The 2012 BIG EAST Field Hockey Championship is a four-team, single-elimination tournament. The top-four teams seeded by conference winning percentage qualify for the conference championship. The semifinals and finals will both be conducted at the Trager Stadium on the University of Louisville campus Nov. 3-4. The champion receives the league's automatic bid to the 2012 NCAA Division I Field Hockey Championship.

32nd ANNUAL NCAA FIELD HOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP

The winner of the BIG EAST Championship receives the league's automatic bid to the 32nd annual, 16-team, NCAA Division I Field Hockey Championship. The first two rounds are held on the campuses of participating institutions in a single-elimination format. The 2012 Field Hockey Championship will be hosted by Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Va., Nov. 16 and 18. The BIG EAST has claimed two national titles, both by Connecticut, in 1981 and 1985. In 2011, Connecticut earned the BIG EAST's automatic bid and was eliminated in the semifinals. Syracuse received an at-large bid, advancing to the quarterfinals.

CONNECTICUT TOPS 2012 BIG EAST

FIELD HOCKEY PRESEASON POLL

Connecticut was chosen as the conference's top team in the 2012 BIG EAST Field Hockey Preseason Coaches' Poll for the third consecutive year. The Huskies received all but one first-place vote to tally 34 points in a vote of the league's head coaches. The head coaches were not permitted to vote for their own team. Second-place Syracuse tallied 32 points after winning the 2011 BIG EAST Field Hockey Championship. Louisville rounded out the top three with 27 points.

Connecticut is the reigning regular season BIG EAST Champion, finishing 6-0 in conference play. Despite a 3-2 loss to Syracuse in the 2011 BIG EAST Championship, the Huskies earned an at-large bid, reaching the NCAA Championship. Connecticut returns two of its leading goal scorers in Preseason All-BIG EAST selections Chloe Hunnable and Maria Elena Bolles. Hunnable and Bolles combined for 24 goals and 16 assists for a total of 64 points in 2011. Bolles was also recognized as the 2012 BIG EAST Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. Hunnable was named 2011 BIG EAST Rookie of the Year, as well as earning a spot on the 2011 All-BIG EAST First Team. She was the only freshman to earn 2011 BIG EAST Player of the Week honors, and the only player to be awarded BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week twice in 2011.

On the defensive end, Connecticut returns 2012 BIG EAST Preseason Co-Defensive Player of the Year and 2011 All-BIG EAST First Team selection Sarah Mansfield. The junior goalkeeper led the conference in goals against average (0.64), saves (21) and shutouts (4) in 2011 league play. Mansfield was selected to the 2011 All-BIG EAST Preseason Team, as well as being named 2010 Goalkeeper of the Year as a freshman.

Syracuse received two first-place votes to total 32 points in the preseason poll. The Orange enter the 2012 season as reigning BIG EAST Champions after going 5-1 in conference play in 2011. Syracuse dropped a 2-1 decision to eventual 2011 NCAA Champion Maryland in the NCAA Quarterfinals. Syracuse will be anchored on defense by 2012 Preseason BIG EAST Co-Defensive Player of the Year Laura Hahnefeldt. The junior defender was a unanimous selection to the 2011 All-BIG EAST Preseason Team.

Syracuse returns 2011 BIG EAST Championship's Most Outstanding Performer, Lauren Brooks. The sophomore forward joins teammates Leonie Geyer, Laura Hahnefeldt and Iona Holloway on the All-BIG EAST Preseason Team. Junior midfielder Leonie Geyer was a unanimous selection after tallying 30 points last season.

Louisville completes the top three of the Preseason Coaches' Poll for the second consecutive year, receiving one first-place vote and 27 points total. The Cardinals reached the 2011 BIG EAST Championship Semifinal after a 3-3 conference record, going 10-9 overall. Louisville will look to replace the offense generated by 2011 All-BIG EAST First Team selection Hayley Turner. The Cardinals have three All-BIG EAST Preseason selections in three different positions; defender Dominique Pasqualichio, goalkeeper Erin Conrad and midfielder Alyssa Voelmle. Pasqualichio was a unanimous selection.

