cleveland Rockers franchises.

Hughes is the only coach in WNBA history to take three different franchises to the playoffs. He guided the 2008 Silver Stars to a 24-10 mark, earning the best record in the league and the franchise's first Western Conference Championship and its first trip to the WNBA Finals. Additionally, Hughes has been named WNBA Coach of the Year - most recently in 2007 - or finished as runner-up four times.

The winningest coach in San Hughes is a member of the five-person USA Basketball Selection Committee for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympics while also serving as a member of the selection committee for the Kay Yow Award. Also, during previous offseasons, Hughes spent time working part-time as a broadcaster on San Antonio Spurs telecasts, as well as on men's and women's college games. Prior to joining the Silver Stars, Hughes spent a year as the Mid-American Conference (MAC) Assistant Commissioner for Men's Basketball Operations. Before joining the MAC's athletic office, he served as the head coach of the now-defunct Cleveland Rockers from 2000-03.

> During his four-year stint with the Rockers, Hughes posted a 66-64 record with three trips to the playoffs. His overall record with the Rockers made him the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season in Cleveland, Hughes directed the team's resurgence from a 7-25 season in 1999 to a 17-15 finish in 2000 and was voted WNBA Coach of the Year runner-up. The following year, Hughes was named 2001 WNBA Coach of the Year after leading the Rockers to a 22-10 record and to their second straight playoff appearance. The 2001 Rockers were one of the best defensive teams ever, posting defensive statistics that still rank amongst the best in the WNBA record books. Cleveland led the league in three defensive categories during the 2001 season, including opponents' points per game (55.9 ppg, first in league history), opponents' field goal percentage (.381, second in league history) and opponents' total rebounds (27.84 rpg). The Rockers finished second in point differential (+6.8 ppg) and opponents' defensive rebounds (18.56 drpg). Hughes' Rockers kept 11 teams to 50 points or less, three teams to fewer than 40 points and five teams to their franchise low, including a WNBA record 34 points vs. Washington on May 31, 2001.

Hughes earned his first shot at coaching in the WNBA with the Charlotte Sting. While serving as an assistant coach during the 1999 season, Hughes took over



as head coach midway through the season; he helped the Sting improve their standing in the Eastern Conference from fourth to second place, posting a 10-10 record. He led the team to its third consecutive playoff appearance and its first ever playoff series victory. In addition to his coaching responsibilities in Charlotte, Hughes was a scout for the Charlotte Hornets during the offseason.

During the 1977-78 season, Hughes served as a graduate assistant at Miami of Ohio, helping the team to a MAC Championship and an appearance in the NCAA Regionals. Hughes graduated with a degree in physical education and history from Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio, in 1977. He earned a Master's Degree in education from Miami University of Ohio in 1978.

Many of Hughes' former players and assistant coaches have gone on to become coaches both at the college level and within the WNBA. Hughes' former athletes who went on to become Division I coaches are: Suzie McConnell-Serio (Duquesne); Dawn Staley (South Carolina); Jennifer Rizzotti Sullivan (Hartford); and Tricia Bader Binford (Montana State). Four of Hughes' former assistants have become WNBA Head Coaches: T.R. Dunn (Charlotte); Brian Agler (Seattle); Cheryl Reeve (Minnesota); and Suzie McConnell-Serio (formerly Minnesota).

Hughes and his wife, Mary, have two children, Bryce and Sara, who coaches high school volleyball and basketball.

Shuman previously served as assistant coach and video coordinator for the Sacramento Monarchs from 1999-2008, helping guide the team to the 2005 WNBA Championship and back-to-back Western Conference titles in 2005 and 2006. He began his career with the Monarchs as video coordinator for two seasons before taking on the role of assistant coach.

During his time with the Monarchs, Shuman maintained dual roles while working with the Sacramento Kings during the WNBA offseason. He began his career in professional basketball as an assistant video coordinator for the Kings in 1997 and maintained this role through the 2006 season when he was promoted to minor league scout. He also worked as an advance scout for the Cleveland Cavaliers (2009) and New Orleans Hornets (2010).

Shuman earned his degree in education from California State University Sacramento in 1989 and began his coaching career as an assistant basketball coach at Jesuit High School in Sacramento (1989-91). He then served six seasons as head coach at Trinity High School in Las Vegas, Nev. (1991-97) before joining the Kings.

VICKIE JOHNSON

Assistant Coach

A two-time WNBA All-Star, Vickie Johnson begins her coaching career with the Silver Stars in 2011.

