Arriving at the Olympic Park

Aim to arrive early – the gates to the Olympic Park will open at 5.30pm*. You need to be in your seat inside the Olympic Stadium by 7.30pm at the latest, in time for the pre-show.

Closing Ceremony

The Closing Ceremony will provide a breathtaking finale to the Paralympic Games, celebrating the efforts and achievements of all the athletes who competed.



By the time you're sitting in the Olympic Stadium on 9 September, a huge production team will have worked tirelessly to create a dazzling spectacle that embraces the Paralympic Values of courage, determination, inspiration and equality.

In the midst of all the celebration and entertainment, you'll see some protocols and traditions that are common features of every Paralympic Closing Ceremony. We don't want to give away too much just yet, but to give you an idea of what you can expect...

Flag bearers of participating countries will enter the Stadium, followed by the spectacular Parade of Athletes. Unlike the Opening Ceremony, the athletes will enter together and not by nation – a show of great unity after 11 days of intense competition.

After the Paralympic Flag has been lowered, the flag of Brazil (Host Nation of the next Paralympic Games) will be raised, signifying the handover from London to Rio de Janeiro.

Sir Philip Craven, President of the International Paralympic Committee, and Seb Coe, Chair of the London 2012 Organising Committee, will then address the assembled crowd and the Paralympic Flame will be extinguished, marking the conclusion of London 2012.

Did you know?

Around 4,200 athletes are expected to compete in the London 2012 Paralympic Games – more than at any previous Paralympic Games.
