The 2012-13 academic year is the 34th in the history of The BIG EAST Conference as the unique consortium marches on competing at the highest level with integrity and sportsmanship.

The BIG EAST has gone through membership changes since its birth and continues to make strides in improving the quality and depth of the storied league.

The BIG EAST Conference has been always been driven by lofty goals. The outstanding performances of the student-athletes at BIG EAST schools are evidence of the league's proud tradition of success. The league has always been able to boast that many of its best students are also its best athletes. The 2011-12 year was no different.

In the athletic arena, BIG EAST student-athletes again enjoyed success on the national stage. The Georgetown women's cross country team captured its first NCAA Championship. The win by the Hoyas marked the third-straight year a BIG EAST team has won the women's cross country championship, with Villanova winning the past two. The Louisville men's basketball team advanced to the Final Four in New Orleans. Connecticut field hockey reached the NCAA semifinals, as did the Notre Dame men's lacrosse team. The Irish women's basketball team and Syracuse women's lacrosse team each reached the NCAA finals. USF softball reached the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla., for the first time in program history.

The BIG EAST placed two teams in the NCAA Women's Final Four for the third time in the last four years as Connecticut joined Notre Dame in Denver, with the Fighting Irish advancing to the national title game for the second-straight year.

BIG EAST student-athletes won five NCAA championships. Sheila Reid won her second-straight NCAA Women's Cross Country title. Syracuse hurdler Jarret Eaton won the 60-meter hurdle championship in the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship. Notre Dame won the distance medley relay at the same championship. Georgetown's Emily Infeld won the 3,000-meter run. Louisville's Carlos Almeida won the 200-yard breaststroke at the NCAA Swimming and

Diving Championship.

BIG EAST football maintained its national profile as a competitively balanced group. Three BIG EAST teams won bowl games, while the BIG EAST representative in the Bowl Championship Series won its bowl game for the fourth time in the last seven years- a streak that includes wins against the ACC, Big 12 and SEC champions.

The BIG EAST became the nation's largest Division I-A conference in 2005-06 when five new members began competing – the University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, the University of Louisville, Marquette University and the University of South Florida.

BIG EAST institutions reside in 18 of the nation's top 50 largest media markets, including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., Tampa, Pittsburgh, Hartford, Cincinnati and Milwaukee. With its newest members, BIG EAST markets contain more than one-fourth of all television households in the U.S. The BIG EAST will welcome UCF, Houston, Memphis, SMU and Temple in all sports in 2013-14. Temple football will join the league in 2012, with Boise State and San Diego State joining the following year and Navy in 2015.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 32 national championships in six different sports and 138 student-athletes have won individual national titles through 2011-12.

BIG EAST basketball squads have captured 11 titles in the last 13 years. In 2003-04, Connecticut became the first school in NCAA history to win the men's and women's NCAA basketball titles in the same season. In '02-03, the BIG EAST became the first conference in NCAA history to win the men's and women's titles in the same year when the Syracuse men and the Connecticut women captured their respective national championships. The BIG EAST placed three men's basketball teams in the Final Four in 1985, the only time this has occurred in NCAA history.

Proactive movement has been a signature strategy for the conference that was born in 1979. The BIG EAST continually turns challenges into opportunities to

become stronger. The conference currently crowns champions in 24 sports.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

While the membership has both increased and changed, the focus of the BIG EAST has not wavered. The conference reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably show a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful organization has had the good fortune to have outstanding leadership. The BIG EAST primarily was the brainchild of Dave Gavitt, who was the conference's first Commissioner. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate to Gavitt, became Commissioner in 1990. In his first year, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference. John Marinatto was the third commissioner of the BIG EAST, serving from 2009-2012, after seven years as the conference's senior associate commissioner.

The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes. The conference has enjoyed longstanding relationships with CBS, ESPN, Inc. and ABC.

BIG EAST men's basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual men's BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden. The women's basketball championship has led all conferences in attendance for the past nine years. Attendance figures also are significant in soccer and baseball.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 student-

## 2012 NCAA DIVISION I MEN'S SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP



The winner of the BIG EAST Championship receives the league's automatic bid to the 48-team NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Championship. The 2012 NCAA Championship marks the 54th anniversary of the tournament. First, second and third round games, as well as the quarterfinals, are held on the campuses of participating

institutions in a single-elimination format.

