#### **Attack Player of the Year** Kevin Cunningham, Villanova, Sr., A

Cunningham led the Wildcats this season with 41 points. He recorded 20 goals and dished out a team-high 21 assists. He also had three gamewinners.

In league play, Cunningham posted 20 points, scoring eight goals and giving out 12 assists.

#### **Defensive Player of the Year** Kevin Randall, Notre Dame, Sr., D

Randall helped anchor a defense that led the nation with a 5.63 goals against average and a .923 man-down defense

percentage. Notre Dame also posted a league-leading .658 save percentage this season.



#### **Goalkeeper of the Year** John Kemp, Notre Dame, Jr., G

Kemp logged over 727 minutes in the cage for the Fighting Irish this season. He made 131 saves for a .655 save percentage and posted a 5.69 goals

against average en route to an 11-1 overall record. Kemp ranks first in the nation in goals against average and save percentage.



#### Midfielder of the Year Will Mangan, Rutgers, Sr., M

Mangan led the league in shots per game (7.47) and was second in goals per game (2.00). The senior amassed

40 points in 15 games, recording 30 goals and 10 assists. Eleven of his goals came in league play.



#### **Coach of the Year Kevin Corrigan, Notre Dame**

Corrigan led the Fighting Irish to a 6-0 mark in BIG EAST play this year, winning the BIG EAST regular-season

title outright for the first time in program history. Notre Dame ended the regular season on a 10-game winning streak, the second-longest in program history. The Irish posted five wins against ranked opponents this year and went 11-1 overall.





#### **BIG EAST NEWS & NOTES**

#### Georgetown

- Senior faceoff specialist Brian Tabb became the second player in Georgetown men's lacrosse history to eclipse the 400 face-off win mark during the third quarter, then scored his first career goal with nine seconds left, as the Hoyas defeated Rutgers 13-8 on Senior Night at Multi-Sport Field.
- Tabb won six-of-seven face-offs in a decisive third quarter that saw the Hoyas break a 3-3 halftime tie by outscoring the Scarlet Knights 5-1.
- Tabb finished the game 12-for-21 at the face-off X, giving him 403 career wins, to finish his career behind only Andy Corno on the Hoyas all-time list.
- Senior midfielder Zack Angel scored two goals in his final collegiate game, while goalie Matt Winter earned the win making six saves. CT Fisher also made five saves during the fourth quarter in his final game.
- Junior Brian Casey posted his second consecutive four-point game and fourth three-goal game of the season. He led the Hoyas in points with 35, posting 20 goals and 15 assists, both career highs. Posted 20 points since moving to attack during GU's game vs. Loyola (Md.)

#### **Notre Dame**

- The Fighting Irish will play No. 1 seed Loyola in the semifinal on May 26 at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. It is the third time in program history that the Irish make it to the final four teams in the tournament.
- Notre Dame defeated Yale 13-7 at home in the NCAA Championship first round on May 13. Sophomore Jim Marlatt led the Irish with a careerhigh five points on three goals and two assists.
- The Irish defeated No. 5 seed Virginia 12-10 at PPL Park in Chester, Pa. on May 20 in the quarterfinals. Senior Max Pfeifer registered three goals and one assist, while junior Steve Murphy also had four points on two goals and two assists.
- The Fighting Irish wrapped up the outright BIG EAST regular-season title and a perfect 6-0 league mark with the win over Syracuse. It was the first BIG EAST regular-season championship for Notre Dame. It is the 20th regular-season conference crown for the Irish. Notre Dame won 12 Great Western Lacrosse League titles from 1994-2009 and seven Midwest Lacrosse Association championships from 1981-93.
- ND is ranked first nationally in goals against average (5.92) and mandown defense (.897)
- Notre Dame ended the regular season with a 10-game winning streak. The streak is the second-longest in program history. The Irish record is 15 straight wins, which occurred during the 2009 campaign.

#### **Providence**

- In its first BIG EAST victory since joining the conference in 2010 and in its final game of the season, Providence defeated No. 13/15 Villanova 15-11, on April 28 at Lennon Family Field in Providence, R.I.
- Senior Jake Nolan and freshman Greg FitzMaurice led the Friars in scoring with three goals apiece. Nolan also notched two assists. Sophomore Sean Wright scored two goals and registered three assists in the victory.
- Senior Christian Dzwilewski notched 14 saves in his final regularseason game.

#### **Rutgers**

• Despite hat tricks from senior co-captain M Will Mangan and redshirt sophomore A Scott Klimchak, Rutgers was unable to top Georgetown in RU's regular season finale, falling 13-8 at Multi-Sport Field.

- Senior A Kevin Hover finished with two goals. Mangan added one assist to lead RU with four points.
- First-year head coach Brian Brecht's squad finished the 2012 regular season with a 6-9 overall record and 1-5 mark in BIG EAST action.
- Sophomore D Nick Contino finished the game with a team-best three caused turnovers. Freshman M Blake Burkhart and senior D Ryan Warnick brought in five ground balls each to tie for the team lead. Junior G Joseph Donnelly made 13 saves in between the pipes.

#### St. John's

- St. John's upset No. 1 seed Notre Dame 8-7 in the BIG EAST semifinals. The Red Storm jumped out to a big lead, taking an 8-3 advantage into the fourth quarter, but the Irish mounted a comeback, scoring four goals in the fourth quarter. The Red Storm were able to hold off the comeback and advance to the inaugural championship title game.
- The Red Storm lost to Syracuse in the championship game 12-4.
- St. John's achieved the highest win total since program reinstatement in 2005 with eight.
- The victory over No. 2 Notre Dame was the highest ranked opponent St. John's has beaten.

#### **Svracuse**

- The Orange were knocked out of the NCAA Championship in the first round by Duke. SU lost 12-9 on Saturday.
- Senior Tommy Palasek was named the BIG EAST Championship Most Outstanding Performer as he led the Orange to the title. Palasek scored four points in the semifinal win against Villanova and six points in the win against St. John's.
- SU outscored opponents 27-10 in the two BIG EAST tournament games.
- $\bullet$  Syracuse has 11 NCAA titles and made its 32nd NCAA tournament appearance in 2012.

#### Villanova

- The Wildcats earned the No. 2 seed in the inaugural BIG EAST Championship where they faced third-seeded Syracuse in the semifinals.
- Villanova lost to Syracuse 15-6 on May 3.
- The Wildcats ended the regular season ranked second nationally in man-up offense (.518).
- VU was ranked first in the league in goals per game (10.71), assists per game (7.5), points per game (18.21) and shot percent (.300)


