## Maryland-Kanagawa Sister State Committee receives funding to send four-member delegation to Kanagawa, Japan

WASHINGTON, DC – Maryland-Kanagawa Sister State Committee has been selected by *Sister Cities International* to receive the *Leading Asia: Renewing the U.S. and Japan Sister Cities Network* exchange funding. The funding will enable a 10-day Maryland delegation visit to their Japanese sister state Kanagawa.

Through the *Leading Asia* exchange funding, the Maryland-Kanagawa Sister States Program plans to focus on green energy and business development exchange, areas of interest to Kanagawa Prefecture Governor Yuji Kuroiwa. The focus will build on the Maryland's significant technology and policy experience.

The purpose of the *Leading Asia* exchange funding is to launch programming in the following areas: business development, sustainability, creative economies, and young professional development. In 2011, five cities were awarded funding during the first round.

The objective of this grant award is to improve and expand existing relationships between the U.S. and Japan.
