
The Florida State University is a state-funded, fully accredited coeducational, comprehensive research institution with an international reputation in the sciences and humanities. It is one of the top 50 public universities in the nation, according to U.S. News & World Report's "America's Best Colleges."

Florida State was established as the Seminary West of the Suwannee by an act of the Florida Legislature in 1851 and first offered instruction at the postsecondary level in 1857. Its Tallahassee campus has been the site of an institution of higher education longer than any other site in the state.

With 16 colleges, students may take courses of study leading to a baccalaureate degree in 102 programs, to a master's or advanced master's degree in 118 programs, to a specialist degree in 25 programs, to a doctoral degree in 75 program or to a professional degree in two programs.

Florida State has the No. 1 ranked criminology and criminal justice program in the nation. It is located a mere four blocks from the state Capitol, which affords students from many academic disciplines opportunities for employment or internships with legislators and state agencies. FSU is home to the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory, the largest and highest-powered magnet laboratory in the world.

Florida State has more than 450 recognized student organizations that allow students to find their own niche.





THIS IS TRUCKESSEE

Seminole Athletics Touts ...

- » Former football standout Myron Rolle became the second Florida State student-athlete in the past five years to earn the Rhodes Scholarship one of the oldest and most prestigious awards for international study. Rolle was the first prominent college football to earn the Rhodes Scholarship in nearly 25 years
- » Over the past 17 years over \$500,000 in postgraduate money has been awarded to FSU student-athletes, as well as numerous other academic honors and awards

- » In the spring 2011 semester, 228 Seminole student-athletes achieved a 3.0 grade point average or better. In all, nine of 17 FSU athletic teams posted a 3.0 GPA or better
- » A total of 14 student-athletes posted a perfect 4.0 GPA, while 126 student-athletes earned Dean's List honors with a 3.5 GPA or higher.
- » The Athletic Department posted a cumulative GPA of 2.91 following the 2010-11 athletic year.

ABOUT STUDENT SERVICES

The Office of Student Services strives to establish a commitment to the total growth and development of each student-athlete. Through the N.O.L.E.S. program (New Opportunities for Leadership, Education & Service), an administrative commitment to academics and athletic excellence, as well as to personal development, these efforts are supported with programs and services in personal, career, and leadership development.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Fostering the development of personal growth is a fundamental component of the N.O.L.E.S. program. This support program ensures that the student-athletes will be provided with opportunities to focus on personal growth areas such as values clarification, goal setting, fiscal planning, decision-making and personal responsibility. Programming focuses on helping the student-athletes develop a healthy lifestyle while they are at Florida State University and habits that will benefit them throughout their lives.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Preparing for life after college is a major focus of the N.O.L.E.S. program. The program is designed to work in cooperation with Florida State's Career Center to acquaint students with the job search process, provide networking opportunities and ultimately assist with job placement. The program places a priority on the development of the total person, with the goal of developing individuals who will have rewarding and productive lifestyles after they leave Florida State University.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Serving the community is the focus of the Seminole Spirit program. Student-athletes are challenged to give service to our community and individuals who are in need. With a clearly defined program of service, student-athletes are given the opportunity to develop a lifelong commitment to volunteerism. Over the years, our commitment to community service has grown leaps and bounds. During the 2006-2007, 2007-2008 and 2009-10 academic school year, the Florida State University department of athletics was recognized by the National Consortium for Academics and Sports for having one of the most successful outreach and community service programs in the nation, in which Seminole Student-Athletes impacted the lives of over 150,000 youth. During the 2010-11 academic year, Florida State's student-athletes performed almost 6,000 hours of community service as a group.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

The Florida State University Department of Athletics is committed to developing programs of excellence that foster leadership development. Currently, the Office of Student Services offers three leadership programs to our student-athletes. The Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) has been in place at Florida State for over fifteen years and is a

fantastic group of motivated student-athletes. The SAAC is made up of 42 student-athletes, with at least two representing every sports team and the spirit groups. James Ramsey from Baseball, Vice President Margo Zwerling from Track and Field and Secretary Jacob Brooks from Cross Country.



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Adam Ross joined the Florida State strength and conditioning staff in February 2011 and is responsible for the design and implementation of the strength and speed programs for the Seminoles' baseball and women's golf teams.

