FLORIDA STATE WOMEN'S GOLF TEAM ADVANCES TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY FOR 14TH TIME IN LAST 17 SEASONS UNDER DILLMAN IN 2007 WESTRUP EARNS ALL-AMERICA AND ALL-ACC HONORS

SEMINOLES ENJOY ANOTHER NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP APPEARANCE IN 2007

The Florida State women's golf team earned two team championships, seven top -10 team finishes and played in the NCAA Regional Championships for the 14th time in the last 17 seasons as the Seminoles enjoyed another successful year under Head Coach Debbie Dillman. In addition to the outstanding team success enjoyed during the fall 2006 and spring 2007 seasons, the Seminoles also celebrated the outstanding career of sophomore Caroline Westrup who earned All-America First-Team and All-ACC honors for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles finished in a tie for 11th at the NCAA East Regional Championship, in third place at the ACC Championship and played in the National Golf Coaches' Association Match Play Championship for the first time in program history. The Seminoles defeated Florida, 5-0, in the first round of the NGCA Match Play Championship and finished in seventh place in the 16-team event.

RANKING THE SEMINOLES

Florida State finished the 2006-07 season ranked 24th nationally in the final team rankings by the editors of GolfWeek Magazine. It marked the second consecutive season and third time in the last four seasons that the Seminoles had earned a top-25 national ranking to end a season. The Seminoles finished the year ranked 26th nationally in the final NGCA/Golf World poll and 33rd in the head-to-head standings by GolfStat. The Seminoles were ranked as high as 24th nationally during the season in the NGCA/Golf World poll.

RANKING CAROLINE WESTRUP

Sophomore All-American **Caroline Westrup** finished her second season as a Seminole ranked third nationally by GolfWeek Magazine and sixth nationally in the final head-to-head individual standings by GolfStat. The No. 3 national individual ranking is the highest final national ranking ever achieved by a Seminole golfer.

SEMINOLES FINISH IN THIRD PLACE AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

All-American Caroline Westrup finished in second place in the individual standings and led the Seminoles to a third place finish in the team standings at the 19th Annual Atlantic Coast Conference Championship at the Carmel Country Club. Westrup tied the school record for the highest individual finish by a Florida State player in the ACC Championship in leading the Seminoles to their highest finish in the event since they also finished third in the team standings in 2001. Duke, the No. 1 ranked team in women's collegiate golf, won its unprecedented 12th consecutive conference championship as it outdistance second-place Wake Forest by 35 strokes and third-place Florida State by 40 strokes.

SEMINOLES PLAY WELL IN NCAA EAST REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in a tie for 11th place in the team standings **a** the 2007 NCAA East Regional Championship - three places and only eight strokes behind eighth place Louisville - and narrowly missed advancing to the NCAA Championship. The Seminoles began the final round 14 strokes out of the chase for the championship and played well enough to put themselves in position to qualify for the final weekend of play. The Seminoles were within five strokes of the eighth position and in 11th place during the round. American Caroline Westrup shot a two-under par 70 in the final round, finished with a career-best eight-under par 208 and advanced as an individual to the championship finals.

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES IN THE TOP 10

Florida State earned seven top-10 team finishes during the fall 2006 and spring 2007 seasons combined. It marked the second consecutive year the Seminoles had earned seven top-10 team finishes. In addition to their seven top-10 team finishes in traditional tournament formants, the Seminoles finished in seventh place in the NGCA Match-Play Championship during the fall of 2006.

INDIVIDUAL SEMINOLES FINISH WELL IN 2006-07

THREE SEMINOLES EARN BACHELOR'S DEGREES

Three Seminoles – Jaclyn Burch in sport management, Kayla Shaul in marketing and Michelle Steakin in communication studies – earned their bachelor's degrees from Florida State University following the 2006-07 season.

