## FISU Regulations

The Speed skating events (optional discipline - with medals awarding) are organised in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Skating Union (ISU). The FISU regulations are always set up after recommendation of the FISU Technical Chair, the ISU Technical Delegate with close cooperation with the Committee for the Sporting Regulations and approved by the FISU Executive Committee. The program and duration of the competitions is fixed by the Executive Committee in agreement with the Organizing Committee and CTI.
Duration of competition: 8 days maximum

## Long Track Speed Skating Competitions

Today's long track speed skating competitions are organized for Men and Women as follows: The running of the competitions is always supervised by the FISU Technical Chair for Long Track Speed Skating together with the ISU Technical Delegate who chair all technical meetings concerned. All sport facilities with the necessary equipment must be assured by the Organizing Committee of the host country. This interesting discipline has become very exiting and spectacular not only for audience on the stadium but also for TV broadcast and media.


## Long Track Speed Skating History

The earliest international university sport competition of long track speed skating dates back from 1951 during the World University Championship Cup in Poiana (ROU). Gold medallist of that event Evgeni GRISHIN (USSR) became an Olympic Champion on the 500 m and 1500 m in 1956 and 1960 . The sport appeared on the X. World Winter University Games in Vienna- Semmering (AUT) in 1953 where the athletes of the USSR dominated on all distances and only in Men's 500 m , the $2^{\text {nd }}$ place was achieved by DOUBEK from Czechoslovakia. Long track speed skating was included in the program of Winter Universiade for the $1^{\text {st }}$ time during the $5^{\text {th }}$ edition in 1968 held in Innsbruck (AUT) an initially only for men. Since 1970 the competition has been open to both men and women. Long Track Speed Skating is an optional sport of the WU sports program.

Former medallists participating at the WU include Olympic Winter Games and World Championships participants such as: Enrico Fabris (ITA) 2 gold \& 1 bronze, Speed Skating OWG / Matteo Anesi (ITA) Gold, Speed Skating OWG / Lee Kang Seok (KOR) Bronze, Speed Skating OWG / Sang Lee Hwa (KOR) 6th, Speed Skating OWG.
The long track speed skating competition has already been staged 8 times at the Winter Universiade. With the good cooperation between the International Skating Union (ISU) and FISU, we closely follow the evolution of this sport for developing our competition program. The $1^{\text {st }}$ edition of the World University Long Track Speed Skating Championship will be held in December 2012 in Zakopane (Poland). The current FISU Technical Chair for long track speed skating is Sergio ANESI (ITA). He was preceded by John THORPE (CAN) and Louw HEKKEMA (NED).