The first player in WNBA history to record 4,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists in a career, Johnson finished with 4,243 points, 1,641 rebounds and 1,205 career assists. Johnson played 13 WNBA seasons, nine with the New York Liberty and four with the San Antonio Silver Stars, finishing her career as the league's all-time leader in games (410) and minutes played (12,435).

Johnson posted career averages of 10.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game in her 13 seasons, averaging double-digit points in seven seasons. She started all but two of her 410 career games, including amassing a 159 consecutive-games started streak which currently ranks eighth in WNBA history.


A native of Coushatta, La. Johnson was originally selected by the New York Liberty in the second round (12 overall) of the WNBA Elite Draft on February 27, 1997 and became the first player in league history to play 300 games on July 7, 2006 vs. Houston. She signed with San Antonio as a free agent on February 9, 2006, becoming the first building block of Dan Hughes' 2008 Western Conference Champion squad. Johnson helped lead the Silver Stars to its first WNBA Finals appearance and earned the 2008 Kim Perrot Sportsmanship Award following the 2008 season.

Johnson was a two-time All-American and Sun Belt Conference MVP at Louisiana Tech. She led Tech to the 1994 Final Four, was named Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year in 1995 and earned Louisiana Player of the Year honors in 1996. She finished her collegiate career with 1,891 career points and 831 rebounds and was inducted into the Louisiana Tech Hall of Fame.

Johnson – who also played professionally in Israel, France, Hungary and Turkey – announced her retirement from the WNBA following the 2009 season.

- The Silver Stars enjoyed their first season in San Antonio, posting a 9-8 record at the SBC Center. San Antonio ranked third in the WNBA in home attendance, drawing 176,526 fans over 17 home games. A franchise-record 15,593 fans turned out on May 24 as the Silver Stars hosted Seattle in the first WNBA game played in San Antonio.
- San Antonio ranked among the top three in four defensive categories. The Silver Stars finished first in the league in opponent's field goal percentage allowing foes to shoot just .398 (867-2,176) from the field. 

- Utah finished in third place in the Western Conference and secured its first-ever playoff spot. The Starzz lost to the Sacramento Monarchs in the first round.
- Margo Dydek put on a record-breaking performance, as she notched the first triple-doulbe in Starzz history and only the second triple-doulbe in WNBA history with 12 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocked shots on June 7 against Orlando. Her 10 blocked shots also broke her own WNBA record of nine that was set on Aug. 6, 1998.







### HISTORY

On April 24, 1996, women's basketball announced "We Got Next" as the NBA Board of Governors approved the concept of a Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) to begin play in June of 1997.

Since that day in 1996 there have been many firsts for the WNBA:

Val Ackerman - the first president of the WNBA

**Sheryl Swoopes** - the first player signed to the WNBA

Cynthia Cooper - the league's first Most Valuable Player

**Houston Comets** - the first WNBA Champions

**Lisa Leslie -** the first WNBA player to dunk (7/30/02 vs. Miami)

Lauren Jackson - the first international player to win MVP (2007)

Candace Parker - the first rookie to earn the league's MVP honor (2008)

**Sylvia Fowles -** the first goaltending call (vs. LA 6/3/2008)

The inaugural WNBA season tipped off on June 21, 1997, with the New York Liberty taking on the Los Angeles Sparks at the Great Western Forum in Inglewood, California. A crowd of 14,284 watched as Sparks' guard Penny Toler scored the first basket in WNBA history. The Liberty defeated the Sparks, 67-57.

### A GROWING GAME

The influence of the WNBA can be seen in the explosive growth of organized women's basketball over the past 14 seasons. An estimated 100 million women play basketball worldwide, and the league Length of game: Four 10-minute quarters reflects this trend, featuring 20 international players from 13 countries and territories at the end of the 2010 season. Female AAU youth basketball participation has increased 277 percent since 1991 (from 28,840 to 108,758 players). Female high school basketball participation has increased 17 percent since 1991 (from 387,802 to 456,967 players). And female NCAA basketball participation has increased 43 percent since 1991 (from 10,551 to 15,096 players).

### **ALL-STAR GAME**

The San Antonio Silver Stars and the AT&T Center will host the 2011 WNBA All-Star Game in San Antonio on Saturday, July 23, 2011.

In place of the All-Star Game last season, the league hosted a special event, "WNBA vs. USA Basketball: The Stars at the Sun" at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville Conn. on July 10, 2010. The event showcased the world's best female basketball players under one roof and helped the USA Basketball Women's National Team prepare for the upcoming FIBA World Championship that fall. The USAB squad, featuring 10 WNBA players and one collegian, defeated a team of WNBA stars 99-72. Sylvia Fowles of the Chicago Sky and playing for USAB, earned game MVP honors. University of Connecticut's Geno Auriemma coached the U.S. squad while Seattle Storm Head Coach Brian Agler led the WNBA team.

