

Using Mobile Devices in Emergencies

Mobile devices and cell phones can be valuable in emergencies.

- If you need emergency assistance, call 911.
- Store emergency contact numbers (ex: for family, friends, police, fire, gas, hydro) so you can find them quickly.
- Store important information about your pets' special needs that you may require during an emergency.
