## NOTING THE SEMINOLES

FSU is making its 30th consecutive regional appearance and 45th overall. The Seminoles own an all-time record of 147-98 in the NCAA Tournament including a mark of 122-62 in regional play.

The Seminoles have won 14 straight opening round games in the NCAA Regional dating back to 1992.

The 2007 Tallahassee Regional Field consists of:

- No. 1 Florida State - 47-11, 24-6 ACC
- No. 2 Mississippi State - 33-20, 15-13 SEC
- No. 3 Stetson - 41-19, 21-6 A-Sun
- No. 4 Bethune-Cookman - 33-25, 16-1 MEAC

Florida State has posted a combined record of 48-24 against the three schools in the Tallahassee Regional including a mark of 9-5 in the NCAA Tournament. FSU is 38-20 against Stetson, 7-4 vs. Mississippi State and 3-0 vs. Bethune-Cookman.

Florida State claimed its first Atlantic Division title in 2007 en route to earning the No. 1 overall seed in this year's ACC Tournament. It marked the seventh time in conference history that the Seminoles have earned the top seed in the tournament.

With a mark of 24-6, the Seminoles set the school record for the most conference wins in a season surpassing the previous record of 22 set in 1999. The 24 victories are tied for the most wins recorded in ACC history as the Clemson Tigers posted the same record a season ago.

Bryan Henry and Tony Thomas, Jr. were named semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy, while both student-athletes were named to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List. Henry is a semifinalist for the Roger Clemens Award.

Tony Thomas, Jr. ranks in the top 10 in 11 offensive categories in the ACC, while leading the league in seven of those categories.

## NOTING FSU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

\* This is the 30th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament for the Seminoles and the 45th appearance overall.

\* Head Coach Mike Martin has now led his team to the NCAA's in each of his 28 years on the bench.

\* Florida State will host a regional for the 25th time in school history. The Seminoles served as a regional host in nine straight seasons before traveling to Athens, Ga. last year.

\*The Seminoles have posted a record of 70-21 (.769) while playing at home in the NCAA Regional including a mark of 20-3 in the 21st century.

\* Eleven of FSU's 18 runs to the College World Series have started in a regional played in its back yard.

\* Florida State trails only Texas for the most NCAA Tournament appearances. The Longhorns have made 51 appearances all-time to lead the nation followed by FSU with 45.

\* Since the NCAA started selecting 16 host sites in 1999, the home team has won the Regional 76 times in 112 opportunities (67.9%).

\* FSU is second all-time for wins in NCAA Regional and Super Regional play with 122.

\* No team has played more NCAA Tournament games than FSU with 184 in program history.

\* Since the bracket expanded to 64 teams in 1999, the top eight national seeds have advanced to the College World Series 42 times out of 64 opportunities.

\* All eight top seeds have never advanced to the CWS. Seven of the eight top seeds have advanced twice in 1999 and 2001.

\* Prior to 2007, Florida State has earned a top national seed four times (1999, 2000, 2002 and 2003) advancing to the CWS twice in 1999 and 2000.

\* FSU and Mississippi State have faced each other 11 times overall with 8 of those meetings occurring in the NCAA Tournament. The two schools have never met in Tallahassee in the postseason.

\* FSU has faced MSU on three previous occasions in Tallahassee with the Seminoles winning all three games. The Seminoles have outscored the Bulldogs 36-4 inside Dick Howser Stadium.

\* FSU won the last meeting in the series back in 1992, a 5-1 Seminole victory in Tallahassee.

\* Seven of the eight tournament games have been decided by four runs or less including three by one run - MSU is 2-1 in one-run contests vs. FSU.

\* FSU has won two straight over Stetson in regional action as all five previous NCAA Tournament meetings have occurred in Tallahassee.

\* The Seminoles have won six straight in the series taking all four games in 2005. All six games during the streak have been decided by four runs or less including a pair of Regional games ('92, '02).

\* In 1988, Stetson eliminated FSU from the Tallahassee Regional with a 7-2 victory. The Hatters lost to Florida 8-0 in the regional final that year.



## #4 Bethune-Cookman Wildcats 33-25 Overall, 16-1 MEAC



\* Florida State and Bethune-Cookman have faced each other just three times overall with all three meetings coming in the NCAA Tournament.

