### NOTING FSU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

\* Florida State made its 33rd consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2010 and 48th appearance overall.

\* Head Coach Mike Martin has led his team to the NCAA's in each of his 31 years on the bench at Florida State. He has also led FSU to 14 CWS appearances.

\* Florida State made the trip to Omaha to play in the College World Series for the 20th time in school history and for the 14th time under head coach Mike Martin.

\* The Seminoles have posted a record of 87-33 (.725) while playing at home during NCAA Regional and Super Regional action including a mark of 35-15 in the 21st century.

\* The Seminoles have posted a record of 20-16 (.556) while playing on the road in the NCAA Regionals which dates back to 1975. Prior to the regional format, FSU was 30-20 when competing in the District III Playoffs held in Gastonia, N.C.

\* Eight of FSU's 20 trips to the College World Series have come when playing on the road during the NCAA Tournament. The last time the Seminoles booked a ticket to Omaha after opening regional play on the road was at the 1996 Stanford Regional when the Noles went 4-0. FSU went 3-0 in claiming the 2010 Norwich Regional.

\* The Noles headed to Norwich, Conn., for the Regional Tournament as the No. 1 seed marking the third time in school history FSU held such a distinction in a regional on the road. The other two times occurred in 1990 (Starkville, MS) & 1996 (Stanford, CA). In 1990, FSU fell to Mississippi State in the championship game, while going a perfect 4-0 in Stanford defeating Cal State Northridge in the finals. The Noles defeated Oregon 5-3 in the regional final in Norwich.

\* Florida State trails only Texas for the most NCAA Tournament appearances. The Longhorns have made 54 appearances all-time to lead the nation followed by FSU with 48.

\* Since the NCAA began selecting 16 host sites in 1999, the home team has won the Regional 133 times in 192 opportunities (69.3%).

\* Florida State registered its 137th win all-time in Regional/Super Regional play with a game three victory over Vanderbilt to clinch the Super Regional. The mark ties Texas for the most wins by any school in Regional/Super Regional action in D1 history.

\* No team has played more NCAA Tournament games than FSU with 209 in program history.

\* Since the bracket expanded to 64 teams in 1999, the top eight national seeds have advanced to the College World Series 59 times out of 96 opportunities. Six of the last seven CWS champions have (2004-08, 2010) been unseeded in the tournament. LSU (2009) was the last seeded school to win the title.

\* All eight top seeds have never advanced to the CWS. Seven of the eight top seeds have advanced twice in 1999 and 2001. Only three national seeds advanced to the CWS - #1 Arizona State, #3 Florida, #6 UCLA.

\* Florida State has faced 11 schools that were selected to this year's field of 64. The Seminoles posted a 19-15 record claiming three series victories, while tying in two others. FSU took 3-of-4 from Florida, who earned the No. 3 overall national seed. The other two series victories came against North Carolina and NC State. The Seminoles tied Virginia and Miami. This includes FSU's 3-0 record during the Norwich Regional, 2-1 record during Super Regional action and 1-2 mark in the College World Series

### **Opening NCAA Tournament Play**

• With Florida State's opening round victory over Central Connecticut State in the Norwich Regional, the Seminoles moved to 37-11 all-time in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

• Prior to the 2008 season which featured a 7-0 defeat at the hands of Bucknell, the Seminoles had won 15 straight regional openers, a streak that dated back to 1993.

• During that streak the Seminoles were involved in only one game that was decided by a single run (2005 vs. Army). Since 1993, the largest margin of victory was 18 runs performed twice the first coming in 1999 when the Seminoles defeated The Citadel 24-6. In 2006, FSU defeated Jacksonville 18-0 in the opening round in Athens, Ga.

• Under head coach Mike Martin the Seminoles are 27-4 in the opening game of a regional. Prior to Martin's arrival, the Seminoles were 10-7.

### NCAA Tournament Wins

• FSU and Texas are the two most successful programs in the history of college baseball in almost every category and the two powerhouses are once again squaring off in a fight over another record.

• Now into the third weekend of the 2010 NCAA Tournament, the two teams are tied for the most program victories in Regional/Super Regional play with FSU (137) and Texas (137).

· They are the only two schools in NCAA Base-

ball history with over 130 wins in NCAA Tournament play (not including the World Series).

• Only four schools have won more than 100 Regional/Super Regional games and two are from the state of Florida (FSU & Miami).

### FSU vs. Tournament Field

The Seminoles entered the 2010 NCAA Baseball Tournament having played 33 games against 11 teams who qualified for this year's tournament.
Overall, FSU finished 19-15 versus the 2010 field and 8-7 against three of the 16 No. 1 seeds which include games vs. Florida, Miami and Virginia.

• FSU posted a .500 or better record against eight of the 11 teams. FSU posted a 10-8 mark against nine of these schools on the road.

### NCAA Norwich Regional Notables

Florida State went undefeated in regional action for the second year in a row and for the 16th time in school history. The Seminoles went 3-0 in the 2010 Norwich Regional defeating Central Connecticut State (11-3) and Oregon twice (6-4, 5-3).
The Seminoles hit .292 as a team in the Norwich Regional, while the pitching staff was equally impressive posting a team ERA of 1.67.

Six Seminole pitchers combined to give up just

five earned runs in 27.0 innings of work.

• Daniel Bennett earned a win and a save in two relief appearances. The junior right hander worked 6.2 scoreless innings, while posting career-highs in IP (4.1) and strikeouts (5) in earning the win in the championship game vs. Oregon.

