## **FSU SAND VOLLEYBALL FACTS**

### AN EMERGING SPORT

- Collegiate sand volleyball is an "emerging sport." It has 10 years to gain the minimum 40 sponsoring institutions for two years in a row required to be considered an NCAA championship sport. This season, sand volleyball has 30 participating institutions.
- Sand volleyball has four scholarships to divide among a roster of 15 players in 2013. The sport
  will add one scholarship each year for the next three years to eventually get to six divisible
  scholarships in 2015.
- Players will not wear the "traditional" sand volleyball uniform of a bikini. The AVCA concept calls for a two-piece uniform- shorts or briefs and a top, or a one-piece.

### THE RULES

- Each team competition is called a "dual" and will consist of five matches of pairs. The winning team will need to win three matches in a best-of-five format. The separate matches will be conducted as best-of-three set competitions, with rally scoring to 21 in the first two sets and to 15 in the third. Teams must win by at least two points in all cases.
- Sand volleyball differs from court volleyball in ways other than the numbers of players. No open hand tipping is allowed. The block touch is allowed as the first of three allowable contacts. Coaches may only speak to players or give any feedback during time-outs or in between sets. Finally, to mitigate the impact of the sun and wind, the players switch sides of the court every seven points in a 21 point set and every five points in a 15 point set. The court is smaller at 8' m x 8' m, while indoor is 9' m x 9' m.

### AT FLORIDA STATE

- Head Coach Danalee Corso was the first full-time sand volleyball coach in the country.
- FSU's inaugural sand volleyball team featured 16 players: nine sand-only players and seven players from the FSU indoor squad. The 2013 team has 22 players 15 sand-only players and seven players from the indoor team.
- If a player has an indoor volleyball scholarship, they can play sand volleyball, but a sand volleyball scholarship athlete cannot play on the indoor volleyball team.

### GAMEDAY IN TALLAHASSEE

- All competitions will be played at the sand volleyball courts, located north of the soccer and softball complex and between the track and field complex and the parking garage.
- Parking will be available in the lot across from the courts and in the adjacent parking garage.
- Spectators are encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs to the event, but there will also be eight sets of bleachers.
- No alcohol is permitted. No dogs are allowed. Tents behind the bleachers are permissible.



## **2013 SEASON PREVIEW**

After an undefeated regular season and a third-place finish at the first-ever National Championships, what does the Seminole sand volleyball squad have in store for an encore?

Heading into the inaugural collegiate sand volleyball season last year nobody knew what to expect from Florida State.

A popular sport on beaches on both coasts, sand volleyball became FSU's 20th sport in June 2011 and kicked off the initial campaign with a resounding 5-0 victory at UAB on March 2 in the first-ever official collegiate match.

From there, the Seminoles did a lot more winning, quickly proving that the landlocked school from Tallahassee will be force to be reckoned with as sand volleyball develops from a sport into a full-fledged NCAA program.

Led by a trio of All-Americans, Florida State cruised to a 15-0 record in the regular season before being one of four teams invited to the first AVCA Sand Volleyball National Championships.

"We had a fantastic first season last year and I'm confident we can improve even more," Florida State Head Coach Danalee Corso said. "We have the largest group in the country. We have a lot of depth and return a lot of sand experience. We return an All-American in Aurora Newgard as well as indoor All-American Fatma Yildirim and Jace Pardon, who finished third at the Pairs National Championship. We'll add a couple of other All-Americans from the indoor team, too.

"I feel much more prepared this year on and off the court. Our coaching staff has a year under our belts and we've been practicing on our five courts since Day 1. I expect us to be very successful again."

At the first-ever AVCA National Championships in Gulf Shores, Ala. last spring, the Seminoles placed third behind Long Beach State and Pepperdine. Additionally, freshman Jace Pardon and senior Jakaterina Stepanova made it to the semifinals of the national pairs tournament.

This season, FSU will be led by Pardon as well as All-American Aurora Davis (née Newgard) and national championship participants seniors Mallory Kiley and Fatma Yildirim, junior Jeassica McGregor and sophomores Stephanie Pelliteri and Sarah Wickstrom.

The Noles will actually have three All-Americans on the squad this spring. Joining

Davis, who was part of the inaugural 10-player AVCA sand volleyball All-America class last season, are indoor volleyball All-Americans Yildirim and Ashley Neff. Yildirim captured honorable mention honors, while Neff nabbed Third Team accolades following the 2012 indoor campaign.

FSU also returns sophomore Melanie Pavels, who played most of last season at the No. 3 pair position before an injury sidelined her for the National Championships and seniors Marija Milosavljevic and Amanda Saxton.

Milosavljevic was a three-year letterwinner on the FSU indoor squad, while Saxton has two years of indoor volleyball experience in addition to her experience on the sand squad last year.

Saxton, Kiley and Davis are all team captains this season.

The Seminoles will field the nation's largest team, bringing in a strong sevenplayer freshmen class in addition to four new members from the indoor squad.

FSU welcomes freshmen Julie Brown, Blyss Harkness, Kayla Joyce, Annie Montgomery, Nina Pellitteri, Katherine Plessy and Lexy Ryan as well as indoor veterans freshmen Sarah Burrington and Leah Mikesky, sophomore Katie Mosher and junior Olivera Medic.

Depth will not be an issue and Corso will have plenty options leading up to the AVCA National Championships May 3-5 in the Gulf Shores, Ala.



Jace Pardon advanced to the National Championships pairs semifinals last season and will look to lead the Seminoles this year.