\* The Seminoles have outscored the Wildcats 24-7 in their three previous NCAA Tournament games all played in Tallahassee.

\* This is Bethune-Cookman's first trip to Tallahassee since 2004 when the Wildcats fell to the Seminoles 10-3 in the first game of the regional.

\* The Wildcats are making their eighth all-time appearance in the NCAA Tournament with all eight appearances coming in the last nine years.

**FSU IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

This is Florida State's 30th consecutive trip to NCAA Regional, which is the second-longest streak in the nation behind only Miami (35). Overall, this is Florida State's 45th NCAA Regional, which is the second-most ever trailing only Texas. The Seminoles and Longhorns are the only two schools to ever play in 40 NCAA Regional Tournaments. The Seminoles are 147-98 all-time in NCAA Tournament play, a record that includes 18 trips to the College World Series (25-36). Only three teams (Miami, Texas and Southern California) have more wins in NCAA Tournament play and the College World Series than Florida State and only nine schools in all of college baseball have more than 100 wins in postseason play. Florida State earned a top 8 national seed for the fifth time in school history as the Seminoles enter the 2007 postseason with a No. 6 overall seed. FSU also earned a top seed in 1999 (#2), 2000 (#6), 2002 (#1) and 2003 (#1). The Seminoles have advanced to the CWS twice as a national seed both in 1999 and 2000.

**NCAA TOURNAMENT WINS**

Florida State and Texas are the two most successful programs in the history of college baseball in almost every category and the two powerhouses are once again squaring off in a fight over another record. Coming into the 2007 NCAA Tournament the two teams are first and second for the most program victories in Regional/Super Regional play with Texas (124) and FSU (122). They are the only two schools in NCAA Baseball history with over 120 wins in NCAA Tournament play (not including the World Series). Only three schools have ever won more than 100 Regional/Super Regional games and two are from the state of Florida (FSU & Miami). Texas has been in regional play six more times than the Seminoles giving the Longhorns an average of 2.5 wins per appearance compared to 2.8 for FSU. The Hurricanes lead both schools winning an average of 3.2 games per tournament appearance.

**OPENING NCAA TOURNAMENT PLAY**

Florida State has won 14 straight regional openers, a streak that goes back to 1992. During that streak the Seminoles have been in only one game that was decided by a single run (2005 vs. Army). The Seminoles have an aggregate scoring lead of 146-43 over the 14-game stretch. The largest margin of victory was 18 runs performed twice the first coming in 1999 when the Seminoles defeated The Citadel 24-6. Last

year, FSU defeated Jacksonville 18-0 in the opening round in Athens, Ga. Under head coach Mike Martin the Seminoles are 24-3 in the opening game of a regional. Prior to Martin's arrival, the Seminoles were 11-7.

**FSU VERSUS THE TOURNAMENT FIELD**

The Seminoles enter the 2007 NCAA Baseball Tournament having played 20 games against six teams who qualified for this year's tournament. Overall, FSU went 12-8 versus the 2007 field and 2-1 against North Carolina, the lone No. 1 seed of the six teams that the Seminoles have played. FSU has a .500 or better record against five of the six teams with the only sub .500 record coming against Clemson. The Tigers took 3-of-4 from the Seminoles in 2007 including two in Tallahassee. FSU posted a 7-3 mark on Mike Martin Field against four of these teams. Here is a look at who FSU faced:

- \* Senior Michael Hyde is 1-0 in two career NCAA starts...Hyde has thrown 11 combined innings allowing just two runs on eight hits...he has posted eight strikeouts and only two walks...he is limiting the opposition to a .200 batting average...Hyde earned a no decision against Army in 2005 and defeated Jacksonville in 2006.
- \* Senior Bryan Henry is 1-2 in three career NCAA Tournament starts...in 2005, he pitched the only complete game of his career as he led the Seminoles to a 4-3 win over Auburn...he struck out 10 while giving up three runs on six hits...Henry suffered losses against Georgia (2006) and Florida (2005).
- \* Brian Chambers, Travis Burge and Jimmy Marshall have each made relief appearances in the NCAA Tournament with Chambers the more experienced of the trio with an inning of work to his credit in 2005...all three have worked a combined 8.1 innings without giving up an earned run.
- \* Jack Rye is a career .290 hitter in NCAA action registering nine hits in 31 at-bats...he has a double, three runs scored and three RBI's.
- \* The NCAA postseason has not been kind to Tony Thomas, Jr. as the junior second baseman is batting just .250 (8-for-32) in nine career games...three of his eight hits have gone for extra bases including two home runs.
- \* In his first season, Buster Posey hit .353 as he started at shortstop in all four NCAA games last year...he went 6-for-17 and tied Shane Robinson with a team-high five runs scored.
- \* Dennis Guinn played in all four games in 2006 hitting .333...Mark Gildea and Tommy Oravetz each recorded one hit in the postseason a year ago.