• Sherman Johnson went 2-for-3 in the championship game against Oregon driving in two of the five Seminole runs, while reaching base on his first three plate appearances registering a single in the first, a two-run home run in the third and a walk in the fourth. Johnson finished the regional hitting .417 with two home runs, a double, four RBI and five runs scored. He also came through with several key defensive plays all weekend long including two on Sunday night en route to being named the Norwich Regional MVP.

### NCAA Super Regional Notables

• The Seminoles hit .327 as a team in the Tallahassee Super Regional, while the pitching staff turned in an ERA of 5.88.

• Freshman Jayce Boyd led all hitters with two, three-hit games en route to hitting a team best .583 on the weekend. He finished the weekend with seven hits, two home runs and two RBI.

• Brian Busch threw a season-high 7.0 innings in a game two loss to Vanderbilt, allowed just one earned run.

### 2010 ACC Champs

After dropping the opening game of the tournament to Miami, the Seminoles tallied three straight victories, including a win over top-ranked Virginia, to finish the weekend with a 3-1 record.
With an 8-3 victory over NC State in the finals, FSU improved to 5-4 all-time in the ACC Championship game, while securing its first conference

title in the state of North Carolina (1-3).It marked the fifth conference crown for the Seminoles since joining the ACC in 1992 and first since defeating Georgia Tech in Salem, Va.,

in 2004.

• Tyler Holt (OF) and Stephen Cardullo (SS) were named to the ACC All-Tournament team.

• With victories over UVA (11-4) and BC (12-2), the Seminoles reached double-digit runs against conference opponents in back-to-back games for just the second time this year.

• Stephen Cardullo tied an ACC Tournament individual single-game record blasting three home runs in FSU's 11-4 victory over Virginia. Cardullo became the fourth player in conference tournament history to perform such a feat and last since Georgia Tech's Luke Murton hit three against Clemson in 2006.

• The Noles registered 10 home runs by five different players in the four games of the tourney.

### FSU As The No. 5 Seed

• For the first time in school history, Florida State entered the ACC Baseball Championship as the No. 5 seed.

• It marked the lowest seeding for the Seminoles in the conference tournament since earning the No. 6 seed back in 2006.

• In the 2006 tournament played at the Baseball Grounds in Jacksonville, Fla., FSU went 3-2 posting victories against #2 North Carolina (7-6), #3 Virginia (11-0) and #7 NC State (7-3).

• FSU became the first five-seed to play in the championship game since 1998 when Wake Forest (#5) defeated #1 Florida State 6-3 in Durham.

• Five-seeds in the ACC Tournament own a 5-2 record in the championship finals:

• Since the ACC moved to a pool play format for its conference tournament, Florida State has posted a record of 8-6.

• The Seminoles played in the ACC Championship game for the first time under this format in 2009 falling to Virginia 6-3.

• Under the new format, the #1 & #6 seeds has played for the championship twice, #2, #5, #7 and #8 seeds have played for it once.

• With a series victory over Vanderbilt (2-1), the Seminoles improved to 4-6 all-time in the bestof-three format collecting series - wins against Auburn (2-0) in 1999, Miami (2-1) in 2000 and Wichita State (2-1) in 2008 all at home.

• The 2008 series against Wichita State marked the first time since the Super Regional format began in 1999 that Florida State lost the opening round to only come back and win the series.

• FSU's victory over Vanderbilt in game one was just the third for the Seminoles in the opening round game of the Super Regionals and first since defeating Miami 9-2 back in 2000.

### Walk-Off Victories

• After going 39 games without a walk-off victory, the Seminoles put together three during a six-game stretch.

• The fourth and the biggest walk-off hit of the season came in the opening game of the Tallahassee Super Regional as Mike McGee connected on a walk-off solo home run in the bottom of the ninth to give FSU a 9-8 win over Vandy.

• Three of the four walk-off victories this year have come off the bat of Mike McGee and the other compliments of Stuart Tapley.

• There was no finer time to record the first walk-off victory of the season then in the ninth inning of game two of the Miami series. Tapley hit a two-run double with the bases loaded to give FSU the 8-7 victory.

• In Sunday's series finale against the Hurricanes, the Noles were back at it again only this time Mike McGee provided the winning hit connecting on a two-run home run with two outs in the ninth inning of a 7-6 FSU victory.

• McGee registered his second walk-off hit of the season connecting on an RBI single back up the middle in the bottom of the 13th to lead FSU to an 11-10 victory over Jacksonville.

• McGee has four career walk-off hits and Tapley with two.

• McGee's first came against Clemson in 2009 as he belted a game-winning three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth in the series finale to give FSU the series victory.

• Tapley's first came as a freshman in 2008 as he delivered a walk-off bases loaded single in the bottom of the ninth to give FSU a 9-8 victory over Maryland.

• Last year, the Seminoles recorded seven walkoff victories including three in league play.

• The seven walk-off victories were the most in a single-season since 2004 and 2005 when FSU registered six. It marked the most in school his-

### Non-Conference Action

• FSU put the finishing touches on its non-conference, regular season schedule posting a record of 21-4.

• The Garnet and Gold went 6-3 against nonconference foes in the NCAA Tournament including a 1-2 mark in the CWS.

• In those 34 games, the Seminoles went a perfect 6-0 against the Colonial Conference, 6-2 against schools from the Atlantic Sun, 9-2 vs. the SEC, 2-0 vs. the Pac-10, 1-0 against the Big South and the Northeast Conference, 2-1 against independent foes and 0-2 against the Mountain West.