The Seminoles will kick-off the 2013 season on March 3 with a Garnet and Gold Intersquad event at the FSU Sand Volleyball Complex.

Florida State's first matchup against outside competition will be a trip to Los Angeles to face USC and Loyola Marymount on March 10 in a Tri-Match before facing Long Beach State and UCLA the next day.

Three days later, the Seminoles will compete in a three-day event at the Chula Vista (Calif.) Tournament held at the U.S. Olympic Training Center.

On March 23, FSU will take on Gulf Coast State College for a dual match in Panama City Beach, Fla.

A week later, Florida State will wrap up the month of March by competing against UAB, Jacksonville and Stetson from March 29-30 in Jacksonville, Fla.

The Seminoles open April by meeting Georgia State, Tulane and ULM on April 6-7 in Atlanta, Ga.

From April 12-14, the Garnet and Gold will travel to Siesta Key, Fla. where they will face Webber International on the first day before competing in the Siesta Key Tournament the next two days.

Florida State will host a home tournament from April 20-21 where Georgia Southern, UAB and the College of Charleston will compete.

FSU will stay home the next weekend for an intersquad tune-up on April 27 before the National Championships.

# DANALEE CORSO





#### **HEAD COACH • 2ND SEASON • RECORD: 16-2**

After finishing with an undefeated regular season, placing third at the National Championships and collecting a nation's-best three individual All-America awards, the Florida State sand volleyball team is not expecting a drop off in Year Two.

That's because Danalee Corso is at the helm, and the former professional beach volleyball player and coach refuses to let off the accelerator. As one of the most respected teachers of the sport in the world, Corso continues to push the NCAA's latest emerging sport and the Seminoles to new heights.

FSU was at the forefront of sand volleyball's first season of collegiate competition in 2012. Florida State hired Corso as the nation's first full-time head coach in the summer of 2011 and she went to work building and preparing a championship caliber team. The results were impressive to say the least.

The Seminoles didn't lose a regular season dual match, sporting a 15-0 mark and a 72-3 overall record in pairs play in dual contests. Florida State also captured the team titles at Clash of Collegians, FSU Sand Tournament, UNF Invitational and the Fiesta at Siesta Key.

The Garnet & Gold won six pairs championships throughout the season and the top tandems of Jekaterina Stepanova and Jace Pardon and Aurora Newgard and Brittany Tiegs advanced to the semifinals and quarterfinals, respectively, of the first-ever AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships in Gulf Shores, Ala.

At the national tournament, Stepanova, Newgard and Tiegs earned three of the 10 individual All-America awards from the AVCA.

The Seminoles finished third at the National Championships, leaving the squad and Corso wanting more for the 2013 campaign.

FSU's success should come as no surprise since Corso has enjoyed a standout career as a player and coach. She is well-known throughout the beach volleyball circuit after a highly successful professional career both domestically and internationally.

Corso, a native of Honolulu, Hawaii, spent 13 seasons excelling on several professional tours, including the Women's Professional Volleyball Association, Fédération Internationale de Volleyball (FIVB), USA Volleyball, Beach Volleyball America and The Association of Volleyball Professionals

In 2004, Corso received a Brazilian Pro Beach Coaching Accreditation and helped coach the United States National Beach Volleyball Team from 2004-07 with a specific focus on the tandem of Rachel Wacholder and Tyra Turner. She



has also coached 2008 Summer Games Olympian Nicole Branagh as well as professionals Makare Wilson, Michelle More and Suzanne Stonebarger.

Following her national team stint, Corso became owner of Aloha Ball Club - a full-service beach volleyball school that offers classes and private lessons for amateurs and professionals as well as fitness training. She was also head coach of the Under-19 and Under-21 U.S. National Teams for men and women and head coach of the World University Championship men's and women's teams. She coached the Costa Rica Women's National Beach Team in 2009-10

Some of Corso's greatest playing achievements include finishing as one of the top 10 teams in the competitive USA Volleyball Pro Tour from 1994-97. On the AVP-USA Pro Beach Volleyball Tour, Corso guided her squad to top-8 tour finishes from 1999-2002. In 1998, her team finished first on the Switzerland Pro Beach Tour.

As a professional, Corso won five different events, including the 1995 Motherlode Open in Aspen, Colo., an international tournament in Three Lakes, Switzerland, in 1998, the 1998 Switzerland FIVB Satellite Tournament in Jona and two Norceca Tournaments in both San Juan, Puerto Rico and Mexico City in 2003.

Corso is a graduate of Loyola Marymount University, where she played indoor volleyball from 1989-92. She captained the team and was a first team All-West Coast Conference pick.

Corso and her husband Brian, who is an assistant coach on the FSU sand volleyball team, have two young children, Camryn and Asher.

#### ASSISTANT COACH BRIAN CORSO



A former professional beach and indoor volleyball player Brian Corso is married to FSU sand volleyball head coach Danalee Corso. He and his wife form a cohesive coaching tandem that enjoyed plenty of success in collegiate sand volleyball's initial season in 2012.

Florida State finished third at the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships and collected three individual All-America honors, while capturing a 15-0 dual match record in the regular season.

FSU pairs won six tournament championships and collected a 208-58-2 overall record. The tandems of Jekaterina Stepanova and Jace Pardon and Aurora Newgard and Brittany Tiegs advanced the semifinals and quarterfinals, respectively, at the ultra-competitive national championships. Stepanova, Newgard and Tiegs were named All-Americans as FSU had three of the nation's 10 award-winners.

