Russian Air Force Structure

Russia, and the Soviet Union before it, split it's vast territory into Military Districts which oversaw the operations of all military forces assigned to that district, air, land and naval. That concept continues today, albeit with the number of Military Districts now reduced to four – Western, Southern, Central and Eastern.

It is the role of the Russian Air Force higher command to train and equip the Air Force units assigned to each of the Military Districts. The Air Force has some units which report directly to it, such as the strategic bomber, transportation and training units. Those units assigned to the Military Districts (MD) come under an Air Force Command, 1st Command for Western MD; 2nd Command for Central MD; 3rd Command for Central MD and 4th Command for Southern MD.

For most of it's existence, including the Soviet era, Air Force units were organized along the lines of Regiments consisting of a number of aircraft squadrons. In 2009, however, this structure was changed and numbered 'Air Bases' were established consisting not only of the flying squadrons but also all of the base support elements – all under one Air Base command. The idea behind this structure is to bring all the elements necessary to support flying squadrons under one command in order to make it more efficient. This new structure was implemented through 2009 and 2010. However, it has recently been reported in an article AirForces Monthly [1] that the process was being reversed and the previous numbered regimental system was being restored, to help maintain unit moral and identity. It is quite possible that the Russian Air Force has devised a hybrid of the two systems, calling the units regiments but still assigning all the support elements to them. It may be some time before a clear picture emerges.

The table below reflects the numbered Air Bases but also, where known, shows the new, or revived, Regimental name and number. In many respects, it is only the names and numbers which may have changed, the units themselves have not been physically redeployed through this process, so aircraft and squadrons have for the most part stayed where they were.