• Since 2005, FSU has posted a record of 159-37 against non-league opponents.

### Light, Camera, Action

• The Seminoles have been at their best when playing in front of a national audience in 2010.

• In 26 nationally televised games, FSU is 19-7 outscoring the opposition 195-143.

• Twelve of those 26 games have been decided by three runs or less including both games against Oregon in the Norwich Regional, two, one-run victories over Vanderbilt in the Super Regionals and a three-run victory over Florida in the CWS.

• Eight of the nine postseason games FSU participated in during the 2010 season were shown live on national television.

### Double-Digit Home Runs

• For the second year in a row, Florida State had four student-athletes register double-digit home runs. It marked the first time such a feat has been performed in back-to-back seasons in school history.

• Mike McGee led the team in home runs for the second consecutive season blasting 17 round trippers in 2010.

• Tyler Holt (13), Stephen Cardullo (11) and Sherman Johnson (10) joined McGee among this elite group.

• In 2009, McGee led the power surge with 19 home runs followed by Stuart Tapley (13), Jason Stidham (12) and Cardullo (10).

• The school record for the most double-digit home runs in a single-season is six performed twice in 1981 & 1985.

### ACC Academic Team

• Florida State and Duke led all schools with six student-athletes honored on the 2010 ACC All-ACC Academic Team.

• Florida State, co-champions of the Atlantic Division in the ACC, placed two student-athletes on this year's All-ACC first and second teams as announced by the league office.

• Tyler Holt (OF) and Mike McGee (UT) represented the Seminoles on this year's All-Conference teams as both landed a spot on the All-ACC first time marking the 17th consecutive season that Florida State has at had at least one student-athlete named to the league's first team.

• Holt became the 11th Seminole to be recognized twice as a first team All-ACC honoree.

### McGee Wins Olerud Two-Way Award

• Mike McGee was named the winner of the 2010 John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation in Lubbock, Texas on July 2.

• McGee is the winner of the award in its inaugural season.

• McGee was one of 25 student-athletes featured on the watch list which recognizes a player who makes an impact both on the mound and at the plate.

• The Port St. Lucie, Fla., native was then named a semifinalist for the award on June 9.

### Busch Fans 10

• Sophomore Brian Busch became the first Seminole pitcher to record double-digit strikeouts this year fanning 10 Boston College batters in a 6-4 Florida State victory.

• The Boca Raton, Fla., native worked five innings in earning the no decision. He was responsible for 67% of the outs recorded during his start posting multiple strikeouts in four of the five innings while striking out the side in the fourth.


• The 10 strikeouts is a career-high for Busch surpassing the previous high of 8 set twice including once in 2010 - 8 strikeouts vs. Le Moyne.

### Down 8 Only To Record A Win

• FSU overcame its largest deficit of the season rallying from eight runs down after the top of the second inning to post a 12-9 victory over NC State in the series finale between the two schools.

• After giving up seven runs in the first and one in the second, the Seminoles responded with eight runs in the second and three more in the third to take the lead for good.

• The eight runs in the second were the most scored in an inning this year surpassing the previous high of seven performed twice.



### **Divisional Crown**

· For the fourth year in a row, Florida State finished a top the ACC Atlantic Division claiming at least a share of the division title.

• Since the move to divisional play in 2006, FSU has captured at least a share of the division title in four of the five years.

• Florida State won three straight ACC Atlantic Division title from 2007 to 2009.

• Only this year, FSU and Clemson finished tied for the divisional crown with identical 18-12 records.

• The tiebreaker went in favor of the Tigers after Clemson swept the season series during the final weekend of the regular season.

### Success Against the Sunshine State

· Florida State wrapped up its swing against Florida schools on Wednesday, May 12 in De-Land with a 6-2 victory over Stetson.

• FSU faced off against Florida in an elimination game in the College World Series with the Seminoles coming out victorious defeating the Gators 8-5. It marked the second time in the last three years FSU has eliminated Florida from postseason competition.

• The Seminoles registered a 12-5 record against five schools from the Sunshine State posting winning percentages of .500 or better in each of the five series.

### Cardullo 3-Pack

• Stephen Cardullo tied an ACC Tournament individual single-game record blasting three home runs in a win over Virginia.

· Cardullo became the fourth player in conference tournament history to perform such a feat and last since Georgia Tech's Luke Murton hit three against Clemson in 2006.

• Cardullo became the first Seminole to hit three home runs in a game since Mike Futrell went yard three times against Stanford in 2002.

• The senior shortstop finished his Florida State career with two career multi-home run games, both coming in 2010.

### Carolina On My Mind

· The state of North Carolina was Florida State's home away from home in 2010 as the Seminoles made the trek to the Tar Heel state four times this past season.

· FSU played at North Carolina, Duke and Wake Forest in 2010, while the fourth trip was to Greensboro for the ACC Championship.

• The Seminoles posted a record of 10-3 in the state of North Carolina in 2010 posting series victories against all three opponents including a series sweep of the Demon Deacons.

• Over the last two seasons (2009 & 2010), FSU is 15-5 in the state of North Carolina sweeping NC State in Raleigh and going 2-2 in the ACC Tournament.

### Oh What A Night

• Game 45 marked the first extra inning game of the season as Florida State defeated Jacksonville 11-10 in 13 innings back on May 4 in Tallahassee.

• The game marked the longest in series history between the Noles and Dolphins with the previous long dating back to April 24, 1987 when FSU defeated JU 9-8 in 12 innings.