Corso played collegiate indoor volleyball at San Diego State from 1995-99 and was an assistant coach with the University of San Diego in 2002-03. He played on the AVP Tour and was the head coach of the L.A. College's women's volleyball team in 2009 in addition to his career as a beach volleyball fitness and conditioning specialist since 2003.

He also coached the Costa Rican junior national squad from 2006-08 and was a USA junior national beach team coach during that same span.

He and Danalee are the proud parents of two young children, Camryn and Asher.

### DIRECTOR OF VOLLEYBALL CHRIS POOLE



As Florida State's Director of Volleyball, Seminoles' indoor volleyball head coach Chris Poole has been in charge of developing FSU's newest sport. Poole has been very successful at the helm of the FSU indoor volleyball program since coming to Florida State in 2008.

He has led the Garnet & Gold indoor volleyball team to unprecedented heights, including the Seminoles' and the ACC's first-ever trip to the NCAA Final Four in 2011 and back-to-back seasons with at least 28 wins in 2011 and 2012.

In 2012, the Seminoles won their third Atlantic Coast Conference title under Poole and the program's fourth overall. Florida State finished with a remarkable 28-4 overall record, earning back-to-back conference crowns for the first time in the ACC since Maryland achieved the feat in 2003 and 2004.

The Seminoles tied a school record with the 2011 squad by defeating five AVCA Top 25 opponents and are one of just three teams (Southern California, Western Kentucky) who have garnered 28 wins or better in the last two seasons (2011 and 2012).

Poole has a 130-34 overall record with the Noles, including a 31-3 campaign in 2009.

#### VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT TAYLOR IRVIN



Taylor Irvin enters her second season on Danalee Corso's staff and her first as a volunteer assistant coach after serving as a graduate assistant during FSU inaugural collegiate sand volleyball season last season.

Irvin helped lead the team to an undefeated 15-0 regular season dual match record and a third-place finish at the first-ever AVCA National Championships.

A native of Chicago, III., Irvin played club volleyball at Sports Performance Volleyball Club where she says said she learned most of her coaching philosophy and technique.

She was a four-year member of the South Alabama volleyball team and the President of the Student Athletic Advising Committee at South Alabama from 2008-2010. Irvin made the Sunbelt Academic Honor Roll at South Alabama and also won the South Alabama Spirit Award.

Irvin coached club at Mobile Storm Volleyball in Mobile, Ala., from 2007-2010 and was a seventh grade coach at St. Paul's Episcopal School in Mobile, Ala. in 2010 and a volunteer assistant for their varsity team which won state.



Florida State swept the Blazers, 5-0, only losing one set in the No. 4 matchup.

"We made history today," Florida State head coach Danalee Corso said. "We won the first ever collegiate sand volleyball match. It was awesome. It was great to share it with our team. Everyone felt it. It's something we can look back on and be proud of."

Five dual matches and three exhibitions were played at UAB's newly completed sand volleyball facility located next to West Campus Field in Birmingham.

FSU's No. 1 team of Brittany Tiegs and Aurora Newgard defeated Heather Thomas and Kisten Gallagher, 21-10, 21-12. Tiegs had 13 kills and Newgard recorded a double-double with 10 kills and 14 digs.

The No. 2 tandem of Kate Stepanova (13 kills) and Jace Pardon (14 kills) downed Sarah Secley and Alison Woods, 21-16, 21-18.

FSU's No. 3 pair of Visnja Djurdjevic and Melanie Pavels handled Kate Morrell and Ally Slaughter, 21-15, 21-11. Pavels had 10 kills and 14 digs.

In the "Silver" final, Jeassica McGregor and Caitlin Haworth breezed past USC's Megan Thornberry and Katie Duddridge, 21-13, 21-19. It was their first tournament playing together. The pair went 7-0 over two days.

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -** The Florida State sand volleyball team kept its undefeated streak intact on March 29 at the Seminole Sand Volleyball Complex, capturing back-to-back 4-1 victories over Hawai'i in an afternoon doubleheader

The Seminoles improved to 11-0 in dual matches in the inaugural collegiate sand volleyball season, and have all but locked up one of four spots at the AVCA National Championships, which will be held from April 27-29 in Gulf Shores, Fla.

Senior Jekateina Stepanova and freshman Jace Pardon defeated Hawai'i's Larissa Nordyke and Ashley Lee, 21-17, 21-17, on Court 2 and senior Mallory Kiley and freshman Sarah Wickstrom cruised past the Rainbow Wahine's Mita Uiato and Elizabeth Blake, 21-9, 21-14.

Freshman Melanie Pavels and senior Visnja Djurdjevic put the Seminoles ahead 3-0 to clinch the win on Court 3 after Pavels delivered her third ace of the match to give the duo a 22-20, 21-18 win. Pavels also had the match-clinching point in the second end of the doubleheader.

Graduate student Caitlin Haworth and Jeassica McGregor edged out a three-set win on Court 4 in Match 1, defeating Monica Stauber and Alex Griffiths, 21-6, 17-21, 16-14. McGregor tallied a staggering 32 digs and 18 kills in the match.

Newgard and Tiegs fell to Hawai'i's No. 1 team of Elizabeth Stoltzman and Emily Hartong, 17-21, 21-17, 15-12.

FSU showed no rust in the second match after a 20-mintue break. The Seminoles won in straight sets on four of five courts. Only Newgard and Tiegs dropped a match, losing to Jane Croson and Ashley Lee, 21-18, 21-19 on Court 2

Stepanova and Pardon moved up to the No. 1 Court for the second match where they dismantled Stoltzman and Hartong, 21-9, 21-11.

