STARR HURLEY WINS SISTER CITIES INTERNATIONAL'S VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR AWARD

WASHINGTON, DC – Starr Hurley of Northern California Sister Cities has won Sister Cities International's 2014 Volunteer of the Year Award. The Volunteer of the Year Annual Award honors an exemplary volunteer for contributions to the sister city movement and recognizes the leadership and talent that benefit local sister city programs and the larger sister city network.

Ms. Hurley's involvement with the sister cities network began in 1988 with the Sacramento-Hamilton, New Zealand Sister City Program. Since then, Ms. Hurley has worked tirelessly to contribute to local and regional sister cities activities.

She currently serves on the Northern California Sister Cities Board of Directors, representing Sacramento and surrounding areas. Ms. Hurley is also chair of the Sacramento Sister Cites Council and President of Sacramento-Hamilton, New Zealand Sister City Program. In 2013, Ms. Hurley was a volunteer for the League of Cities Conference and assisted Sister Cities International's Northern California State Coordinators in growing the sister city network regionally.

Starr Hurley is a former Olympic skier, and was a Torch Bearer in 1960 at the opening of the 8th Winter Games in Squaw Valley, California. She was voted "Skier of the Year" by The Winter Sports Writers Association in 1963.

Sister Cities International's Annual Awards are awarded in several categories including Best Overall, Innovation (Arts & Culture, Economic Development, Energy/Sustainable Development, Humanitarian Assistance, and Youth & Education), Volunteer of the Year, and Youth Leadership. Award winners will be honored at a special ceremony on Saturday, August 2, during Sister Cities International's 58th Annual Conference in San Jose, California.

The Sister Cities International 58th Annual Conference will bring together elected and municipal officials, engaged citizens, diplomats, and business leaders in the exciting capital of Silicon Valley to discuss, "The Power of Digital Diplomacy".