• The clock struck 11:13 p.m. when the Tyler Holt crossed home plate with the winning run making the official time of the game 5 hours and 13 minutes. - the longest since playing 4:01 in an 11 inning contest against Clemson last year.

· In commemorating the final season that the College World Series will be played in Omaha's Johnny Rosenblatt Stadium, the NCAA is asking baseball fans to help select the CWS Legends Team.

• The Legends Team will represent those student-athletes who had the best CWS performances in the 60 years the event has been played at Rosenblatt Stadium

· Three Florida State players were nominated for the team including:

• J.D. Drew was named to the 28 member team and will be honored during the opening ceremonies of the CWS at Rosenblatt Stadium.

### **2010 ACC PRESEASON POLL**

For the third year in a row, the Florida State baseball team is favored to win the ACC's Atlantic Division title as voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. The Seminoles garnered 70 points including 10 first place votes to win the Atlantic Division crown. Since the league's inception of divisional play in 2006, the Seminoles have captured three of the four divisional titles including three straight in 2007, 2008 and 2009. This year marks the fifth year of divisional play in the ACC, as both the Atlantic and Coastal Divisions have produced two different winners. Florida State (2007, 2008 & 2009) and Clemson (2006) have shared the Atlantic title, while North Carolina (2006, 2007 & 2009) has won three Coastal Division crowns with Miami finishing on top in 2008.

· The Seminole defense finished the season posting the third best fielding percentage in school history at .969, while the pitching staff ranked fifth in the ACC with a 4.39 ERA.

· The fielding percentage stands as the second best percentage since the 1995 season.

· The pitching staff is holding opponents to a .260 average - fifth lowest average in the league this year.

### Super Sunday

• Sunday, Sunday, Sunday...just how much do the Seminoles love to play on Sunday? I can give you 17 good reasons.

• Florida State finished the season a perfect 17-0 on Sunday's including 10-0 when donning the Sunday gold uniforms at home.

• The Seminoles averaged over 10 runs a game when playing on Sunday while outscoring the opposition 173-90.

· FSU claimed its fifth ACC title in school history on a Sunday in Greensboro, N.C. defeating NC State 8-3.

· The trend continued as FSU claimed the Norwich Regional with a 5-3 victory over Oregon on a Sunday in Connecticut.

· And of course the Seminoles booked their 20th trip to Omaha with a game three winnertake-all victory over Vanderbilt on Sunday during the Super Regionals.

### FSU Baseball - Among The Elite

· Success is synonymous with Florida State Baseball as the program enters its 63rd year of existence in 2010.

• In 17 of the last 20 seasons, the Seminoles have claimed the ACC regular season title or finished with the best record in the league, won the ACC Tournament title or advanced to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

· All of this is pretty impressive for a school that has the most wins in Division I since 2000 and the second highest winning percentage of alltime in Division I history.

### **Consecutive Starts**

· Junior Tyler Holt has started every game for the Garnet and Gold since arriving in Tallahassee as a freshman back in 2008.

· Holt has been the starting centerfielder at FSU for 199 consecutive games. The mark stands as the longest, active streak in the nation.

• The school record for consecutive games played is held by Link Jarrett, who appeared in 235 games in a row from 1991 to 1994.

Paul Sorrento holds the FSU record for consecu-

tive games played in a season with 84 in 1984.

### Walk Like A Seminole

• Florida State tied a school record drawing 20 walks in a 13 inning victory over Jacksonville on May 4.

• The Seminoles set the school record with 20 walks against Cleveland State in 1982.

· The two schools also tied the Florida State record for the most combined walks with 26 (FSU 20, JU 6). The record was set back in 1980 when FSU drew 10 walks and Valdosta State had 16.

· Sherman Johnson had five of FSU's walks which tied a single-game school record set on three previous occasions by Stephen Drew (2003 vs. Siena), Jeremy Morris (1996 vs. Clemson) and Lionel Martinez (1980 vs. Virginia Tech).

• The 402 walks posted by the Seminoles in 2010 led the nation for the second time in the last three years. The Noles averaged 5.91 walks per game.

# Grand Slam

· Chalk up another big hit for Mike McGee. With the Seminoles trailing 4-1 to Le Moyne in the bottom of the seventh of game two, McGee took a 1-1 curveball out of the park to left with the bases loaded giving FSU a 5-4 lead.

• The grand slam was the second of McGee's career and 10th home run of the season making the junior the first Seminole to hit double-digit home runs in 2010.

• The grand slam also marked the first hit by a Seminole this year and the first since Jason Stidham hit one against Wake Forest back on April 24, 2009, a 14-10 Florida State victory.

### Parker After Short Rest

· Geoff Parker made his second start of the season on short rest in the series finale against Virginia Tech on April 4. His first start on short rest (5 days) came in the week that FSU played both Florida (3/2) & Georgia (3/7).

· Parker defeated Florida in Tampa back on March 2 throwing 5.1 innings allowing just one run as he struck out three. He then earned a no decision against Georgia working 4.0 innings as he struck out a then season-high six batters.

· On the second time around on short rest, Parker earned a pair of no decisions after working a combined 7.2 innings.

• Parker is no stranger to short rest as he led the team in appearances with 31 as a sophomore. The right hander from Dade City, Fla., worked on back-to-back days six times last year and even made an appearance twice in a doubleheader against Grambling State. He earned a no decision in his first outing (1.0 IP) and picked up the win in his second outing (2.2 IP).