WESTKUP EAKING ALL-AIVIEKIUA HUNUKS

Caroline Westrup earned All-America First-Team honors from the National Golf Coaches' Association and GolfWeek Magazine for her performance during her sophomore season. She finished the season ranked third in the GolfWeek / Sagarin power rankings and ranked sixth in the nation in the GolfStat head-to-head statistics. Westrup (Ahus, Sweden) finished her sophomore season with a career-low 72.40 stroke average in 11 events. Westrup earned All-America First-Team and All-ACC in both 2006 and 2007. She is the first golfer in school history to earn All-America First-Team honors twice during her career and the first golfer in school history to earn All-ACC honors during the first two years of her career. She finished in a career-best tied for 11th place at the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championship at LPGA International in Daytona Beach, Fla. in May. Her finish in the 2007 national tournament ranks as the highest finish for a Seminole individual in the NCAA Championship finals. Westrup has earned 12 career top-five individual finishes with five top-five finishes as a sophomore. As a sophomore, she finished first at the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge, tied for first at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational, second at the Cougar Classic, second at the ACC Championship, third at the Lady Gator Invitational, tied for third at the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic and tied for fifth at the NCAA East Regional Championship.

WESTRUP EARNS ALL-ACC HONORS

Sophomore All-America ACC selection Caroline Westrup was named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference women's golf team in a vote by the league's nine head coaches on May 7. It marked Westrup's second consecutive selection to the all-conference team for the Seminole sophomore. Westrup is only the third player in Florida State women's golf history to earn All-ACC honors multiple times in her career and the first in school history to earn the honor as both a freshman and a sophomore. Only Karen Stupples (1994 and 1995) and Kristin Tamulis (2001, 2002 and 2003) have earned the honor more than once as Seminoles with Tamulis as the schools only three-time All-ACC honoree. Both Stupples and Tamulis are enjoying professional careers on the LPGA Tour. Stupples won the 2004 British Open.

WESTRUP NAMED MID-SEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

National Player of the Year candidate and All-ACC selection Caroline Westrup was named the Mid-Season Player of the Year by *Golf World* Magazine in January as the publication handed out its mid-season awards. At the time of the announcement, Westrup had recently won the individual title at the Women's World Amateur Team Championship and was ranked as the nation's third best golfer with a scoring rating at 70.80.

WESTRUP WINS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Sophomore All-America candidate and ACC selection Caroline Westrup finished with an eight-under par score of 280 to claim the individual world title at the Women's Golf World Amateur Team Championship as competition in the event came to a close Oct. 21, 2006. Westrup made up four strokes and added two additional strokes during the final round to win the individual championship by two strokes over Rikako Morita of Japan. Westrup shot a 69 as compared to Morita's 75 over the final 18 holes to win the individual championship 280-282. Westrup's play in the final round helped Sweden pull into a tie for first in the individual standings with South Africa though the four rounds of regulation play. Sweden defeated South Africa by four strokes in the fourth round to move up from second and into a tie for first place in the team standings. Westrup was strong and confident over the last 18 holes of the individual race on the De Zalze Golf Course. She was two-over with two birdies on the front nine and one over with two birdies and one bogie on the back nine. Westrup was four-under after 16 holes and three strokes up on Morita when the Japanese golfer finished her round with a six-under par score of 282. Westrup finished her final three holes at one-over with a bogie on the 16th hole and birdies on the final two holes to win the championship.

WESTKUP KANNS NU. I NATIONALLY

Sophomore All-American **Caroline Westrup** ranked first in the nation in final round score with a mark of 70.80. In 11 events, she cared scores of 71 or better seven times in her final round of an event.

WESTRUP LEADS SEMINOLES IN SCORING AVERAGE

Sophomore All-American **Caroline Westrup** finished the 2006-07 season with a career-low 72.41 stroke average in 32 rounds during 11 tournaments. Her scoring average is the lowest by a Seminole golfer since prior to the 1993-94 season. Her average is the first average below 73.00 strokes per round since at least the 1993-94 season.

BRUMMETT A DRIVING FORCE FOR FLORIDA STATE

Junior Whitney Brummett (Eureka, Mo.) was driving force behind Florida State earning its way into NCAA Regional play for a second consecutive season in 2007. She finished second on the team with a career-low 76.73 scoring average. Her best outing of the season came at the Lady Gator Invitational when she finished in a tie for 16th place with a 223 tournament score and an average of 74.3 strokes per round. Brummett also played well at the NCAA East Regional Championship for the second consecutive season as she finished with an 11-over par score of 227 to help the Seminoles finish in a tie for 11th place in the team standings. She played well in the first (75) and third rounds (72) as the Seminoles finished with their two best team scores in those rounds. Brummett's best single-round score of the season (72) came in the third round of the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic and in the third round of the NCAA East Regional Championship. She finished the season well as she had 15 of her 18 single round scores counted toward the team score including 11 straight over the course of five different tournaments.