The first WNBA All-Star Game was held in New York at Madison Square Garden in 1999. The Garden also hosted the event in 2003 and in 2006. Washington's Verizon Center (2002, 2007) is the other venue to host the game multiple times. Other All-Star Games were played in Phoenix (2000), Orlando (2001) and at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. (2009). Due to the

Olympics, no All-Star Game was held in 2004 and 2008, although Radio City Music Hall in New York City was the site of an exhibition game on August 5, 2004, as the U.S. National Team, comprised mainly of WNBA greats, faced a squad of WNBA All-Stars in "WNBA vs. USA Basketball: The Game at Radio City"

### INSPIRING COACH

The Inspiring Coach Award is an annual honor introduced in 2007 to recognize coaches who have positively influenced athletes across numerous levels and whose achievements leave an indelible mark on sports as a whole. The University of Connecticut's Geno Auriemma earned the honor * in 2010 for his profound impact on female athletes and his demonstrated commitment, passion, and dedication to work, family, and community. Previous winners include Pat Summit, Kay Yow, and Jody Conradt.

### **INSPIRING WOMEN**

The Inspiring Woman Award is an annual honor that celebrates an individual who, on a daily basis, demonstrates her ability to inspire others through her commitment, passion and dedication to work, family, and community. Past honorees include U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Susan Rice (2010), Emmy-award winning journalist Cokie Roberts (2009), Good Morning America's Robin Roberts (2008), Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice (2007), and the WNBA All-Decade Team (2006).



### **DAWN STALEY AWARD**

The Dawn Staley Community Leadership * Award was announced in 2006 and is now ★ presented annually to the player who best ★ exemplifies the characteristics of a leader 

 in the community and reflects Staley's

The WNBA has an extensive, highly integrated relationship with adidas. The sporting goods and apparel giant not only serves as the official outfitter of the WNBA – having unveiled new uniforms across the league in 2007 and again in 2011 – but also served as the presenter of the WNBA Draft since 2007. In 2008 adidas became the first-ever presenting partner of the WNBA's entire postseason, including both the playoffs and Finals.

Five WNBA teams have entered the league's Marquee Partnership program, which includes multiyear deals featuring branded sponsorship of game jerseys – the Phoenix Mercury partnering with LifeLock, the Los Angeles Sparks with Farmers Insurance Group, the Seattle Storm with Microsoft search engine Bing, the New York Liberty with Foxwoods Resort Casino, and the Washington Mystics with Inova Health System.

### ATTENDANCE/TV RATINGS

The WNBA concluded the 2010 regular season with its fourth consecutive year of increased attendance. Postseason attendance increased for the third consecutive year, finishing up 36 percent over 2009.

For Games 2 and 3 of the 2010 WNBA Finals presented by adidas, average viewership on ESPN2 jumped 15 percent from 2009 and 79 percent from 2008.

The WNBA has one of the top five Facebook fanbases among sports leagues, with more than 318,000 fans (www.Facebook.com/wnba).

The WNBA's broadcast coverage in 2010 included more than 30 live national telecasts of regular-season and postseason contests on ESPN2 and ABC, and another 40-plus games on NBATV, as well as games streamed on ESPN360.com.

The WNBA's broadcast coverage in 2011 will include 70 high-definition regular-season, playoff, and Finals games on ESPN2, ABC and NBA TV. In addition, all WNBA games are available online via WNBA LiveAccess unless: (a) They are televised on ABC or ESPN2 – in which case they stream live on ESPN3.com and are later archived to WNBA.com, or (b) They are televised at the same time a game is televised on ABC or ESPN2 – in which case they stream live on ESPN3.com and are later archived to WNBA.com.

In July 2007, the WNBA signed a new, eightyear TV deal with ESPN that tipped off in 2009 and runs through 2016, the WNBA's 20th season. The agreement, which calls for ABC, ESPN, and ESPN2 to telecast WNBA games, includes rights fees, a first for any women's pro team sports league in the U.S.

### GLOBAL REACH

Now in its second decade, the WNBA has a wide impact on overseas markets. In 2010, for the fourth straight year, WNBA games and programming reached a record 203 countries in 32 languages, surpassing the previous total of 198 countries. In addition, for the fifth consecutive year, fans around the globe are able to view WNBA action via live Webcasts on NBA.com/china.