· That trend continued as he worked all three games at Boston College including back-to-back games in a Sunday doubleheader. In the doubleheader, Parker picked up a win and a save throwing 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing just two hits, no walks and three strikeouts.

• He was at it again in the ACC Tournament as he came in relief to defeat No. 1 Virginia working 3.2 innings allowing just one run on four hits as he struck out three. He returned to the hill three days later to start the championship game against

NC State working 4.2 innings allowing three runs on five hits with five strikeouts in earning the no decision.

• Since moving to the bullpen, Parker has been lights out allowing just nine earned runs in 42.0 IP en route to posting a 2.79 ERA.

### **Divisional Conference Breakdown**

• Since the ACC adopted divisional play in 2006, the Seminoles have posted a league record of 98-46 (.681) while capturing three straight Atlantic Division titles from 2007-09.

• FSU shared the Atlantic Division title with Clemson after finishing with identical 18-12 records.

• Dating back to 2006, FSU has posted a record of 55-18 against teams in the Atlantic Division including a mark of 27-8 at home and 28-10 on the road.

• Against Coastal Division teams, the Seminoles are 43-28 overall, 24-14 at home and 19-14 on the road.

• In the first three seasons that FSU has won the divisional crown outright, the Seminoles averaged over 21 wins in the ACC. This includes a school record 24 wins in league action in 2008 - tied for the most league wins with Clemson (24 - 2006).

### On The Road In The ACC

• Florida State faced North Carolina in its first ACC road series of the season, taking 2-of-3 from the Tar Heels, while following that up with a series sweep over Wake Forest in Winston-Salem.

• Following its 19th season in the ACC, the Seminoles have posted an all-time league road record of 155-84, good for a .640 winning percentage.

• In those 19 seasons, the Noles have finished the year with a record of .500 or better 17 times (5-7 in 2000 & 7-8 in 2005).

• FSU's best all-time road record in terms of winning percentage came in 1999 when the Noles finished 11-1 (.917).

• After taking 2-of-3 from the Tar Heels in the Noles first ACC road series of the season, FSU has now won 14 of its previous 19 ACC road openers and are 37-17 all-time in league road openers

• When FSU faced UNC, it marked the fourth time that the Noles' road opener in the ACC came against the Tar Heels. The Seminoles have won three of those four road series and are 8-4 all-time when facing the Heels in their league road opener.

The series sweep against the Deacs marked the sixth for the Seminoles in Winston-Salem and seventh series victory in 10 all-time trips to the Dash.
The Seminoles suffered its first road sweep of

### In Opening ACC Play

• For the second year in a row, Florida State dropped the ACC series opener as Virginia took 2-of-3 from the Seminoles in Tallahassee, March 12-14.

• Florida State had never lost an opening series in the ACC, a string of 17 consecutive series victories, until last year when the Seminoles dropped two of three from Boston College.

• Since joining the ACC back in 1992, FSU has posted an all-time record of 45-9 on opening weekend in league play.

• Before the series loss to BC, the last time the Garnet and Gold lost a game in an opening series was on March 15, 2002 at Virginia.

• Florida State is 14-4 against Virginia when opening ACC play including a record of 12-3 when playing inside Dick Howser Stadium.

### Series Victory Over The Hurricanes

• With back-to-back walk-off victories in the ninth inning, Florida State took 2-of-3 games from Miami to win the season series from its in-state rival for the second time in the last four years.

• Mike McGee's dramatic two-run, home run in the ninth inning of Sunday's victory over the Hurricanes gave the Seminoles their first series victory over Miami in Tallahassee since 2003.

• The Seminoles hit seven home runs in the series victory, the most in any series this year, including three off the bat of Mike McGee, who now owns eight career home runs against Miami.

### Power Surge For Holt

• All it took was a slight adjustment with his swing and voila...Tyler Holt has turned into a different hitter.

• During a 17-game stretch (April 7 - May 4), Holt hit .382 (26-for-68) with 26 runs scored, seven doubles, four home runs, 15 RBI and 17 walks, while posting an .662 slugging % and .494 OB%.

• Holt hit home runs in back-to-back at-bats to open the weekend series against Duke marking his first multi-home run game of the season and third of his career.

• Second on the team in home runs with 12, Holt has already established a season-high in that category surpassing his previous high of five set back in 2009.

• During that 17-game stretch, Holt put together a season long 10-game hit streak while collecting hits in 14 of those games and scoring at least one run in 16 of 17.

• The 10-game hit streak ties a team-high met by Sherman Johnson and Stuart Tapley.

### Series Victory Over The Gators

• Florida State's 3-2 victory over Florida on April 13 in Tallahassee gave the Seminoles the regular season series as the Garnet and Gold won three of the four games.

• Both schools won on their home turf, while the Noles captured both games on neutral soil defeating the Gators 10-5 in Tampa and 7-2 in Jacksonville. • The series victory for the Seminoles was the second in the last three years over the Gators.

• Prior to FSU's 2008 regular season series victory, FSU had not won a regular season series from UF since 2005.

### ALS Awareness Night

• Seminole Baseball in conjunction with the Florida State University Department of Athletics and the ALS Association Florida Chapter hosted ALS Awareness Night at the ball park on Wednesday, April 21, when FSU hosted Charleston Southern inside Dick Howser Stadium.

• The game featured a silent auction in which fans had the opportunity to bid on a variety of items including a signed bat, hat and ball by Buster Posey, signed items from members of the Philadelphia Phillies and donated gift items from local Tallahassee businesses.

