Tickets



We made sure it was easy for disabled people to buy tickets for London 2012.

The Ticketcare scheme

Is for disabled people who don't need a wheelchair space, but do need a carer or personal assistant to support them at the Games.



There are a limited number of Ticketcare tickets.

Travel



We want to make sure everyone can get to the Games safely and easily.

Blue Badge parking spaces

There are a limited number of these and you need to pre-book them.



Accessible shuttle buses



Accessible shuttle buses will travel from some stations to the entrance of venues.

More accessible public transport



Some public transport has also been made more accessible for disabled people.

Games Mobility



Inside a venue disabled people will be able to use the Games Mobility service for help with getting around.

This service is free and will be easy to find.



The Games Mobility service can:

- loan you a manual wheelchair
- loan you a mobility scooter
- guide visually impaired people to their seat.



Other

Accessible toilets



There are extra accessible toilets for disabled people.



There is a Changing Places toilet at all venues.

These have a hoist to help disabled people get changed.



Assistance dogs

Disabled people can bring their assistance dog into the venues.

We have areas in each venue where the dogs can go to the toilet.