A native of Spruce Head, Maine, he graduated from the University of Southern Maine in 2008 where he was a pitcher for the baseball team, a senior captain, a William B. Wise scholar-athlete and a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. He received his degree in Sports Medicine and interned with Mike Boyle Strength and Conditioning, working with high school, college and elite level professional athletes. Prior to joining the FSU staff, Ross was a graduate assistant instructor in the department of Health, Human Performance and Recreation at Baylor and worked with a variety of teams before earning his master's in Exercise Physiology with an emphasis in strength and conditioning.

Ross spent the 2010 season working in the Houston Astros' organization as the strength and conditioning coach with their AA affiliate in Corpus Christi, Texas. He was mentored by Dr. Gene Coleman, the first strength coach in Major League Baseball, and was responsible for the in-season program as well as assisting the athletic trainer with rehabilitation.

He is a certified strength and conditioning specialist through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA).



ATHETIC TRAINING



Eunice Hernández has served an assistant athletic trainer for Florida State University since September of 2003. Currently, she is the head athletic trainer with the Women's Softball and Women's Golf programs. From 2003 until 2006 she served as the head athletic trainer for the Women's and Men's Track and Field and Cross Country programs. During that time, she garnered two Outdoor Track and Field national titles (2006 & 2007), three East Region titles, four ACC Indoor titles, and three ACC outdoor titles with the men's team. Before leaving the track program, Ms. Hernández was involved in facility development for the athletic training room housed in the Mike Long Track fieldhouse.

In the 2007-2008 season, Ms. Hernández worked with the Women's Soccer program which advanced to the Finals of the Women's College Cup for the first time in school history.

In 2008, Ms. Hernández made the transition to the softball program. In her 3 seasons with the softball team, they have earned consecutive bids to the NCAA Softball Regional tournament, playing host for the 2009 season. In the 2011 season, the softball team won the ACC Softball Tournament having last won it in 2004.

WHAT IS NCAA COMPLIANCE?

Our office is dedicated to providing educational programs and interpretive support to ensure that all individuals involved with the athletics program understand and adhere to the University's compliance expectations. It is the goal of the compliance program to place the University in a proactive position by educating, overseeing and monitoring the intercollegiate athletics program and maintaining a positive compliance environment. Some of the areas that the office is responsible for are Amateurism, Coaching Limits, Eligibility, Recruiting, Financial Aid, Awards and Benefits and Playing and Practice Seasons.

The Compliance Office is located on the Fourth Floor of the Moore Athletic Center and is staffed by the Associate Athletic Director for Compliance, two Assistant Athletic Directors, two Directors of Compliance and two Graduate Assistants. We welcome any questions or concerns that you may have regarding the NCAA or ACC regulations in relation to FSU student-athletes or athletics programs.

DON VELLER SEMINOLE GOLF COURSE AND CLUB

The par 73, 18-hole championship golf course recently underwent a 1.4 Million-Dollar renovation and reopened September of 2004. The spectacular changes modernized the course with 18 brand new USGA greens featuring the state of the art ultradwarf turf called TiffEagle. The architect for the project was Robert C. Walker of Atlantic Beach, FL. Mr. Walker was the former lead architect for Arnold Palmer Golf Design.

KILLEARN COUNTRY CLUB AND INN

The site of 21 PGA Tour and four LPGA Tour tournaments, Killearn Country Club's three nine-hole layouts offers a challenging yet fun golf experience. Killearn's three nine-hole course are played in three eighteen hole combinations. These courses are home to several championship events each year and have hosted the PGA Classic and the Sprint Central.

GOLDEN EAGLE COUNTRY CLUB

Golden Eagle Country Club combines gracious Southern Living and championship golf for those who expect the best. Golden Eagle's foremost attraction is its 18-hole golf course, designed by world renowned golf course architect Tom Fazio. It was rated "the most challenging course in Florida" by the United States Golf Association just six months after opening in December 1986. Golfweek Magazine has ranked Golden Eagle among the top 50 real-estate development courses in the Southeast.

CAPITAL CITY COUNTRY CLUB

Capital City Country Club is the oldest and most prestigious private club in Tallahassee. The club is nestled among rolling hills and ancient oak trees. The rolling, tree-lined 6,502 yard 18-hole golf course is as challenging as it is breathtaking. Nine holes of the original design ware carved out by famed golf course architect A.W. Tillinghast who designed such American classics as Winged Foot and Medinah.