• In honor of this special event, the Seminole players and coaches wore special red jerseys for the game against the Buccaneers. Fans had a chance to bid on this authentic gear as the jerseys were auctioned off for one week on Seminoles.com.

• Through a silent auction, online auction and donations at the gate, the Seminole Baseball team raised over \$9,700 for the ALS Association Florida Chapter.

### RBI Century Mark

• In the series victory against Duke, senior Stephen Cardullo and junior Tyler Holt reached the century mark for career RBI.

• Cardullo and Holt sit with 126 and 117 RBI, respectively.

• The Seminole duo joins Mike McGee (187) and Stuart Tapley (138) with over 100 RBI in their career.

• Senior Ohmed Danesh fell just short of the century mark as the outfielder finished his Seminole career with 94 RBI.

### Holt Hits For The Cycle

• Fans at Dick Howser Stadium to see the series finale against Maryland on March 28 witnessed history as junior center fielder Tyler Holt hit for the cycle.

• Holt becomes the first Seminoles to perform the feat since Stephen Drew hit for the cycle at Wake Forest back on May 20, 2004 a game in which FSU won 11-10.

• It took Holt his first four at-bats to accomplish the feat as he went in order with a single, double, triple and home run.

• Holt collected a single down the right field foul line in the first, a double down the left field foul line in the second, a triple to gap in left center in the third and a home run to left in the fifth.

### Noles Secure Series Victory At UNC

• With a pair of late inning rallies in games one and three against North Carolina, Florida State secured its first series victory against the Tar Heels in Chapel Hill since 2000.

• The last four victories for FSU in the series have all been decided in the ninth inning including a pair of walk-off victories in Tallahassee in 2009.

• The series victory by the Seminoles broke a streak of four straight series victories by the Tar

Heels on their home turf. In 2000, FSU took 2of-3 from UNC.

### McGee's New Role

• With two years of experience serving as both a starter and a reliever, the Seminole coaching staff has turned to junior right hander Mike McGee as their new closer.

• McGee did not disappoint in his new role throwing 1.2 scoreless innings against North Carolina to earn saves in both of FSU's comefrom-behind victories in game 1 and game 3.

• In 19 relief appearances so far in 2010, McGee has worked 21.1 innings allowing 10 runs, nine earned on 15 hits and 14 walks while striking out 25. He finished the year 3-1 with 13 saves and a 3.80 ERA as a reliever.

• He ranked second in the ACC in saves.

### Brunelle Has Career Night

· Junior catcher Parker Brunelle had a career night against Stetson on March 24 as the Snellville, Ga., native set career-highs with four hits and two doubles, while tying career-highs for atbats (5), runs scored (2) and RBI (3).

• Parker's four-hit performance was the first by a Seminole in 2010.

### Scantling Looms Large In First Start

• Sophomore Hunter Scantling took the mound for his first start of the season in the series finale against Maryland and second start against an ACC opponent.

• After giving up a leadoff home run on the very first pitch of the game, the right hander settled in nicely allowing just one more hit the rest of the way to earn his first victory of the season.

• Scantling finished the game working 5.0 innings allowing three runs, one earned, on two hits.

• In nine career starts, Scantling is 4-2 with a 4.74 ERA - 44 IP, 45 H, 26 R, 22 ER, 13 BB, 23 K

### Sitz Set On A Starting Role

· Scott Sitz definitely made a case to remain in the Seminole starting rotation after throwing six scoreless innings against North Florida back on April 7 in his first collegiate start.

• The freshman right hander scattered just two hits and walked two while striking out a careerhigh four Osprey hitters.

• Sitz did not allow a base runner passed second base and retired the last seven batters that he faced before leaving after the sixth.

• In a mid-week start against Florida, Sitz was once again lights out matching career-highs for innings pitched (6.0) and strikeouts (4) in earning his third win of the season and second in as many starts.

• In six career starts, Sitz is 5-0 with a 4.97 ERA - 25.1 IP, 25 H, 15 R, 14 ER, 8 BB, 16 K

### Martin Reaches Milestone

• Now in his 31st season as head coach at Florida State, add yet another milestone to the growing list of accolades for Mike Martin.

• On Sunday, April 4, Martin earned career victory No. 1,600 with FSU's 9-6 win over Virginia Tech. Ironically on the same day, Wichita State head coach Gene Stephenson earned his 1,700th career win.

· Martin became just the fourth coach in all divisions to reach this historic milestone and third in Division I history.

• The elusive group includes Gordie Gillespie (1,852), Augie Garrido (1,768) and Gene Stephenson (1,721) - Mike Martin (1,627).

### Holt Honored A Second Time By ACC

• Tyler Holt hit .500 over a five game span in games against North Florida and Duke to earn his second ACC Player of the Week accolade. • The junior centerfielder registered a hit and scored a run in all five games including multiple hits in four of the five games.

• Holt finished the week posting a 1.000 slugging percentage and an OB% of .600. He was a perfect 5-for-5 in stolen bases and was perfect from the field in 12 fielding opportunities.

### Johnson Goes Big Against Hofstra

· Sophomore Sherman Johnson was named ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career on March 1 putting the finishing touches on a fine weekend against Hofstra in week 2.

• The Tampa, Fla., native drove in a team-high 10 runs while going 5-for-8 at the plate with five runs scored as FSU swept a three-game series from Hofstra.

· Johnson, who started at both second and third in the series against the Pride, tied a career-high with three hits while establishing a career-high six RBI in game one. He finished a triple short of hitting for the cycle in the first game.