**PROBABLE STARTERS FOR FLORIDA STATE IN ACC TOURNAMENT**

**\*\* Senior Bryan Henry** will make his 18th start in the NCAA Tournament this weekend in Tallahassee. Henry suffered his first loss of the season last week in the ACC Tournament as FSU fell to Clemson 5-1. The senior right hander went 5.1 innings giving up four runs, two earned, on nine hits. Henry posted a perfect 14-0 record in 16 starts during the regular season as he posted an ERA of 2.50. He currently stands at 14-1 with an ERA of 2.54. Henry has now posted at least seven or more strikeouts in 10 of his 17 starts this season and in nine of his last 13 outings. Henry has pitched a season-high eight innings five times this season including four ACC games and in back-to-back contests against North Carolina and Miami. He threw eight innings in his first outing against Clemson as he allowed just one Tiger run on eight hits. The Tallahassee, Fla., native pitched eight innings of four-hit ball against North Carolina and then against Boston College, Henry tallied eight innings allowing one run on four hits while striking out 10. He has allowed a run or less in nine of his 17 starts this season. He kept Indiana scoreless on six hits, while giving up one run on four hits to both BC and UNC. He has worked four games this year where he has pitched at least six innings without issuing a free pass. Henry has made 29 career starts against league opponents posting a career record of 18-6 with an ERA of 2.74. He has registered 169 strikeouts against ACC teams and just 50 walks. Henry enters the NCAA Tournament with three career starts and a record of 1-2. He has thrown 21 innings and an ERA of 6.42 with 15 strikeouts and five walks. Henry recorded his only complete game of his career in a 4-3 victory over Auburn in 2005, a game in which he struck out 10 Tiger batters.

**\*\* Senior Michael Hyde** will get the start against Bethune-Cookman on Friday night, which will mark his 16th start of the season. Hyde registered FSU's lone win in this year's ACC Tournament leading the Seminoles over Wake Forest 11-2. The senior right hander threw six solid innings allowing two runs on four hits. He walked four and struck out four in earning his career-high 10th win of the season. It was Hyde's longest outing since he threw six innings back on April 14 against Virginia Tech, a game in which he earned a no decision. Hyde tied a career-high for wins in a season with his ninth in FSU's 20-5 victory over Maryland in College Park. After starting the season with eight straight wins, Hyde is just 2-2 in his last seven starts but has recorded victories in two of his last three outings. The Tallahassee, Fla., native is second on the team in victories (10) and in ERA with a mark of 3.35. He has worked into the fifth inning in 11 of his 15 starts. Hyde has lost just three games in his last 26 starts dating back to last year. He worked a season-high 7.0 innings against Boston College. The senior right hander is 18-3 in his last 26 starts for the Seminoles dating back to last year, while posting a career mark of 26-5 as a member of the Garnet and Gold. Hyde has 22 career starts to his credit against ACC opponents as he has compiled a record of 10-2 with a 4.77 ERA. Hyde is 1-0 with two career starts in the NCAA Tournament. The right hander has thrown 11 innings in the tournament the last two seasons posting a career ERA of 1.64. Opponents are hitting just .200 off Hyde in the postseason as he has accumulated 11 strikeouts and issued just three walks.

