Aim to arrive early – the gates to the Olympic Park will open at 5pm\*. You need to be in your seat inside the Olympic Stadium by 7.30pm at the latest, in time for the pre-show. Arriving at the Olympic Park

When you get to the Olympic Park, you'll be asked to go through airport-style security screening. With thousands of visitors arriving at the same time, there may be a queue.

## Opening Leremony

With a cast of thousands, stunning sets and incredible special effects, the Opening Ceremony will provide the perfect curtain raiser to the London 2012 Paralympic Games.



The Opening Ceremony of the London 2012 Paralympic Games will see a breathtaking spectacle that champions the Paralympic Values of courage, determination, inspiration and equality.

In the midst of all the celebration and entertainment, you'll see some protocols and traditions that are common features of every Paralympic Opening Ceremony. We don't want to give away too much just yet, but here's an idea of what you can expect...

After the Host Nation's flag (the Union Jack) has been raised and the national anthem played, the spectacular Parade of Athletes will begin.

Once the athletes have entered the Stadium, nation by nation and in alphabetical order, Sir Philip Craven, President of the International Paralympic Committee, and Seb Coe, Chair of the London 2012 Organising Committee, will address the assembled crowd.

The Games will be declared open and oaths taken by representatives of participating athletes and judges.

Towards the end of the evening, the Paralympic Flame will be brought into the Stadium and passed to the final Torchbearer, who will light the Paralympic Cauldron. The Flame will continue to burn until it's extinguished at the Closing Ceremony on 9 September.

## Did you know?

The Paralympic Flame will begin its journey to the Stadium 24 hours before the Opening Ceremony, when four flames from across Great Britain and Northern Ireland will be united at a special event in Stoke Mandeville, Buckinghamshire – spiritual home of the Paralympic Movement.

## **Co-Artistic Directors**

Co-Artistic Directors Bradley Hemmings and Jenny Sealey share a long history of staging exciting live shows together, including work with deaf and disabled artists.

Hemmings is Artistic Director of the Greenwich+Docklands International Festival. He also curates and produces Liberty, London's annual disability arts festival, for the Mayor of London.