· His six RBI performance was the first by a Seminole hitter since Mike McGee drove in six runs in a 15-6 victory over Wake Forest on April 24, 2009.

· With two home runs against Hofstra, Johnson surpassed his career total (1) during his freshman season in 2009.

### Cardullo Shines Versus SEC Foes

• Senior Stephen Cardullo was named ACC Player of the Week for the first time this season and second time in his career in leading FSU to a perfect weekend with wins over No. 5 Florida and No. 25 Georgia.

• Cardullo hit .600 (9-for-15) over the four games driving in eight runs and scoring five times while converting on all 11 of his fielding chances.

• Began the week with a 2-for-3 performance at the plate with a run and an RBI as he reached base on four of his five plate appearances in the win over the Gators in Tampa.

• The senior shortstop hit .583 (7-for-12) against Georgia driving in seven runs and scoring four times while posting a .667 on-base percentage.

• At one stretch during the series, Cardullo reached base in nine consecutive at-bats including all five times on three singles and two walks in a game two victory over the Bulldogs.

### Holt's Cycle Leads To ACC POW

• For the second time in his career, Tyler Holt was named ACC Player of the Week sharing the honors with Georgia Tech's Derek Dietrich on March 29.

• FSU's Buster Posey, a two-time finalist for the Bench Award, won the award in 2008.

### **Golden Spikes Recognition**

• Florida State's Sean Gilmartin and Tyler Holt were named to the Golden Spikes Award watch list in 2010.

· Mike McGee was added to the watch list in May joining Holt and Gilmartin to comprise the 60 member list which will be narrowed to 30 on June 1.

• McGee was named one of 30 semifinalists on June 1.

· Florida State leads all schools with the most Golden Spikes Award winners at four:

### **Quick Start Noles**

· For the third time in the last four years and for the sixth time overall, FSU started a season undefeated opening the 2010 campaign with a 12-0 record.

· During that undefeated start, the Seminoles outscored the competition 133-32.

• The 12-0 start marked the fourth time in the Mike Martin era that FSU opened the season on such a streak.

• In 2007, Florida State set the school record for the best start in school history winning its first 23 games.

• 1972, 1985, 2008, 2010: 12-0

### A Give And Take Relationship

• One of the big reasons for FSU's 48-20 record and a spot as one of eight team competing in the College World Series was the team's ability to answer the call when the opposing team scored a run.

· During the 68-game schedule, an opponent scored a run in 180 of a possible 598.2 innings in which the opposing team garnered an at-bat. Five times the opposing team scored a run in the ninth thus not giving the Noles the opportunity to hit.

• The Seminoles followed an opponents run with a run in their next at-bat 81 times in 2010.

### Noles Drawing Blanks

• For the first time since 2008, the Seminoles shut out an opponent after blanking Hofstra 13-0 in game two of a doubleheader in week two.

· Three Seminole pitchers combined for the twohit shutout as the Garnet and Gold kept an opponent off the scoreboard for the first time since blanking NC State 1-0 back on May 16, 2008.

· John Gast scattered two hits over 5.0 innings, while Brian Busch and Andrew Durden each pitched a scoreless inning in relief in game completed after seven innings.

· FSU followed that performance with a one-hit shutout against Jacksonville on March 8. It marked the first nine-inning shutout of the season.

• The last time FSU posted multiple shutouts in a single season was in 2008 when the Seminoles registered three.

• The school record for shutouts in a season is 15 performed twice back in 1970 and 1975.

### **Double-Digit Figures**

· The Florida State offense reached double-digit runs in nine of their first 10 games, while stringing together a streak of 10 straight double-digit hit games.

· Dating back to last year, the Seminoles had a run of 15 consecutive games where they registered double-digit hits before the streak came to an end with a six-hit night at Jacksonville on March 8.

• During the streak, FSU was averaging 14.4 hits per game.

• In 2007, the Seminoles put together a streak of 16 straight games in which they reached doubledigit hits, the longest of record dating back to 1996.

• In 2010, FSU scored double-digit runs 22 times, while recording 41 double-digit hit games.

· The Noles finished the season ranked seventh in the ACC in hitting with a .300 team batting average.

### Triple It Up

• A year ago the Seminole hit just 16 triples as a team with five players recording more than one.

• The Seminoles surpassed last year's team triple total in game 35 as 11 players combined to hit 22 triples in 2010.

• The Seminoles tied for third in the ACC in triples with 22 including six off the bat of James Ramsey to lead all players.

· Sophomore James Ramsey tied a school record with two triples in Sunday's series finale against Georgia State. He became the sixth player in school history to perform such a feat and first since March 6, 2005 when Tony Thomas, Jr. hit two against Hawaii-Hilo.

• It wasn't until game 61 (NCAA Regional Championship game vs. Ohio State) of the 2009 season that FSU recorded its 15th triple of the season.

# Walk It Out

• The first four hitters in the Seminole line-up did a great job of getting on base during the opening weekend series against Georgia State drawing 16 of the 23 total walks.

• Half of those walks turned into runs as hitters 1 through 4 in the Seminole line-up scored a total

of eight times against the Panthers.

• James Ramsey led the Seminoles with six walks in the three-game series against GSU. He tied a career-high drawing three walks in back-to-back contests against the Panthers.

### Oh So Close For Tapley

Junior Stuart Tapley put together a nice stretch over a four game span as the Orlando, Fla., native reached base on 12 consecutive plate appearances.
The mark fell one short of the school record (13) set by Paul Sorrento in 1985.