**\*\* Junior Ryan Strauss** has started 15 games for Florida State this season posting a 9-3 mark with an ERA of 3.70. Strauss started game two of the ACC Tournament against Miami and suffered the loss as he worked 4.2 innings giving up five runs on six hits. The junior right hander started in the regular season finale at Georgia Tech as he worked four innings allowing just one run on four hits in earning a controlled start victory. It was his first win on the road this season and his first victory since throwing seven innings in a win against Virginia Tech back on April 15. The junior right hander has pitched at least six innings in nine of his 15 starts in 2007, while throwing into the seventh in four of his last 11 outings. The Tampa, Fla., native set career-highs in innings pitched (8) and strikeouts (8) against Indiana. He threw seven innings in back-to-back league games earning victories over Wake Forest and Boston College and then returned home to pitch seven innings in a win over Virginia Tech. He has started 10 games against ACC teams this season posting a mark of 5-3 with an ERA of 4.84. Strauss will look to make his first start in the NCAA Tournament in 2007.

**\*\* Sophomore Bo O'Dell** has five starts to his credit in 2007, including a Sunday start against UNC Asheville back on February 11. The right hander is 3-1 on the year with a 5.06 ERA. O'Dell pitched a career-high six innings in a mid-week start against Jacksonville. He gave up just one run on five hits and struck out three for his third victory of the season. O'Dell has posted 24 strikeouts compared to 12 walks in 13 appearances this year. The Kissimmee, Fla., native has six appearances in ACC play and worked 5.1 innings of solid relief against Duke. Against the Blue Devils, O'Dell gave up one run on two hits while striking out three. He has pitched an 2.2 innings over the last three weeks including 1.1 shutout innings against Miami in the ACC Tournament. He has thrown against Clemson and in the series finale against Georgia Tech. O'Dell has not started a game in the NCAA Tournament.

## **FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY**

Florida State ended the season sweeping its final two road series (at Maryland and at Georgia Tech) en route to claiming its first Atlantic Division title and the top seed in the ACC Tournament. The Seminoles set a school record for the most road wins in a single season in ACC play with 12 thanks to their three-game sweep over Georgia Tech to end the regular season. FSU posted identical home and away records of 12-3 in 2007. The Seminoles won all five road series this season, while winning nine of 10 ACC series overall. FSU's only series loss came at the hands of Clemson. The Garnet and Gold registered five series sweeps in league play taking all three games from Wake Forest, Boston College, Virginia Tech, Maryland and Georgia Tech. FSU reached the 20-win plateau in game two against Maryland marking the third time in school history that Florida State has won 20 or more ACC games in a season. FSU's 24 wins in 2007 not only set the school record for the most league victories, but it tied the conference record set last season by Clemson. With two victories over Miami in Coral Gables, Florida State surpassed last year's ACC win total of 16. Since joining the league in 1992, FSU is the only team in the ACC to post 14 or more league wins in each of the last 16 seasons. This year Florida State won its first seven conference games before falling at Duke in game two of the series. It was the Seminoles' best start in ACC play since 1999 when the Garnet and Gold started 13-0. Since joining the ACC in 1992, FSU started league play winning its first six games three times.

### **30-100-30**

Tony Thomas, Jr. became the first Seminole in Florida State history to record 30 doubles, 100 hits and 30 stolen bases in a single-season as he registered his 30th stolen base of the season in game three of the ACC Tournament against Clemson in Jacksonville. Thomas currently sits with 32 doubles and 107 hits as well as 30 stolen bases in 2007.

### **14 WINS FOR HENRY**

With a 14-1 record heading into this week's regional tournament, Bryan Henry made Florida State history becoming just the third pitcher to reach the 14-win plateau in a single season since FSU joined the ACC back in 1992. He also became the eighth pitcher all-time with 14 or more wins in school history as he tied Richie Lewis who reached 14 wins in 1986. Mike Loynd holds the all-time single-season record with 20 wins in 1986.

Henry's win over Georgia Tech in FSU's regular season series finale marked career victory No.

32 for Henry, moving him into sole possession of eighth place all-time on the career wins list at Florida State. The senior right hander moved past Jon McDonald (31), Randy Choate (29) and Jeff Gray (28) on the career wins list this season. Henry needs two more victories to tie Jonathan Johnson for seventh place all-time.