SOUTHWOOD GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

SouthWood Golf Club opened its 18-hole golf course in 2003 to the delight of golfers in Tallahassee. The well-planned course was immediately one of the premier golf facilities in the Florida Panhandle and one of the nation's heralded new golf courses. SouthWood was the only club in Florida to be ranked as one of "America's Best New Courses" by Golf Digest.



FSU FACILITIES

The Dave Middleton Golf Complex and the Don Veller Seminole Golf Course are home to the PGA Golf Management Program, which is one of only a few programs in the country that is accredited by the Professional Golfers Association of America. A 27,000-square-foot clubhouse, the Dave Middleton Golf Complex boasts private technologically advanced Wi-Fi classrooms, study and teaching labs, an internship library, a fully equipped club repair room, a pro shop, locker rooms and the Renegade Grill. The \$7 million facility is a two-building complex, which also includes a multi-directional driving range, a video analysis instructional center with hitting bays for inclement weather, chipping and putting greens, as well as locker rooms, a team lounge, auditorium and a fitness facility.

The golf course was renovated in 2004 with the reconstruction of al 18 greens complexes, tee boxes and the state-of-the-art TiffEagle Turf was installed on all the putting surfaces. Each year the facility hosts over 60,000 rounds of golf. The golf course was recently recognized as one of the top 10 golf courses in the country by the National Golf Foundation for customer loyalty and satisfaction.



A SOLD YEAR FOR WOMEN'S GOLF

The Florida State women's golf team played in its sixth consecutive NCAA Championship tournament, finished its season ranked No. 29 in both of the major polls by GolfStat and GolfWeek Magazine and finished in fifth place in the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship under first year head coach Amy Bond. The Seminoles finished in a tie for eighth place in the team standings at the NCAA East Regional Championship and were represented in the NCAA Championship finals by sophomore Jessica Negron. Negron finished in a tie for 45th place in the individual standings at the championship finals.

SALINAS EARNS HONORABLE MENTION ALL-AMERICAN HONORS
Junior Maria Salinas earned All-American Honorable Mention honors
as selected by the editors of GolfWeek Magazine. It marked the
first time in her career she earned All-American honors as she
averaged a career low and team leading 74.00 strokes in 27 rounds
in nine tournaments. Salinas was one of 20 players selected to earn
honorable mention honors following the selection of the 10 member
All-American First, Second and Third team selections. She was one
of nine players from the ACC to earn All-American honors, coming
from the conference generally recognized as the top conference for
women's golf in the nation.

SEMINOLES' WIN 10TH CONSECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S CUP

The Seminole women's golf team won its' 10th consecutive Athletic Director's Cup for Service at the annual Golden Nole Banquet in 2011. The Athletic Director's Cup for Service is the most prestigious award and is presented annually to the Seminole student-athletes. It goes to the team that contributes the most service hours to the community over the course of the entire year.

NEGRON AND SALINAS HONERED BY NGCA

Florida State's Jessica Negron and Maria Salinas was honored for their performances at the NCAA East Regional Championships by earning regional All-American honors as voted on by the National Golf Coaches' Association of American (NGCA). Negron finished in a tie for third place and Salinas in a tie for sixth place at the NCAA East Regional Championship. With two selections to the all-region team, the Seminoles were tied with the most selections to the team with regional champion Alabama. Negron and Salinas helped Florida State finish in a tie for eighth place in the team standings of the regional championship and were defeated by Vanderbilt in a one hole playoff and did not advance to the NCAA Championship finals.

THOMSON WINS INDIVIDUAL MEDALIST HONORED AT LADY GATOR INVIATIONAL

Florida State University's Hannah Thomson finished in first place in the individual standings with the Seminole golf team finished in second place in team standings at play in the Lady Gator Invitational at the Mark Bostick Golf Course at the University of Florida. For Thomson it was her first career collegiate victory, she also had four consecutive top 20 individual finishes - tied for eighth at the Kinderlou Forest Challenge, first at the Lady Gator Invitational, tied for 16th at the Bryan National Collegiate and tied for sixth at the Liz Murphey. Hannah was Florida State's leading golfer in each its last four events.