### **One-Hit Performance**

• Mike McGee, Tyler Everett and Daniel Bennett combined to throw a one-hit shutout in downing Jacksonville 2-0 on March 8.

• It marked the first one-hitter since opening day on January 28, 2005 when Mark Sauls, Kevin Lynch and Tyler Chambliss combined to one-hit Charleston Southern in a 2-1 FSU victory.

### Limiting The Hits

• Already this year, the Seminole pitching staff has posted a one-hit and two-hit shutout. Fortyone times this year, FSU hurlers held the opposition to single-digit hits.

• The last time the FSU pitching staff posted a one-hitter and two-hitter in the same year was back in 2005 when the Seminoles opened the season holding Charleston Southern to just one hit on opening day followed by two hits in game two.

• FSU two-hit Wake Forest in the opening game of the series against the Deacs en route to a 10-1 victory in Winston-Salem

### Hats Off To The Bullpen

• The Seminole bullpen got off to a great start in 2010 working a combined 11.0 innings through the first three games of the season en route to posting a 1-0 record and a 1.64 ERA.

• Seven different pitchers saw action out of the pen in FSU's opening weekend series against Georgia State including four newcomers - three freshmen and one JUCO transfer.

• The four newcomers (Robert Benincasa, Andrew Durden, Daniel Bennett and Scott Sitz) worked a combined 5.0 scoreless innings allowing just two hits and three walks while striking out six.

• The bullpen continued to impress in week 2 as 10 pitchers combined to work 12.0 innings allowing three runs, two earned, on five hits while striking out 11.

• In 68 games, the Seminoles bullpen went 24-6 with 20 saves and a 3.61 ERA posting 264 strikeouts in 274.0 innings of work.

• Mike McGee was 13-for-15 while Daniel Bennett is 3-for-4 in save opportunities this year. Geoff Parker has joined the mix and is a perfect 3-for-3 in save chances this year.

### McGee Helping His Own Cause

• Twelve times in 2009, Mike McGee served as the Seminole starting pitcher and took a spot in the batting order. In those 12 games, McGee batted .489 (22-for-45) with seven doubles, six home runs, 17 runs, 22 RBI, five walks and seven strikeouts.

• Against Clemson on March 22, McGee started

the game on the mound earning a no decision after going 6.0 innings, but finished the game with his bat, knocking a walk-off, three-run home run over the right field wall to give FSU the 7-4 victory.

• Twice McGee hit a pair of home runs in games in which he was the starting pitcher - vs. Clemson (3/22) and at Miami (4/5).

• Although McGee did not hit in his first start against Jacksonville on March 8, we went to left field after his six innings of work and made two plate appearances picking up a double in his first AB. McGee is hitting .500 on the year in games that he hits and pitches.

• McGee pitched 1.2 innings in relief to pick up the win in the series finale against Virginia. Mc-Gee started the game in left field and went 3-for-4 at the plate with a home run and two singles. He also drove in two and scored twice.

• In 20 games that McGee pitched in 2010, the Port St. Lucie native hit .342 (26-for-76) with five home runs (grand slam), five doubles, 20 RBI and 14 runs scored. He connected on a walk-off home run in the ninth to defeat Miami.

### From Football To Baseball

• Redshirt sophomore Taiwan Easterling has traded in his shoulder pads for a bat, glove and some cleats this spring. Easterling, who was drafted by the Florida Marlins in the sixth round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Draft, has decided to once again give it a go on the diamond. The Hattiesburg, Miss., native hopes to return to form where he was tabbed Mississippi's Mr. Baseball as an outfielder/pitcher following his senior year at Oak Grove High School where he hit .455 with 13 home runs and 56 RBI.

# **<u>#11 MIKE MARTIN • HEAD COACH</u>** 2010 HIGHLIGHTS

### 31ST SEASON • FSU (1966)

Entering his 31st season as Florida State's head coach, Mike Martin continues to cement his legacy as one of collegiate baseball's most prolific coaches. On January 5, 2007 his baseball legacy was secured as Martin was enshrined into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. With a victory over Virginia Tech on April 4, 2010, Martin earned his 1,600th career win becoming one of three coaches in NCAA Division I history to reach that mark.

The FSU alum has become the face of Florida State baseball having been associated with the Seminoles for 38 of FSU's 63 seasons. Of the 3,464 baseball games played in program history, Martin has been involved in 2,571 as a player, assistant coach and head coach. What is even more impressive is Martin's involvement in 1,894 of the 2,527 all-time victories at Florida State. In one way or another, Martin has been a part of more than 74.9% of FSU's victories.

Martin has won 16 conference championships since taking over as head coach in 1980 with 11 from the Metro Conference and five in the ACC. Since moving to divisional play in 2006, Martin has led the Seminoles to three consecutive ACC Atlantic Division titles in 2007, 2008 and 2009 and a share of the division title in 2010. FSU's run to a division title in 2008 was accomplished after Martin led the Noles to a league mark of 24-6, a school record for the most conference wins in team history. In 2010, the Seminoles claimed their fifth ACC title since joining the league in 1992. He is a six-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year and has been recognized as the top coach in the ACC six times as well. Seventy-six Florida State players have earned All-America honors under Martin, while 98 players have garnered first and second team All-ACC recognition. He has coached six players, Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd, J.D. Drew, Shane Robinson, Tony Thomas, Jr. and Buster Posey, who were named National Players of the Year. In 2010, Martin was named to Florida State University's list of 100 Distinguished Graduates in celebration of the FSU Alumni Association Centennial.
