The e-Duke Books Scholarly Collection includes at least 100 new electronic books published by Duke University Press in the humanities and social sciences in 2015. Customers also receive term access to almost 2,000 backlist titles—including 350 newly-digitized e-books to be added over the course of the year—during the years in which they purchase the collection. e-Duke Books is hosted by HighWire Press.