Rutgers was voted fourth-place in the preseason poll, followed by Villanova (fifth), Providence (sixth), and Georgetown (seventh).

Providence defender Henni Tietze and Rutgers midfielder Lisa Patrone round out the All-BIG EAST Preseason Team.

The 2012 All-BIG EAST Preseason Field Hockey Team includes two seniors, five juniors and five sophomores. Since Georgetown rejoined the conference in field hockey in 2006, there have never been five sophomores selected to the preseason All-BIG EAST Team. In addition, this is the first year juniors have swept Preseason Player of the Year Honors since the conference took its current structure for field hockey in 2006.

The 2012 field hockey season is slated to begin on Friday, Aug. 24, while BIG EAST competition begins Sept. 14. The seven BIG EAST field hockey teams play a six-game regular season league schedule. The BIG EAST Championship will be hosted by Louisville at Trager Stadium November 2-4. The top four teams in regular season conference play will advance, with the Champion receiving the league's automatic bid to the 2012 NCAA Field Hockey Championship.

The 2012-13 academic year is the 34th in the history of The BIG EAST Conference as the unique consortium marches on competing at the highest level with integrity and sportsmanship.

The BIG EAST has gone through membership changes since its birth and continues to make strides in improving the quality and depth of the storied league.

The BIG EAST Conference has been always been driven by lofty goals. The outstanding performances of the student-athletes at BIG EAST schools are evidence of the league's proud tradition of success. The league has always been able to boast that many of its best students are also its best athletes. The 2011-12 year was no different.

In the athletic arena, BIG EAST student-athletes again enjoyed success on the national stage. The Georgetown women's cross country team captured its first NCAA Championship. The win by the Hoyas marked the third-straight year a BIG EAST team has won the women's cross country championship, with Villanova winning the past two. The Louisville men's basketball team advanced to the Final Four in New Orleans. Connecticut field hockey reached the NCAA semifinals, as did the Notre Dame men's lacrosse team. The Irish women's basketball team and Syracuse women's lacrosse team each reached the NCAA finals. USF softball reached the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla., for the first time in program history.

The BIG EAST placed two teams in the NCAA Women's Final Four for the third time in the last four years as Connecticut joined Notre Dame in Denver, with the Fighting Irish advancing to the national title game for the second-straight year.

BIG EAST student-athletes won four NCAA championships. Sheila Reid won her second-straight NCAA Women's Cross Country title. Syracuse hurdler Jarret Eaton won the 60-meter hurdle championship in the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship. Notre Dame won the distance medley relay at the same championship. Georgetown's Emily Infeld won the 3,000-meter run.

BIG EAST football maintained its national profile as a competitively balanced group. Three BIG EAST teams won bowl games, while the BIG EAST representative in the Bowl Championship Series won its bowl game for the fourth time in the last seven years- a streak that includes wins against the ACC, Big 12 and SEC champions.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A conference in 2005-06 when five new members began competing – the University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, the University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in 18 of the nation's top 50 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Cincinnati and Milwaukee. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain more than one-fourth of all television households in the U.S. The BIG EAST will welcome UCF, Houston, Memphis, SMU and Temple in all sports in 2013-14. Temple football will join the league in 2012, with Boise State and San Diego State joining the following year and Navy in 2015.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 32 national championships in six different sports and 137 student-athletes have won individual national titles through 2011-12.

BIG EAST basketball squads have captured 11 titles in the last 13 years. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA basketball titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. The BIG EAST placed three men's basketball teams in the Final Four in 1985, the only time this has occurred in NCAA history.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to become stronger. The conference currently crowns champions in 24 sports.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization has had the good fortune to have outstanding leadership. The BIG EAST primarily was the brainchild of Dave Gavitt, who was the conference's first Commissioner. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In

his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference. John Marinatto was the third commissioner of the BIG EAST, serving from 2009-2012, after seven years as the conference's senior associate commissioner.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed longstanding relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

BIG EAST men's basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden. The women's basketball championship has led all conferences in attendance for the past nine years. Attendance figures also are significant in soccer and baseball.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 student-athletes.