Haworth and McGregor improved to 9-0 as team with their two wins on Thursday. The pair moved up from Court 5 to Court 4 against the 'Bows.

Those are playing conditions FSU has become accustomed to, however, and the Garnet and Gold didn't let the severe weather have an effect on their play.



### FSU TAKES TEAM TITLE, PLACES 2ND 8 3RD IN PAIRS



**JACKSONVILLE, Fla. -** The Florida State sand volleyball team ran away with the team title and grabbed second- and third-place finishes in the pairs tournament on April 1 at the UNF Sand Invitational presented by Chicago Pizza and Metro PCS at the Jacksonville Beach courts.

Junior Aurora Newgard and sophomore Brittany Tiegs lost a hard-fought, three-set battle to Hawaii's Jane Croson and Ashley Lee, 21-16, 19-21, 15-11, in the pairs championship. The FSU duo nearly won its third consecutive tournament pairs title, and now has two runner-up placements and two victories in four tournaments this season.

Tiegs and Newgard defeated Jacksonville's top duo in the semifinals, 23-21, 21-16. The pair went 6-1-1 on the weekend.

Tiegs and Newgard, the fifth-seed in the gold bracket, were joined in the semifinals by senior Visnja Djurdjevic and freshman Melanie Pavels, the third seed.

Djurdjevic and Pavels won their first six matches on the weekend before falling to Croson and Lee, 21-12, 21-14, with the finals berth on the line.

Tiegs, Newgard, Djurdjevic and Pavels were all named to the all-tournament team.

The foursome likely would've been joined by Stepanova and freshman Jace Pardon if Stepanova hadn't sprained her left ankle during the first round of the bracket tournament. The pair had steamrolled the competition all weekend and was the gold No. 1 seed, but had to withdraw midway through the second set against Jacksonville after winning 21-9 in set one.

Senior Mallory Kiley and freshman Stephanie Pellitteri (11th-seed) placed sixth, pushing Djurdjevic and Pavels to three sets in the quarterfinals, while graduate student Caitlin Haworth and sophomore Jeassica McGregor took ninth. Haworth and McGregor (12th-seed) unfortunately drew their teammates, Tiegs and Newgard, in the first round, and fell, 21-11, 21-17.

### **SEMINOLES TAKE DOWN STETSON AND FAU**

**DELAND, Fla. -** The Florida State sand volleyball team improved to 13-0 in dual matches on the season on April 6 with a pair of 5-0 wins over Stetson and FAU at the Stetson Sand Volleyball Complex.

The Seminoles dropped only one set over 10 games in two dominating performances.

"We had a tough week of practice, so I'm happy with the results today," head coach Danalee Corso said. "Having us play tired this week was part of my plan. That's what we are going to have to do to win at Nationals in a few weeks. We played great today."

Junior Aurora Newgard and sophomore Brittany Tiegs, FSU's No. 1 duo, defeated Stetson's top squad of Julie Bassett and Kaley Melville, 21-13, 21-11, before cruising past the Owls' No. 1 duo, 21-18, 21-13.

Moving up to the No. 2 position in place of freshman Jace Pardon and senior Jekaterina Stepanova was the tandem of senior Visnja Djurdjevic and Melanie Pavels. The duo routed Stetson's second team, 21-14, 21-14, and FAU's two tandem, 21-18, 21-13.

Freshman Stephanie Pellitteri replaced Stepanova and paired with Pardon as FSU's third team. The pair defeated Stetson, 21-17, 21-14, and FAU, 21-4, 21-11, earning praise from Corso.

"Stephanie and Jace really stepped up today," Corso said. "That was a great win. They probably stepped up the most of anybody today because they haven't really played together."

Sophomore Jeassica McGregor and freshman Sarah Wickstrom had the closest call of the day, taking three sets to beat Stetson's Katie DiGirolamo and Stephanie Marin, 21-16, 19-21, 15-10, in the battle of No. 4's. The pair followed up the win by hammering FAU, 21-4, 21-8, on court five.

Graduate student Caitlin Haworth and senior Mallory Kiley picked up victories at No. 5 versus Stetson (21-10, 21-15) and at No. 4 against FSU (21-5, 21-8).





### SEMINOLES SWEEP COMPETITION AT SIESTA KEY



**SIESTA KEY, Fla.** - Led by junior Aurora Newgard's dominant performance, the Florida State sand volleyball team swept both brackets and won the team competition at the Fiesta on Siesta Key on April 14.

Newgard paired with sophomore Brittany Tiegs to capture first-place in the top-level "Fiesta" bracket, defeating teammates, senior Jekaterina Stepanova and freshman Jace Pardon, 28-16 in the final. Senior Mallory Kiley and graduate student Caitlin Haworth upset FSU's No. 3 team of senior Visnja Djurdjevic and freshman Melanie Pavels to take third-place.

It's the third pairs championship of the season for Newgard and Tiegs, who also won the FSU Sand Tournament and the USC Tournament in March.

"Everything clicked today," Newgard said. "Brittany and I played real well. We kept the ball low. In pool play, we kept almost every team under 10 points. We had a lot of energy. It's always kind of a bummer when you play your teammates in the final, but it also shows how well our team is playing - to have two teams in the finals. Hopefully we can take this momentum to Nationals in two weeks."

FSU sand volleyball head coach Danlee Corso described Newgard as an "All-World" performer for the Seminoles during the competition, hammering her jump serve and putting on a dazzling display with her passing and defense. She was also impressed with FSU's three tandems that played in the second division, "Siesta" bracket, which the Noles also took the first three places in.