For the second-straight year, the College Cup - national semifinals and championship games - will be hosted by the University of Alabama at Birmingham and the Alabama Sports Foundation. It will be held at Regions Park in Hoover, Ala., on December 7 and 9. Last season, the BIG EAST had seven teams earn spots in the NCAA Championship. All seven teams earned home games, with four teams earning byes to the second round. Three teams advanced to the quarterfinals (Connecticut, Louisville and USF). The BIG EAST has two national titles, St. John's in 1996 and UConn in 2000.

## BIG EAST NOTES

### The BIG EAST in the College Cup

Seven BIG EAST men's soccer teams competed in the 2011 NCAA Championship, with all seven earning the opportunity to host their first game. Four teams earned byes to the second round and three teams advanced as far as the quarterfinals. In 2010, Louisville reached the NCAA title game.

### Postseason Status Has Skyrocketed Since 2001 Season

In the last nine years, the BIG EAST has averaged six teams in the NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Championship 48-team field – one-eighth of the entire field. In 2005, 2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011, the league advanced a record seven teams to NCAA postseason competition. The BIG EAST has also seen a team advance to the round of 16 every year since 1998, a team reach the quarterfinals in 10 of the last 11 years, and in 2002, three BIG EAST teams earned coveted top-eight seeds when the NCAA bracket was announced.

### St. John's wins BIG EAST Title

The Red Storm won their ninth BIG EAST Championship title in 2011. St. John's earned the third seed in the Red Division and defeated Georgetown 2-1 in the first round. In the quarterfinals, St. John's earned a trip to Red Bull Arena, defeating West Virginia, the second seed in the Blue Division, 2-0. The Red Storm shut out Villanova 2-0 and defeated Connecticut in overtime 1-0 to claim the title. The program's last title came in 2009 on penalty kicks.

### BIG EAST Championship Held at Red Bull Arena

The semifinals and final of the 2011 BIG EAST Championship were held at Red Bull Arena in Harrison, N.J., for the second-straight year. Connecticut, the third seed in the Blue Division, defeated Louisville, the No. 4 seed in the Red Division, to advance to the title game against St. John's. The Red Storm, the third seed in the Red Division, defeated No. 5 Red seed Villanova to advance to the title game. St. John's took the win in overtime 1-0.

### BIG EAST Success Out of the Gate Early and Often

The BIG EAST began sponsoring men's soccer in 1982, but did not officially begin regular-season league competition until 1985 – far later than the formation of most other conferences. Since 1985, the league boasts national championships by two different teams, seven College Cup appearances, 19 quarterfinal-round advancements, several consistent top 20 programs, an astounding record of NCAA appearances by multiple teams especially given the small NCAA field size of 48, and several well-respected head coaches with extensive accolades and experience.

### Several Men's Soccer Players Drafted into the MLS

The BIG EAST had 13 players taken in the 2012 MLS SuperDraft. There were seven players taken in the first round and six in the second round. There were five BIG EAST players taken in the 2012 Supplemental Draft.

### Four Named to the M.A.C. Hermann Watch List

Four BIG EAST players were named to the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy Watch List for the 2011 season: Carlos Alvarez and Tony Cascio from Connecticut, along with Austin Berry from Louisville. Dom Dwyer of USF was added to the Watch List and was a semifinalist.

### Three Named to Lowe's All-America Teams

There were three BIG EAST players named to the Lowe's Senior All-America First and Second Teams: Notre Dame's Greg Klazura and Louisville's Colin Rolfe were named to the first team, while Connecticut's Tony Cascio earned a spot on the second team. There were four BIG EAST players selected as Lowe's Senior CLASS Award candidates: Cascio, Klazura, Rolfe and Austin Berry from Louisville.

### BIG EAST Attendance

The BIG EAST was well represented in total home attendance with two teams in the top five as Connecticut ranked second (50,402), and Louisville ranked fourth (42,575). USF was 14th (18,211) and St. John's was 15th (15,085). Notre Dame ranked 18th (14,467).

### BIG EAST in the Top of the Polls

In the final RPI rankings (updated on December 15, 2011), the BIG EAST had four teams in the top 13, the most of any conference. Connecticut was ranked third, USF was ninth, Louisville was 11th and St. John's rounded out the four teams at No. 13. In the final regular-season NSCAA national poll, the BIG EAST had four teams listed in the top 20 (No. 5 Connecticut, No. 6 USF, No. 7 Louisville, No. 19 St. John's).