SHAUL CLOSES OUT BEST SEASON AND FSU CAREER

Senior **Kayla Shaul** (Cumming, Ga.), who developed into one of the Seminoles' top golfers during her two-year Seminole career, played the best golf of her Florida State career at the 2007 NCAA East Regional. She established career-best scores for a single round (69 in the third round), 36-hole score (148), gross tournament score (217) and tournament score vs. par (+1) and she finished in a tie for 25th place in the individual standings. Her play helped the Seminoles finish in the top half of the toughest of the three NCAA regionals in 2007. Shaul finished as the Seminoles' leading golfer and played as the team's No. 2 player in the second and third rounds of the event. Shaul closed the event and her collegiate career with three consecutive birdies on holes 16, 17 and 18 at the LSU University Club in Baton Rouge.

COUSART ENJOYS BEST SEASON AS A SEMINOLE

Sophomore **Lauren Cousart** (Athens, Ga.) averaged a singleseason career–best 7.81 strokes per round during her second season as a Seminole. She played her best during the spring of 2007 as she competed in six of the Seminoles' seven events including her first ACC Championship and her first NCAA Regional championship. Cousart progressively improved her game and played her best golf of the season at the most important time – in the postseason. She averaged 74.50 strokes in her final two events of the spring (ACC Championship and NCAA East Regional Championship) after averaging 78.91 strokes during the first four events of the season. She played well in the ACC Championship as she finished in a tie for 15^{th} place in a 231 score for the three-round event with her action highlighted by identical scores of 76 in the second and third rounds to help her to the second top 15 finish of her career.

COUSART EARNS FIRST CAREER TOP-10

Sophomore **Lauren Cousart** earned the first top-10 individual finish of her career as she finished in a tie for seventh at the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge. She was one of five Seminoles to finish in the top 10 of the individual standings as Florida State earned their second team title in 2006-07.

BURCH CLOSES OUT STELLAR CAREER

Jaclyn Burch (Satellite Beach, Fla.), who earned four varsity letters for the Seminoles during her career, played in 37 career events and 110 total rounds during her Seminole career. She earned All-ACC honors in 2005 as one of the top 12 golfers in the nation's top conference for women's golf and is one of only four sophomores in school history to earn All-ACC honors joining All-America Caroline Westrup (2007), Caroline Larsson (2004) and All-America Kristin Tamulis (2001). Burch helped lead the Seminoles to two NCAA Championship appearances, two top-20 national finishes and three NCAA Regional Championship appearances while earning three top-five career finishes. She finished in a tie for second at the spring 2006 Ryder/Florida Championship, in a tie for fifth at the spring 2005 Lady Gamecock Invitational and in a tie for fifth at the fall 2005 Chrysler Challenge. During her career she earned three top-five, three top-10, seven top-15, 11 top-20 and 14 top-25 finishes. She was also an academic standout as she was named to the National Golf Coaches Association Division I Scholar Athlete team in 2006.

WRIGHT PLAYS BEST GOLF OF HER CAREER

Junior **Whitney Wright** (Rockingham, N.C) enjoyed the best year of her career as she averaged a career-low 78.46 strokes in nine events as a junior. She shaved nearly 1.5 strokes per round from her scoring average during her freshman and sophomore seasons. Wright carded her career-low round of 71 while earning the second top-10 finish of her career (tied for fourth) in the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge in Feb. of 2007. She finished in a tie for 18th place at the 2007 ACC Championship to mark the second top-20 conference championship finish of her career.

AGINE W EAKING FLATTING THVIE AS A FRESHIVIAIN

Freshman Lacev Agnew (Jonesboro, Ga.) played in three events in her first season as a Seminole - the Northrop Grumann Regional Challenge; the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge and the Lady Gator Invitational - as a member of the Seminoles' starting line-up. She helped the Seminoles to the championship of the Chrysler Challenge as she finished in sixth place in the individual standings. Agnew carded career-best scores for single-round (73 in the first round), 36-holes (149) and three-round tournament (228) while earning the best finish (sixth) and first top-10 placing of her career in the Chrysler Challenge. She was in first place in the event (one place ahead of All-American Caroline Westrup) after carding her career-low of 73 in the first round and helped the Seminoles to an eighth place finish in the Lady Gator Invitational. Agnew was Florida State's second highest individual finisher at the Northrop Grumann Challenge and the Seminoles' third highest finisher at the Chrysler Challenge.