At the conclusion of the 2010 regular season, WNBA rosters featured 20 international players from 13 countries and territories. Among the league's international contingent were the league's MVP, Seattle Storm forward/center Lauren Jackson (Australia), the Indiana Fever's Tammy Sutton-Brown (Canada), the San Antonio Silver Stars' Sophia Young (St. Vincent), and the Los Angeles Sparks' Ticha Penicheiro (Portugal). They will be joined in 2011 by Tulsa's Elizabeth Cambage (Australia), whom the Shock selected with the No. 2 overall pick in the 2011 Draft.

### WNBA DRAFT

The 2011 WNBA Draft presented by adidas took place on April 11 at ESPN headquarters in Bristol, Conn. It marked the first professional sports league draft held on the ESPN campus. The Minnesota Lynx selected University of Connecticut's Maya Moore as the top overall pick. The Tulsa Shock selected Elizabeth Cambage second, the Chicago Sky tabbed Courtney Vandersloot third, the Lynx chose Amber Harris fourth, and the Los Angeles Sparks took Jantel Lavender fifth to round out the first five selections.

As part of the WNBA's TV deal with ESPN, the Silver Stars will play two nationally televised games on ESPN2 in 2011.



### **OWNERSHIP**

Six WNBA teams now fall under the independent ownership model: the Atlanta Dream, Chicago Sky, Connecticut Sun, Los Angeles Sparks, Seattle Storm, and Tulsa Shock.

With the announcement on Oct. 20, 2009 that the Detroit Shock would relocate to Tulsa, Okla., Tulsa Pro Hoops L.L.C. began play in 2010. Force 10 Hoops, L.L.C., the entity owned by Seattle businesswomen and civic leaders Anne Levinson, Ginny Gilder, Lisa Brummel, and Dawn Trudeau, purchased the Seattle Storm on Feb. 28, 2008. In October, 2009, Kathy Betty purchased the Atlanta Dream. In addition, the Los Angeles Sparks opened the 2007 season with new ownership after Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson, two long-time season ticket holders, bought the Sparks on Dec. 7, 2006. They joined Michael Alter's Chicago Sky, and the Mohegan Tribe's Connecticut Sun as independently owned WNBA franchises.

Entering the 2011 season, 10 women serve as owners of WNBA teams: Dr. Sheila Johnson (Washington Mystics); Kathy Goodman and Carla Christofferson (Los Angeles Sparks); Kathy Betty, Mary Brock, and Kelly Loeffler (Atlanta); and Dawn Trudeau, Ginny Gilder, and Lisa Brummel (Seattle Storm). A 10th, musical artist Michelle Williams, formerly of "Destiny's Child," is a minority owner of the Chicago Sky.

Dr. Sheila Johnson, a co-founder of Black Entertainment Television, became the WNBA's first African-American female owner on May 24, 2005 when she joined Ted Leonsis' Lincoln Holdings LLC, which in turn purchased the Washington Mystics from Washington Wizards' owner Abe Pollin.

### **KEY HIGHLIGHTS**

In 2010, Tina Thompson of the Los Angeles Sparks became the all-time scoring leader with 6,413 points, surpassing her former teammate, Lisa Leslie (6,263) who retired following the 2009 season.

Tina Charles won the 2010 WNBA Rookie of the Year award after averaging 15.5 ppg, 11.7 rpg, and 1.7 bpg, while also setting league records for most total rebounds (398) and doubles-doubles (22) in a single season.

Lauren Jackson won the 2010 WNBA MVP presented by Kia Motors award and also took home 2010 WNBA Finals MVP honors. Lisa Leslie of the Los Angeles Sparks became the first – and only – WNBA player to capture the regular-season All-Star, and Finals MVP awards during the same season (2001).

Jackson also became the third player to earn WNBA MVP honors three times (2003, 2007, 2010), joining the Sparks' Lisa Leslie (2001, 2004, 2006) and the Houston Comets' Sheryl Swoopes (2000, 2002, 2005). Houston's Cynthia Cooper earned the award twice (1997, 1998). The others to capture MVP honors are the Sacramento Monarchs' Yolanda Griffith (1999), the Sparks' Candace Parker (2008, when she became the first rookie in league history to earn the award), and the Phoenix Mercury's Diana Taurasi (2009).

Candace Parker became the first WNBA player to win Rookie of the Year and Most Valuable Player in the same season (2008). The first selection in the 2008 WNBA Draft, she earned both honors after leading the league in double-doubles and rebounds per game, while also ranking second in blocks per game and fourth in points per game. Lauren Jackson became the WNBA's youngest (26 years, 77 days) and fastest (209 games) to score her 4,000th career point on July 27, 2007. Diana Taurasi subsequently surpassed Jackson as the fastest to 4,000 points in terms of fewest games played when she reached the milestone on July 27, 2009 in just 197 games.