Sophomore Jeassica McGregor and junior Fatma Yildirim didn't drop a match en route to grabbing the title. Junior Marija Milosavljevic teamed with the College of Charleston's Taeler Davis to finish second. Senior Amanda Saxton and junior Lacey Blackman took third.

The tournament featured 210 participants and 23 teams, one of the NCAA's largest events of the year and the largest sand volleyball competition in the country this year.

### FLORIDA STATE FINISHES DUAL SEASON 15-0

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -** The Florida State sand volleyball team wrapped up the regular season on Saturday at the Seminole Sand Volleyball Complex in familiar fashion.

FSU picked up a pair of 5-0 victories, dropping just one set, over UAB and FAU to finish 15-0 in dual matches in 2012.

Before the match, Florida State honored seniors Jekaterina Stepanova and Visnja Djurdjevic and graduate student Caitlin Haworth, who will cap their careers as Seminoles in Gulf Shores.

Stepanova teamed with freshman Jace Pardon at the No. 2 spot to easily pick up wins over UAB (21-13, 21-10) and FAU (21-10, 21-11). The pair is the No. 5 seed in the pairs portion of the national championship and has a sterling 37-6 record on the season, including a 13-0 mark in duals.

Djurdjevic paired with freshman Stephanie Pellitteri for the first time this season, and the duo grabbed straight set victories versus the Blazers (21-12, 21-7) and Owls (21-10, 21-10) on Court 3. Djurdjevic went 15-0 in dual matches this season.

Haworth and her partner, senior Mallory Kiley (who is expected to compete next year as a graduate student), may have been the competition's most dominant duo on Court 4, handling UAB's Ally Slaughter and Kate Morrell (21-10, 21-12) before annihilating FAU's Lauren Jones and Chandler Hatton (21-6, 21-12).

Florida State's No. 1 pair of junior Aurora Newgard and sophomore Brittany Tiegs improved to 45-6-1 on the season with victories over UAB's top tandem of Heather Thomas and Kirsten Gallagher (21-9, 21-10) and FAU's No. 1 team of Joanne Marras Tate and Alessia Pizzocheri (21-13, 21-12).

The only set FSU dropped on the day came on Court 5 against UAB. Junior Fatma Yilidirm and Jeassica McGregor lost the second set to the Blazers' Michele Simmons and Becca Howard, but won the match - 21-16, 17-21, 15-4. The FSU duo followed that match by hammering FAU's fifth squad, 21-4, 21-17.





### FSU BUILDS MOMENTUM ON DAY 1 OF NATIONALS

**GULF SHORES, Ala. -** At practice Florida State sand volleyball head coach Danalee Corso said great performances from her top two pairs on the first day of the Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championship would be key to provide the Seminoles with momentum heading into April 28's team championship.

The Garnet and Gold got just that out of the tandems of junior Aurora Newgard and sophomore Brittany Tiegs, and senior Jekaterina Stepanova and freshman Jace Pardon on April 27 on the beaches of Gulf Shores, Ala.

The Noles went a perfect 6-0 and won a trio of three-set battles during pool play of the 16-team pairs portion of the weekend. Stepanova and Pardon captured the No. 3 seed in Sunday's pairs championship by winning Pool D. Tiegs and Newgard grabbed the No. 4 seed by winning Pool A, including capturing the day's final match, an epic three-setter over Hawaii's No. 1 tandem of Jane Croson and Ashley Lee.

Most importantly, the exciting and successful first day will give FSU a strong push into the four-team double-elimination team championship that begins Saturday at 11 a.m. CT when first-seed Pepperdine takes on fourth-seed College of Charleston. The second-seeded Seminoles will face third-seed Long Beach State at 12 p.m. CT.

"This will give us momentum, but those two teams will be a little tired," Corso said. "Thankfully, we are very well conditioned. The goal is to become the first-ever collegiate sand volleyball national champions tomorrow."

Tiegs and Newgard dropped their first set to of the day to Long Beach State's Haleigh Hampton and Chelsea Cabrajac, 21-19, before cruising in the next two sets, 21-17, 15-8, to win. The Nole pair then blew past College of Charleston's Emily Shelton and Kelly Kolich, 21-10, 21-17.

Tiegs and Newgard had been looking to gain revenge against Croson and Lee since the Rainbow Wahine tandem downed the Seminole duo in three sets at the UNF Invitational pairs final on April 1.

Friday's match was another three-setter. After Tiegs and Newgard handedly grabbed the first set, 21-18, Croson and Lee outlasted the Garnet and Gold pair, 30-28, in set two. Trailing 13-9 in the final set, the FSU tandem dug deep, fought back to snag an emotional 16-14 to keep FSU undefeated on the day.

Pardon and Stepanova also had an impressive three-set victory over Hawaii of their own in their second match of the day. After routing UNF's Dagnija Medina and Emily Strack, 21-10, 21-17, the Seminole pair dropped its first set to the Rainbow Wahine team of Emily Hartong and Elizabeth Stoltzman, 21-19, but rallied to take the second set 21-14. The FSU tandem was down 13-11 in the third set, before scoring four straight points to win the match.

### FSU FINISHES THIRD AT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

**GULF SHORES**, Ala. - The Florida State sand volleyball team's quest to become the first collegiate sand volleyball champion came up short on April 28 at the hands of Long Beach State, as the Seminoles finished third on the beaches of Gulf Shores, Ala. at the inaugural Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Championships.

FSU dropped a pair of matches, 4-1 in the first round and 3-2 in the semifinals, to the 49ers. The Garnet & Gold downed College of Charleston 4-1 in the quarterfinals.