GONZALEZ GETS INTO THE ACT AS A SOPHOMORE

Sophomore **Erica Gonzalez** (Davie, Fla.) played in a career-high four varsity events as a sophomore. She played in one event during the fall of 2006 – the Cougar Classic – and helped the Seminoles to the team championship. At the Cougar Classic she established career-best statistics for single-round score (75 in the first round), 36-hole score (152), three-round gross tournament score (231) and three-round tournament score vs. par (+15). Gonzalez then played in a single-season career-high three tournaments and earned her way into the Seminoles' starting line-up at the season-opening Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge. She earned her careerbest individual finish at the Chrysler Challenge as she finished in a tie for 30^{th} in the individual standings

...All-American **Caroline Westrup** finished as Florida State's top golfer in 10 of the Seminoles' 11 events this year. The only event in which she did not top the Seminoles' leader board was a the Auburn Tiger Derby when she was forced to withdraw after the first round because of an illness;

...All-American **Caroline Westrup** was a total of +30 strokes over par in the 32 rounds she has played this year. She finished three events under par and was more than eight strokes over par in only one of the eight events she completed this year;

...Junior **Whitney Wright** is one of only two Seminoles who played in the Seminoles' starting line-up in each of Florida State's seven events of the spring 2007 season. She was joined by Caroline Larsson as the only seven-event starter this spring;

...Junior **Whitney Brummett** has played in 29 of 30 events during her career as a Seminole. She missed playing in the first event of her career – the spring 2007 Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge;

...Sophomore **Lauren Cousart** played in more than twice as many events and averaged nearly four strokes fewer this season as compared to her freshman season. She played in three events and averaged 81.78 strokes as a freshman and played in seven events and averaged 77.81 stokes as a sophomore.

FLUKIDA STATE GULF AND ACADEMIC SUCCESS

The Florida State women's golf team earned a cumulative grade point average of 2.362 during the fall 2006 and spring 2007 academic semesters while ranking among the nation's top 25 teams in the same competition seasons. **Caroline Westrup**, one of the top candidates for National Player of the Year honors, holds a 3.65 grade for her academic career. She earned Dean's List honors during the fall and a perfect 4.0 GPA in sport management during the spring semester. Junior **Whitney Brummett** earned a perfect 4.0 during the fall semester and better than a 3.5 during the spring semester in her major of political science.

WOMEN'S GOLF TEAM EARNS DIRECTOR'S CUP

For the sixth consecutive year the Seminole Women's Golf Team was honored with the Director's Cup at the annual Golden 'Nole Banquet at the University Center Club in April of 2007. The banquet honors athletes from each of the Seminoles' 19 intercollegiate sports for their hard work and dedication to the athletics program and their service to the community. The Director's Cup was established during the 1996-1997 academic year by Athletics Director Dave Hart to promote athletes involvement in the community. The golf team received this award as a form of recognition for their countless volunteer hours at the Dick Howser Center for Childhood Services in Tallahassee throughout the academic year. The women's golf team also won the award in 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006.

ANDERSON AND YOUNG AT PGA CHAMPIONSHIP

Junior Ashleigh Anderson and sophomore Sara Young played in the 21st Annual PGA Minority Collegiate Golf Championship at the PGA Golf Club in Port St. Lucie, Fla., May 11-13. Anderson, a junior and two-year member of the Seminoles' golf team, has played in two events during her Seminole career. Young, a sophomore who earned a varsity letter as a member of the Seminoles' golf team in 2006, has played in three events during her career including the Florida State hosted Chrysler Challenge during the fall of 2005. Young finished in second place in the women's individual division of the event. She finished tied for first with Georgette Rollo of Texas Southern but lost on the first playoff hole as Rollo birdied and Young pared the only hole the pair needed to play in the extra session of golf to determine the winner. Anderson played her best golf o the final day of the event as she carded an 84. She finished in sixth place in the standings with a 263 total for the 54-hole event.