### BIG EAST Coaches Honored

Rutgers coach Dan Donigan was named the Northeast Region NSCAA Regional Coach of the Year. Rutgers enjoyed a huge turnaround, going 10-7-4 overall and 6-1-2 in conference action to finish second in the Red Division. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the NCAA Championship Third Round. RU finished the 2011 season entering the final NSCAA rankings at No. 23.

## HUSKIES NOTEBOOK

- Connecticut returns eight players that started at least 16 games in 2011, including All-BIG EAST selections Carlos Alvarez, Jossimar Sanchez, Andre Blake and Mamadou Diouf.
- The Huskies return four of the top-five scorers from last season, led by All-BIG EAST First Team selection Mamadou Diouf, who finished with 13 goals and 28 points.
- In 2012, UConn will play five games against four teams that competed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The Huskies will face four teams that won their respective conference regular-season or tournament championships.
- UConn allowed just 10 goals in 25 games and finished the 2011 season ranked second in the NCAA with a 0.39 goals against average.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Andre Blake and the UConn defense set a Connecticut record with 16 shutouts last season.
- UConn finished the 2011 season ranked second in the nation in total attendance (50,402) and fourth in the NCAA in average attendance (3,600).

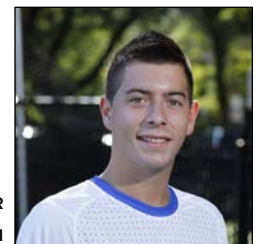

## CARDINALS NOTEBOOK

- Louisville returns seven starters from a team that finished ranked seventh in the nation last season. Last season he dished out two game-winning assists for the Bruins' College Cup team.

## GOLDEN EAGLES NOTEBOOK

- Defending BIG EAST Conference Blue Division champion Marquette has its sights set its fourth-straight postseason bid in 2012 after earning BIG EAST Men's Soccer Championship berths in 2009, 2010 and 2011.
- Eight starting players return for the third consecutive season, although MU will be a bit younger than in years past; Marquette's roster features 11 freshmen, including 10 newcomers, and just eight upperclassmen.
- Marquette returns unanimous BIG EAST All-Rookie team selection C. Nortey. The Ghanaian striker, who also earned MU's Newcomer of the Year and Golden Boot awards in 2011, led the squad with nine goals and 20 points last season.
- Six NCAA postseason tournament participants appear on Marquette's 2012 preseason and regular schedule, including Loyola Chicago, Xavier (Atlantic 10 tournament champion), Western Illinois (Summit League champion) and Northern Illinois, in addition to BIG EAST foes Connecticut (NCAA quarterfinalist) and Providence.

## FIGHTING IRISH NOTEBOOK

- Notre Dame returns six starters from last season after posting a 9-5-4 record, marking the program's 11th straight winning season.
- The Irish return 93 percent of their goal production and 86 percent of their point production from last season. Notre Dame welcomes back its top five goal scorers and its top six point scorers. Forward Ryan Finley returns to the Irish for his senior campaign after pacing the Irish in goals (7) and points (16) last season. Senior midfielder Adam Mena notched a team-best five assists in 2011.
- Notre Dame has two All-Conference performers, seniors Ryan Finley and Dillon Powers. Both were named to the 2011 All-BIG EAST Second Team.
- Goalkeeper Will Walsh, a fifth-year senior, returns after collecting all 18 decisions last season and posting a 0.83 goals-against average and a .795 save percentage.
- Head coach Bobby Clark became Notre Dame's all-time wins leader last season.
- Midfielders Michael Rose and Dillon Powers will serve as team captains during the 2012 campaign. Rose is a fifth-year senior and first-time team captain, while Powers, a senior, will be captaining the Fighting Irish for the second straight season.