The Seminoles wrap up the season with a 16-2 dual match record.

FSU's top two tandems of junior Aurora Newgard and sophomore Brittany Tiegs and senior Jekaterina Stepanova and freshman Jace Pardon give Florida State another shot at a national championship in Sundays' 16-team single-elimination pairs tournament.

"I had very high expectations this season and the team exceeded them in terms of how hard they worked and how much they improved," Florida State head coach Danalee Corso said. "I knew these indoor players from the West Coast would close the gap on us, they just needed time in the sand. I don't think the team was expecting Long Beach State to improve this much. Congratulations to Long Beach and Pepperdine. I still think we've had a successful season. I definitely plan on challenging this team more next year so we are prepared for this national championship."

Stepanova and Pardon captured the third seed, while Tiegs and Newgard snagged the fourth seed in the pairs tournament. Both duos will play at 8 a.m. CT on Sunday with first round matches against 13-seed Kelly Kolich and Emily Shelton of College of Charleston and 14-seed Dagnija Medina and Emily Strack of UNF, respectively. The quarterfinals matches will be at 9 a.m., the semifinals will start at 11 a.m. and 11:45 a.m., and the championship will start at 1:30 p.m. All times are Eastern.

"There are a lot of good teams out here, so it's not going to be easy by any means," Corso said. "It's definitely possible to win. Our top two teams are very strong."

CBS Sports Network will televise portions of this weekend's competition in two hour-long specials. Part 1 of their coverage will air beginning on Wednesday, June 6 at 9 p.m. ET and Part 2 will begin airing on Wednesday, June 13, also at 9 p.m. ET.

After Pepperdine defeated Long Beach State to capture the first-ever sand national title, the inaugural 10-member class of All-Americans were announced, featuring FSU's Stepanova, Newgard and Tiegs.



### STEPANOVA, PARDON ADVANCE TO NATIONAL SEMIFINALS

**GULF SHORES, Ala.** - The Florida State sand volleyball team's inaugural season ended in the semifinals of the National Championships pairs tournament on April 29 on the beaches of Gulf Shores, Ala.

Senior Jekaterina Stepanova and freshman Jace Pardon lost in a hard-fought semifinal to Long Beach State's Caitlin Ledoux and Tara Roenicke, 21-19, 17-21, 15-8.

That same 49ers' team knocked junior Aurora Newgard and sophomore Brittany Tiegs out in the semifinals, 21-17, 21-16, earlier in the day.

The Seminoles wrap up the season with a 16-2 final record and a thirdplace team national championship finish on Saturday. Stepanova, Tiegs and Newgard all captured All-America awards, as well.

"Long Beach is a strong team," FSU head coach Danalee Corso said after the semifinals. "I think if we could've won that first set, it would've been a different match. It was a great match, and this weekend was a great tournament. I'm really proud of Jace and Kate, and I'm really proud of the whole team.

"I think it was great for everyone to be here. I talked about it the whole year - that these West Coast teams with the indoor players would get better as they learned how to play in the sand."

Stepanova and Pardon fought back with a dominant second set against 49ers that included back-to-back points from the 6-2 Riga, Lativia, native who scored a point on a back dump before an ace gave the Noles an early 8-4 lead that set the tone for the rest of the set.

Roenicke and Ledoux had just a little more left in the tank to advance to the finals in the third set, however

After winning set one, 21-17, Stepanova and Pardon were down 18-14 in the second set of the quarterfinals to USC's Kirby Burnham and Kelly Irvin before rallying to defeat the Trojan duo, 23-21, and advance to the semifinals. Stepanova had a powerful block to put the Seminoles ahead on a point before the Trojans hit the ball into the net to give the Garnet and Gold duo the set and the match.

The duo also routed UNF's Dagnija Medina and Emily Strack in the opening round 21-14, 21-13.

Newgard and Tiegs defeated College of Charleston's Emily Shelton and Kelly Kolich, 21-15, 21-16 in the first round.

Now the Seminoles will focus on next year. As the emerging NCAA sport continues to grow, Florida State has built strong foundation for the coming years.

# Dr. Eric J. Barron University President



Dr. Eric J. Barron became 14th president of The Florida State University on February 1, 2010.

He is a 1973 Florida State alumnus, with a bachelor's degree in geology. He earned master's and doctoral degrees in oceanography from the University of Miami.

Prior to assuming the Florida State presidency, he served as director of the National Center for Atmospheric Research in Boulder, Colo. From 2006-2008 Dr. Barron was dean of the Jackson School of

Geosciences at the University of Texas at Austin. At Pennsylvania State University from 1986 to 2006, he was professor of geosciences, director of the Earth System Science Center, director of the EMS Environment Institute, and finally dean of the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences.

Dr. Barron is a Fellow in the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the American Geophysical Union, the American Meteorological Society and the Geological Society of America. He has received many national awards as a scholar, researcher and distinguished lecturer, has published extensively, and has been editor or a member of the editorial boards of a dozen academic journals.

He has testified before Congress and has chaired numerous committees in service to the federal government, including the NASA Senior Review for the Earth Sciences in 2005. He has chaired committees and panels of the National Research Council since 1987 and currently chairs "An Ocean Infrastructure for U.S. Ocean Research in 2030."

A highly visible scientist, Barron is committed to the full spectrum of academic disciplines. He is an ardent supporter and advocate for the full spectrum of excellence in the arts and humanities, sciences, law, business and medicine.

A native of Lafayette, Ind., Barron and his wife, Molly, have two grown children and one granddaughter.

