I. OVERVIEW

- Typhoon Yolanda with international name "Haiyan" entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on 06 November 2013
- "Yolanda" made landfall in the following areas:
 - Guiuan, Eastern Samar
 - Tolosa, Leyte
 - Daanbantayan, Cebu
 - Bantayan Island, Cebu
 - Concepcion, Iloilo
 - Busuanga, Palawan
- Typhoon Yolanda exited PAR on 09 November 2013
- The wrath of "Yolanda" affected a total of 3,424,593 families (16,078,181 individuals) in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, and CARAGA, of which, 890,895 families (4,095,280 individuals) were reportedly displaced
- A total of, **1,084,762** houses (partially: **595,149** / totally: **489,613**) were damaged during the onslaught of Typhoon Yolanda. (Source: PDNA Report, April 2014)
- This dreadful event left a total of PhP**89,598,068,634.88** worth of damages broken down into the following sectors:

- Due to the massive destruction and immense effects of Typhoon Yolanda, the President issued Presidential Proclamation No. 682 declaring a state of national calamity on 11 November 2013
- Presidential Assistant for Rehabilitation and Recovery (PARR) was designated by the President to oversee Typhoon Yolanda Reconstruction and Rehabilitation per Presidential Memorandum Order No. 62 dated 6 December 2013

II. UPDATES (As of 17 April 2014)

- **Seven (7) persons** in Tacloban City were added to the list of dead individuals, to which, the total of dead individuals increased to **6,300**. There are no changes in the number of injured (28,689) and missing (1,061) persons.
 - No other changes per SitRep No. 108 dated 03 April 2014.