### **ACC ACCOLADES**

Tony Thomas, Jr. became the fourth Seminole student-athlete to garner ACC Player of the Year honors and the first since 2001. Thomas currently leads the league in seven statistical categories and is ranked in the top 10 in four others. The Valrico, Fla., product leads or is tied for the lead, in the ACC in batting average (.442), hits (107), runs scored (87), doubles (32) triples (6), total bases (184), on base percentage (.537) and slugging percentage (.760). In addition, Thomas is third in stolen bases (30) and is tied for fourth with 11 home runs. Thomas joins J.D. Drew (1997), Marshall McDougall (1999) and John-Ford Griffin (2001) as past Seminoles to be recognized as ACC Player of the Year.

Bryan Henry was named ACC Pitcher of the Year after finishing the regular season with a perfect 14-0 record and a 2.50 earned run average. The Tallahassee, Fla., senior recorded his 14 wins in only 16 starts this season and along with Thomas, was named as a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy and the Golden Spikes Award. In addition to the NCAA-best 14 wins, including nine in ACC play, Henry leads the ACC in strikeouts (112), innings pitched (109.2) and is seventh in opponents' batting average (.240). Henry sits eighth all-time with 32 career wins at FSU and became just the eighth pitcher all-time to record 14 or more wins in a single season.

Mike Martin was voted by his peers as ACC Coach of the Year for the fifth time in his career after leading the Seminoles to the Atlantic Division title and the No. 1 seed in the ACC Baseball Tournament. Florida State finished the regular season with a 46-9 overall record and, with its' 24-6 record in league play, tied the ACC single-season conference game win mark of 24 set by Clemson a year ago. Martin was previously honored as the top coach in the league in 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2001.

With six first-team selections, Florida State joined the 1977 Clemson Tigers as the only other school in conference history to place six student-athletes on the first team. It also marks the most first-team selections in school history surpassing the previous record of four set three times in 1996, 1999 and 2000. Joining Thomas and Henry on this year's first-team are sopho-

more catcher Buster Posey, freshman third baseman Jason Stidham, junior shortstop Mark Hallberg and junior outfielder Jack Rye. Sophomore outfielder Mark Gildea earned a spot on the second team.

### HE GOT IT

Mike Martin crossed another milestone off his to do list with his team's sweep of Minnesota last season. With the 12-4 win in the second game of the series, Martin became only the eighth coach in NCAA history to reach the 1,400 win-plateau and only the sixth active coach to do so. Of the eight coaches with 1,400 wins Martin has the fourth-best winning percentage and the second-highest winning percentage among active Division I coaches. Of the top 10 coaches across all divisions for wins, only four coaches have a winning percentage above .700 and Mike Martin is among that group. Martin passed another legend with FSU's 14-6 win over Florida in Gainesville as he moved into fifth place all-time passing former High Point and Virginia Tech head skipper Chuck Hartman. Overall, Martin ranks third in the DI 1,400-win club behind Stephenson and former Texas coaching legend Cliff Gustafson for winning percentage.

### NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

Tony Thomas, Jr. is having a season that only few can ever dream of as the Seminole second baseman ranks in the top 10 in 11 different offensive categories in the ACC. Heading into the NCAA Tournament, Thomas ranks in six national categories including doubles per game, triples per game, runs per game, batting average, slugging percentage and stolen bases per game.

Bryan Henry leads the nation in wins with 14, while he ranks 22nd with 107 strikeouts. Teammates Michael Hyde (9) and Ryam Strauss (9) sit 34th in victories. Mark Hallberg concludes the list of Seminoles in the national rankings as he sits 29th in runs per game (1.16) and 33rd in sacrifice hits per game at 0.25.

### NATIONAL SEMIFINALISTS

Senior Bryan Henry and junior Tony Thomas, Jr. were both named semifinalists for the Dick Howser Trophy and the Golden Spikes Award as announced by the respective organizations on Tuesday, May 1.

For the Golden Spikes Award - in total, 40 college and universities are represented on the 2007 semifinalists list. Among the conferences, the ACC landed 10 players on the list to lead the nation. FSU was one of nine schools with multiple players selected to the semifinalists list including three schools from the ACC in North



Carolina, Virginia and Georgia Tech. The winner will be announced on June 29 during the 2007 USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award Show presented by Major League Baseball.