# Randy Spetman Director of Athletics



Florida State Director of Athletics Randy Spetman can rightfully look at his four years at the helm of the Seminole athletic program with great pride. In his three full seasons as the Seminoles AD, FSU qualified for NCAA postseason play in every sport every year with just one exception. This past athletic year FSU equaled its highest-ever Director's Cup finish placing fifth for the second time in three years. The Seminoles were also just one of two schools to finish ranked among the Top 25 in football, men's basketball and baseball. Six Seminole teams made it to the final four in their respective sports and the ACC named six of FSU's studentathlets of the top scholar-athlete of the year in their sport.

In 2010-11 Florida State athletics was the only Division I department in the NCAA to have all of its 19 sports participate in the NCAA postseason. It marked the second consecutive year that FSU sent every one of its athletic programs into NCAA postseason play. In addition, this past athletic year the FSU's men's basketball program won the ACC Tournament

Title for the first time in school history, as did the Seminole women's soccer team.

After being ranked 15th nationally in the Director's Cup following his first year, FSU earned its highest ever ranking in 2009-10 when the school finished fifth overall. In 2010-11 FSU was in the top 10 once again finishing ninth in the nation. These were the first top 10 finishes in school history and in each of the last seven years the Seminole athletic program has finished higher in the standings than at any other point in program history. The first ever top 10 finishes under Spetman are so impressive as this has been accomplished during a time when budgets are as constrained at Florida's universities as they have ever been in the modern era.

In 2011-12 Florida State had a banner athletic year under Spetman's guidance both on the field and in the classroom. There were more than 50 All-America honors earned by Seminole student-athletes this past year, a number that was surpassed only by the amount of athletes selected to All-ACC Academic Teams.

"This was a wonderful athletic year on so many levels. Finishing in the top 5 for the second time in three years, something only four programs with three straight top 10 finishes have done, speaks to the commitment and excellence of this entire department, our coaches and especially our student-athletes," said Spetman. "To finish in the top 5 for a second time in three years and inside the top 15 every year 1 have been at Florida State is an amazing accomplishment. We are very proud to be amongst this select group of athletic programs and 1 know our fans appreciate the success we have had across the board."

In 2011-12 Florida State was one of only two schools to have football play in a bowl game, the men's team make the NCAA Basketball tournament and the baseball team play in the College World Series. That blend of rare success has been the norm the last three years at Florida State under Spetman. FSU was one of only eight schools to have its football team play in a bowl game, its men's basketball team selected to the NCAA Tournament and its baseball team selected for the NCAA Championships in 2010-11. That came on the heels of 2009-10 when the Seminoles were one of only three universities in the country to appear in a bowl game, a NCAA men's basketball tournament and advance to the baseball College World Series.

The success Spetman has experienced at Florida State begins with excellence in the classroom. In November of 2008, football's Myron Rolle highlighted the academic year when he became the second Seminole student-athlete since 2006 to earn a Rhodes Scholarship - one of the oldest and most prestigious awards for international study. It was the first time in nearly 25 years a Rhodes Scholar was awarded to a prominent college football player. Rolle is the fourth Florida State student ever to be named a Rhodes Scholar.

In the last three years alone there have been 18 Seminoles named the ACC's top student-athlete in their sport, 13 student-athletes have been named CoSIOA Academic All-Americans, 25 have been named CoSIOA Academic All-District first team selections and well over 200 All-ACC Academic honors have been bestowed on FSU student-athletes.

The success FSU's student-athletes and coaches have achieved since Spetman's first full year on the job in 2009 is a credit to his leadership and direction for the department. In just four years, there have been more than 250 All-America honors earned by Seminole student-athletes. 18 ACC Coach of the Year awards, 18 ACC team championships and out of a possible 76 NCAA Tournament appearances, the Seminoles have advanced to NCAA postseason play 69 times.

Over the last two years FSU added three exciting facilities with the completion of a multi-purpose teaching facility and six indoor courts for the tennis programs, a softball hitting complex, and a new sand volleyball complex as well. In 2011-12 the football practice fields, which underwent a major renovation during the summer, opened for fall practice.

Spetman was introduced as Director of Athletics at FSU on February 4, 2008 following a national search. A former pilot and retired Air Force colonel, he took over after serving as Director of Athletics at Utah State from 2004-2008 and in the same position at the United States Air Force Academy from 1996-2003.

Spetman, 59, was lauded over his tenure at Utah State for the success of the Aggies' athletic programs both on the field or court and in the classroom. Utah State joined the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) in 2005 and claimed four conference championships in its first two years. USU's student-athletes led the WAC with a 78 percent graduation rate and maintained over a 3.0 cumulative grade point average.

Under Spetman's leadership, Utah State made high profile improvements to the football stadium. He also spearheaded fundraising and building efforts for a \$12.5 million facility and crafted a unique business partnership for medical health coverage that improved the overall coverage of USU student-athletes and reduced

medical costs. In addition, he negotiated a lucrative new marketing agreement for Aggie Athletics with Learfield Sports Properties.

Spetman spent eight successful years as Director of Athletics at the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colo. During his tenure, he administered the school's 27-sport intercollegiate program as well as the physical education and intramural programs. Under his command, the football team participated in four bowl games.

Born and raised in Council Bluffs, lowa, Spetman graduated from the Air Force Academy in 1976. He earned three letters as a defensive end for the Falcons and was a team captain as a senior. He also won a pair of heavyweight Wing Dpen Boxing Championships. Spetman's 28-year military career took him around the world in a variety of positions. A command pilot with more than 3.00D hours of flight time, his range of positions took him from assistant football coach at his alma mater to Chief of Bomber Planning in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm to serving as Chief, Command and Control Division, Operations Directorate of the U.S. European Command in Stuttgart, Germany.