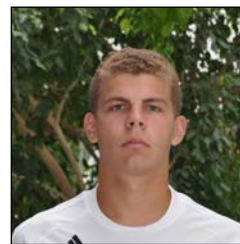

## SCARLET KNIGHTS NOTEBOOK

- Rutgers enjoyed a huge turnaround, going 10-7-4 overall and 6-1-2 in conference action to finish second in the Red Division. The Scarlet Knights advanced to the NCAA Championship Third Round.
- RU finished the 2011 season entering the final NSCAA rankings at No. 23.
- Despite the loss of two All-BIG EAST selections from a year ago (Ibrahim Kamara and Nate Bourdeau), the Scarlet Knights return their top two scorers in JP Correa and Kene Eze. Correa, an All-BIG EAST Rookie Team selection, was first on the squad with 17 points on six goals and five assists, while Eze added 15 points on six goals and three assists.
- Rutgers also returns starting goalkeeper Kevin McMullen, who went 9-6-4 with three shutouts. He posted a 1.36 goals-against average and .711 save percentage in addition to ranking sixth in the conference with 69 saves.
- The Scarlet Knights, under the direction of third-year head coach Dan Donigan, welcome a 12-member recruiting class. Donigan and his staff were recognized with the NSCAA Northeast Region Coach of the Year honors.

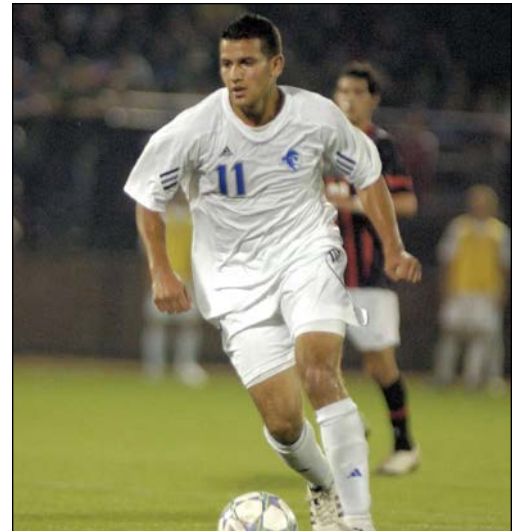

- Seton Hall returns six of its top-seven scorers from last year's squad in addition to bringing back all three goalkeepers who saw significant time in the nets.
- Junior Max Garcia led Seton Hall in scoring last year, netting five goals and an assist to tally 11 points. He tallied one game-winning score and converted his only penalty kick attempt of the year.
- The Pirates also welcome back senior Adriano Gabriele (two goals), sophomore Jason Wellington (two goals), sophomore Kai Greene (one goal, two assists) and sophomore Damian Bziukiewicz (four assists) to this year's team.
- Junior Anthony Reichwaldt led Seton Hall with nine starts in goal last season, posting a 3-4-1 record. He recorded a pair of shutouts while boasting a 1.75 goals-against average. He also registered a goal and an assist for the Pirates as a forward.

## WILDCATS NOTEBOOK

- The Wildcats return 10 starters from a group that gave VU its first ever postseason wins in November, advancing to the BIG EAST semifinals for the first time since 1993
- Defense will again be the cornerstone for Villanova. The team established a single-season school record with nine shutouts, limiting opponents to an 0.94 goals-against average.
- Senior tri-captain Kyle McCarthy and junior Will Cason are the central backs on a stingy back four. McCarthy is a three-year starter and Cason has been in the starting lineup for most of his two seasons on campus.
- Junior Dylan Renna led the team in scoring in 2011 for the second consecutive season despite missing three early season games as he recovered from hip surgery.
- Senior Kyle Soroka (five goals) and sophomore Oscar Umar (eight points) help generate offense in the midfield and work well with Renna and fellow forward Aaron Dennis (five goals, 11 points)
  - The coaching staff will have two redshirt seniors with strong track records to choose from in goal. John Fogarty was stellar in net last season with an 0.95 GAA while starting all 21 games after serving as an understudy to Chris Bresnahan earlier in his career. Meanwhile, Bresnahan returns to action after missing all of last season following hip surgery. Bresnahan recorded a 1.15 GAA while starting 55 of a possible 56 games from 2008-10.

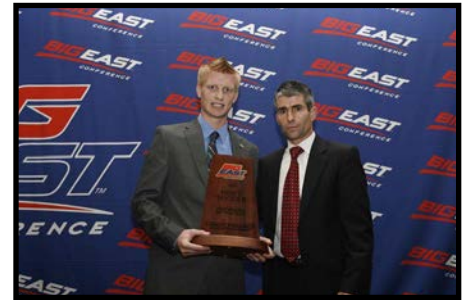