Past Florida State winners of the Golden Spikes Award include J.D. Drew (1997), Mike Loynd (1986) and Mike Fuentes (1984).

The Seminoles are one of three schools to have two semifinalists in the running for the Howser Trophy as announced by the NCBWA and the St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce. Criteria for consideration for the trophy include performance on the field, leadership, moral character and courage, qualities that were exemplified by Dick Howser's life. The 16 semifinalists will be narrowed down to a list of finalist which will be announced on June 7. The winner will be announced at the College World Series on Friday, June 15.

J.D. Drew is the lone FSU recipient of the Dick Howser Trophy winning the award in 1997.

**HOME RUNS ON THE ROAD**

Twenty-nine of the 47 home runs hit by Florida State this season have come on the road including the nine hit against Duke. Before Florida State's weekend series against the Blue Devils beginning back on March 30, the Seminoles had 12 home runs through the first 28 games. FSU left Durham with 21 round trippers in 2007. Yes, Seminole batters hit nine home runs vs. Duke, three in each series, including five by second baseman Tony Thomas, Jr. Thomas hit back-to-back homers in his first two at-bats in game one including the team's first lead off home run of the season. Tommy Oravetz hit his first collegiate homer, while Mark Hallberg hit his first round tripper as a Seminole. Florida State hit seven against Maryland including six in the first game. FSU registered five home runs against Miami while hitting three in game one. The Seminoles have hit three or more home runs in a single-game five times in 2007. Three others have come on the road vs. the Gators including two in Gainesville and one in Jacksonville. FSU also hit two against NC State and two in Atlanta against Georgia Tech. Thomas hit the lone Seminole home run in Jacksonville at the 2007 ACC Tournament.

**'MARK'ING HIS TERRITORY**

Mark Gildea has started 24 straight games in center field and has performed nicely both offensively and defensively for the Seminoles. Since moving into the starting role back on April 8 against NC State, Gildea is hitting .420 (34-for-81). He has posted hits in 17 games, nine multi-

hit contests including six games of three hits or more. Gildea had a career-high four hits in the second game against Maryland as the sophomore right hander went 4-for-4 with three RBI's and three runs scored. A majority of Gildea's damage came in ACC play where he has hit .383 in 28 games which ranks fourth in the league during the regular season. His on base percentage of .495 during conference play is second on the team and third overall in the ACC.

**TOTAL SACRIFICES**

Mark Hallberg has been a welcome addition to the Florida State roster since transferring from Illinois-Chicago a season ago. The junior from Barron, Wisc. has started all 58 games at short-stop where he has posted a fielding percentage of .973. Hallberg is sixth on the team in hitting and third in RBI's. But the stat that is overlooked the most is his team leading 17 total sacrifices including 14 sacrifice bunts. His sacrifice total is tied for the third most in a single season at Florida State with Jose Zabala (1998). Aaron Cheesman holds the single-season record with 22 total sacrifice back in 2005.

**MARSHALL OUT OF THE PEN**

Jimmy Marshall has been a solid go-to-guy out of the bullpen in 2007. The sophomore right hander has made 22 relief appearances this season working 31.2 innings. Marshall is 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA to lead all relievers. He has allowed a run to score in just four of his 22 appearances and has one game in which he gave up two runs, the most runs allowed by Marshall in any outing. He currently has not allowed a run to score in his last 12.2 innings of work.

**DENNIS GUINN RETURNS**

After missing 10 games due to an injury, junior Dennis Guinn returned to the starting line-up in game one of the Clemson series (May 11). Guinn went 0-for-2 and left following his second at-bat after reaggravating the injury to his right knee. Guinn suffered a PCL tear to his right knee in the series finale against Virginia Tech on a diving catch attempt in left field. Guinn saw action in the third game of the ACC Tournament as a pinch hitter in the top of the eighth and remained in the game to play first base. Guinn is expected to see playing time in the Tallahassee Regional.

**FIELDS OF RYE**

Junior Jack Rye has started all 58 games this year with 57 of those starts coming in right field, where he has been perfect all season long. The Irvine, Calif., native has not committed an error in 110 fielding chances while being credited with a pair of outfield assists. Both assists have come on plays at the plate.