A graduate from Squadron Officer School, he attended the National War College and earned a master's degree in National Security Strategy. Spetman also holds a master's in management and supervision from Central Michigan University.

He served as President of the National Association of Collegiate Director's of Athletics (NACDA) in 2009-10.

He and his wife, the former Becky Luhring of Des Moines, Iowa, are the parents of two grown children, Brian and Kim



### Dr. Pamela L. Perrewe Faculty Athletics Representative



Pamela L. Perrewé (Ph.D.) is in her second year as the Faculty Athletic Representative to the NCAA and the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Perrewé is the Haywood and Betty Taylor Eminent Scholar of Business Administration and Distinguished Research Professor at Florida State University. She received her Bachelor degree in Psychology from Purdue University and her Master and Ph.D. degrees in Management from the University of Nebraska. Dr. Perrewé has focused her research interests in the areas of job stress, burnout, coping, mentoring, organizational politics, emotion and personality. Dr. Perrewé has published several books, over 20 book chapters and over 100 journal articles in journals such as Academy of

Management Journal, Journal of Management, Journal of Applied Psychology, and Organizational Behavior and Human Decision Processes. She holds Fellow status in the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology and the American Psychological Association.

Dr. Perrewé has maintained a commitment to her profession as well as to Florida State University for over 25 years, and she has won teaching, mentoring, and research awards at Florida State University. She has served as the Management Department Chair as well as the Associate Dean for Graduate Programs in the College of Business. She has a passion for sports, enjoys playing tennis, and has served on the Athletic Board since 2004. Dr. Perrewé also served on the Board of Scientific Counselors of the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) from 2004-2007. She is married to Dr. Gerald R. Ferris and together they have six children; Erin, Jennifer, Emily, Ellie, Stephen and Matthew and one granddaughter, Lily.

# Monk Bonasorte Senior Associate Athletic Director

Monk Bonasorte is in his fifth year as Senior Associate Director of Athletics at Florida State and among his responsibilities is oversight of internal operations within the athletic department and oversight of Florida State's football program.

Currently, Bonasorte is responsible for administrative oversight of the following departments: Media Relations, Equipment, Communications, Student Services, Athletic Training, Coaches Video and

Strength & Conditioning.

A member of Florida State's All-Time football team as named by Athlon Magazine, Bonasorte earned four varsity letters (1977-80), played in the 1977 Tangerine Bowl and two Orange Bowls (1980 and 1981) and was inducted into the FSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1995 as one of the top defensive backs in school history. He ranks second in school history with 15 interceptions while his eight interceptions in 1979 ranks as the second highest single season total in school history.

Bonasorte joined the Florida State athletics department executive staff in 2008 after a 13-year career as the president and executive director of the Florida State University Varsity Club - the organization that gives back to every Seminole letter winner and allows them to give back to the current letter winners. He helped build the FSU Varsity Club into one of the top organizations of its kind across the nation.

As a player, Bonasorte earned All-America Third Team honors in 1979 by the Associated Press and All-America Second Team honors from Football News in 1980 starring on one of the toughest defensive units in Florida State history in 1979. He led the nation in interceptions for the majority of the 1979 season and finished with eight to rank fourth nationally and set a Seminole record for interceptions in a season. The Seminoles ranked sixth nationally and fifth nationally during his junior and senior seasons respectively.

Bonasorte spent seven years working with the Elmont Sports Group - a leader in the building and marketing of professional sports teams. He served as the marketing director for two seasons for the Tallahassee Scorpions of indoor professional league. He served as the director of marketing for the East Coast Hockey league Tallahassee Tiger Sharks (1997-99) and served as the Vice-present and General Manager for the Tallahassee Thunder of the Arenal Football league (1999-2003).

Bonasorte and his wife, Beverly, have two sons, T.J. and Rocky.



# Vanessa Fuchs Senior Associate Athletic Director SWA/Sand Volleyball Oversight

Florida State Athletic Director Randy Spetman promoted Vanessa Fuchs to the role of Senior Associate Athletic Director/Senior Woman Administrator in May of 2012. Fuchs has served as the department's associate athletic director for compliance since 2010.

Since joining the athletics staff in 2010, Fuchs has focused her time on building a comprehensive rules education program, implementing a department-wide recruiting and compliance software system

and establishing a new team structure for the compliance office.

Prior to arriving at Florida State, Fuchs committed seven years to the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in Indianapolis, Indiana. In 2007, her extensive knowledge of NCAA legislation, interpretations and the NCAA's governance process earned her a promotion to Associate Director of Academic and Membership Affairs (AMA).

Fuchs remained rooted in AMA throughout her tenure with the NCAA. Fuchs was primarily responsible for supervising the functions of the Legislative Relief Waiver team and contributed heavily to issuing interpretations, serving as a staff liaison to NCAA governance committees and leading project teams for the association

Before embarking on her career with the NCAA, Fuchs got her start working for the Atlantic Coast Conference as a Championships Intern in 2001. The Pompano Beach, Fla., native was a four-year letterwinner for the Seminoles' women's basketball team from 1997-2001. She was the team co-captain in her senior year. Fuchs finished her career as a three-time ACC Honor Roll selection.

Fuchs graduated Magna Cum Laude with a bachelor's degree in communications at Florida State University and earned her master's degree from the University of North Carolina in sport administration. She will oversee the compliance and academic departments in her new role.