Taurasi rewrote the WNBA scoring records in 2006 when she led the league with 25.3 points per contest, became the first WNBA player to top 800

points in a single season (860), and the singleseason mark for three-point field-goals (121) and the single-game mark for points (47, a number later equaled by the Storm's Lauren Jackson in 2007).

Sheryl Swoopes, who earned MVP and Defensive Player of the Year honors in 2000 and 2002, made WNBA history with the league's first triple-double (14 points, 15 rebounds, 10 assists) vs. the Detroit Shock on July 27, 1999.


Lisa Leslie became the first player to dunk in a WNBA game when she did so on July 30, 2002 vs. the Miami Sol. Candace Parker, also of the Sparks, was the second, throwing down a dunk vs. the Indiana Fever on June 22, 2008.



Classes, clubs, and teams participating in the Team Up Challenge are giving back to our community through projects supporting education, environment, health & wellness, arts & culture and uniformed services.

In the 2011 season, 20 semi-finalists receive \$2500 in seed funding and five of those 'teams' will each win \$20,000 in the Summer of 2011. All teams who apply and are working on projects are eligible to receive incentives throughout the year, including tickets, player appearances, and more.





### **CREDENTIALS**

### **Preseason/Regular Season Games**

Media credentials are issued to working media only. All single-game credentials may be picked up at the Will Call window located at the Southeast Ticket Tower of the AT&T Center beginning two hours prior to tip-off. All credentials are non-transferable and any unauthorized use will subject bearer to ejection from the AT&T Center and confiscation of the pass. NOTE: All personal items are subject to search upon entering the AT&T Center. Individual game credentials should be requested through the Silver Stars Public Relations Department a minimum of 24 hours prior to game time or by 4 p.m. on Friday for all Saturday, Sunday and Monday contests.

Media members covering the Silver Stars on a regular basis will be issued full season credentials. Media with season credentials are still required to reserve seating for all games via phone (210-444-5738) or email (lcampbell@attcenter.com). Reserved seating requests should be made to the public relations office by the above mentioned deadline.

Single-game credentials will be issued on a space available basis. Credentials are good for admittance to the arena, media workroom, media hospitality and both locker rooms.

### MEDIA WORKROOM

The media workroom and media hospitality room are located on the event level in the southeast corner of the AT&T Center and are accessible only with a valid credential. Both rooms are open two hours prior to game time time. The professional intent of the media workroom is to provide a meeting and working area for writers, reporters, broadcasters and game personnel. Family members and guests will not be admitted. Any abuse of the media workroom and/or press privleges will result in forfeiture of credentials. The media workroom is equipped with electrical outlets and telephones. For additional phone needs please call Shane Skaggs at 210-444-5153.

### **MEDIA SEATING**

Reserved media seating has been designated at either the courtside press table or in the overflow press seating located on the Plaza Level in sections 101-103 and 126-28. All seats are reserved for each individual media member. Seating charts are posted at the media check-in desk and in the press room. Electrical outlets and telephones are placed on press row for your convenience. In addition, stat monitors, which also show the in-house TV feed, are also available on press row. If a media member is in need of an individual phone, please contact the Silver Stars Public Relations Department for assistance. Statistics and out of town scores will be distributed throughout the game. Media are asked to finish and file stories in the media workroom to facilitate changeover in the AT&T Center.

### WNBA MEDIA ACCESS POLICIES

### **Day of Game**

**Shootarounds:** All shootarounds will be open to the media for the last 30 minutes of the workout. Interviews at the Antioch practice facility will all take place on the court as there is no locker room access at the practice facility. For road games, media should contact the Silver Stars Public Relations Department to verify shootaround times and media access periods. Should the team not have a shootaround, it is not required to have a media "shootaround" interview session.

**Pre-Game:** The league will retain the policy of a 30-minute open locker room beginning 90 minutes before the game. All head coaches must make themselves available for a minimum of 15 minutes beginning anywhere from 15 minutes prior to the open locker room period through the end of the open locker room period.

**Post-Game:** Following a 10-minute cooling off period, head coach Dan Hughes will be available to the media and the locker room will be open to the media for 30 minutes.

### **Off Day Access**

**Practice:** All Silver Stars practices are open to the media. Please check with the public relations staff regarding open practice times for that day. No interviews will take place prior to practice without advance arrangements being made through the public relations department. All interviews will take place on the court at the Antioch practice facility.



### THE STAR SQUAD