### 5-HIT BRIGADE

Shortstop Mark Hallberg became the first Seminole this year to record five hits in a ball game as Florida State defeated Maryland 20-5 in game two. The junior transfer from Illinois-Chicago went 5-for-7 in the game with two doubles, four runs scored and two RBI's. Hallberg's five-hit performance was the first since Tony McQuade went 5-for-5 against the Miami Hurricanes on April 20, 2003.

### SWEEPS ON THE ROAD

Florida State closed out the 2007 schedule posting back-to-back road sweeps as they defeated Maryland and Georgia Tech.

The Seminoles used a combination of hitting and pitching to garner its first road sweep of the season at Maryland. The Seminoles outscored the Terps 32-10 in the three-game series at Shipley Field, while posting a fielding percentage of .991. The pitching staff did its job as the starters registered an ERA of 2.67. All five relief pitchers who appeared in the series combined to shutout the Terps over a combined eight innings of work.

Against GT, the Seminoles outscored the Jackets 44-15 as the Garnet and Gold hit .350 for the series with 11 doubles and 30 free passes.

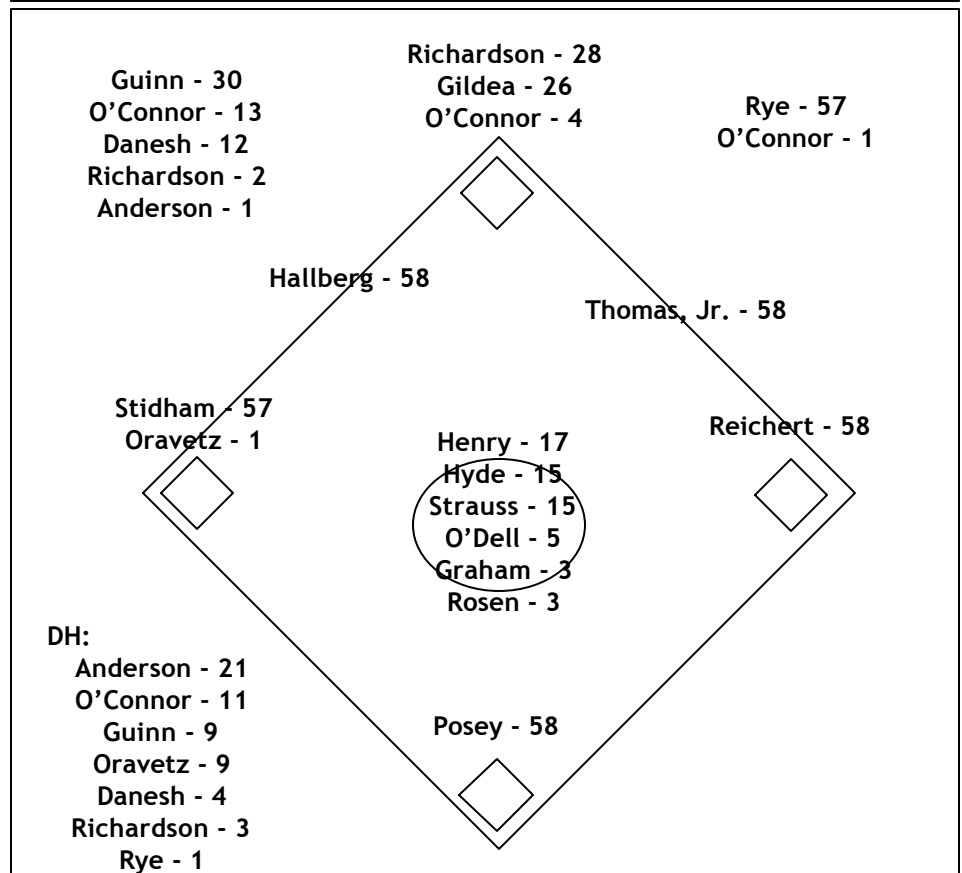
### DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS

In his second start for the Garnet and Gold, Danny Rosen set the season-high for strikeouts in a ball game with 12 against Maryland. Bryan Henry held the previous season-high set back on opening day as he fanned 11 batters in FSU's 9-2 win over Tennessee. Seminole pitchers have registered double-digit strikeouts four times this season. Along with Henry's 11 strikeout performance against Tennessee, the senior right hander also struck out 10 against Boston College. Michael Hyde registered a career-high 10 strikeouts on Feb. 3 against Tennessee.

