## Rice Lake International Friendship Association receives funding to send four-member delegation to Miharu, Japan

WASHINGTON, DC – Rice Lake, Wisconsin is one of seven U.S. cities selected by *Sister Cities International* to receive the *Leading Asia: Renewing the U.S. and Japan Sister Cities Network* exchange funding. The funding will enable a 10-day Rice Lake delegation visit to their Japanese sister city, Miharu.

Rice Lake will be celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its sister city relationship with Miharu. Over the past years, they've successfully conducted several student exchange programs. Their other projects include the building of the International House, an American-style bed and breakfast in Miharu, and the Japanese Friendship Garden at the local university campus.

Through the *Leading Asia* exchange funding, Rice Lake plans to foster and further educational exchange by cultivating new venues for professional development, business and economic growth. This includes creating viable exchange programs for Rice Lake students to travel to Miharu for longer school-year stays.

The purpose of the *Leading Asia* exchange funding is to launch programming in the following areas: business development, sustainability, creative economies, and young professional development. In 2011, five cities were awarded funding during the first round.

The Leading Asia: Renewing the U.S. and Japan Sister Cities Network is funded by a grant from the Japan Foundation Center for Global Partnerships. The objective of this grant award is to improve and expand existing relationships between the U.S. and Japan.