### INHERITING RUNNERS

Junior transfer Danny Rosen has provided the Seminole bullpen with a huge lift since arriving on campus as a walk-on this season. Rosen leads the team with eight saves in nine opportunities, but more importantly he has pitched well in those tight situations. In six of his 22 relief appearances, Rosen has inherited 13 runners allowing only two to score. Those two runs that scored came in his first appearance as a Seminole and in the second game of the season against Tennessee. Senior Brian Chambers has been just as effective in the same situation as he has inherited 23 runners on 13 separate occasions allowing six to score. Freshman Matt Fairrel has been

just as good allowing just one of 11 inherited runners to score and that one was on Feb. 25.

### ACC ACCOLADES – PART IX

For the ninth time this season and for the seventh time in the last eight weeks, a Seminole student-athlete was recognized with weekly accolades by the conference office.

Jason Stidham closed out the regular season hitting .571 with three doubles, one home run and 10 RBI's as Florida State swept a three-game series from Georgia Tech in Atlanta for the first time in school history.

Stidham registered multiple hits in all three games as he posted his second four-hit game of his career in game one. He also drove in four runs in games one and three-time which were a career-high.

Stidham joins Bryan Henry, who won ACC Pitcher of the Week honors twice this season on May 14 and then again on April 23, as well as Danny Rosen (May 7). Player of the Week accolades went to Buster Posey (April 16), Brandon Reichert (April 9) and Tony Thomas, Jr., who won the award three times on February 12, March 5 and April 2.

### 9 TIMES IN 2007

Florida State has been recognized as either the ACC Player or Pitcher of the Week nine times in 2007 the most of any other school in the league. The mark also ties the school record matched three times before in 1997, 1998 and 1999. It is the fourth time in school history that FSU has received weekly honors from the ACC nine times in one year.

### HENRY JOINS ELITE COMPANY

Bryan Henry collected his fourth career honor as ACC Pitcher of the Week on May 14. He now becomes just the second pitcher in FSU history to win ACC Pitcher of the Week honors at least four times. Paul Wilson is the only other pitcher with four or more weekly conference accolades as he won the award a school record six times.

### 3-PEAT FOR THOMAS

Tony Thomas, Jr. has been recognized by the league office as the ACC Player of the Week three times this season. It is the ninth time that FSU has had an athlete win the weekly honor three times in a season. He joins a list of five other Seminole greats to be recognized by the league office three times in the same year (Paul Wilson and J.D. Drew each won the award three times in a season twice). The last Florida State

player to perform such a feat was Mike Ziegler in 2000.

### FIFTH PLACE ALL-TIME FOR #1

Chalk up yet another milestone for Florida State head coach Mike Martin. With the Seminoles 14-6 win over Florida in Gainesville back on February 20, Martin moved into sole possession of fifth place on the NCAA all-time wins list with 1,445 victories. Martin passed former High Point and Virginia Tech head coach Chuck Hartman on the list, who retired after 46 years as a collegiate head coach. Martin currently sits with 1,482 career victories and is just one win shy of fourth place on the all-time list, a spot held by current Texas Tech field master Larry Hays, who has 1,483 career victories.

### GRAND NIGHT FOR POSEY

Buster Posey broke up a one-run Seminole lead in the sixth inning of game two against Miami with his first career grand slam. The sophomore catcher took a 1-2 offering from Hurricane pitcher Alex Koronis and hit it over the wall in right center for his second home run of the season. The round tripper proved to be the eventual game-winner for the Seminoles.

### MULTI-RBI GAMES

Four Seminoles have posted five or more RBI's in a game this season including Brandon Reichert, Mark Hallberg, Jack Rye and Buster Posey. Rye was the first to eclipse the mark in 2007 driving in six runs in FSU's 16-3 victory over North Florida. Hallberg then drove in a career-high five RBI's in the series finale against Siena. Against Miami, Posey set the season-high for RBI's in a single-game with seven against the Hurricanes. Four of the seven came on Posey's first career grand slam. Reichert drove in a career-high five runs on a single, fielder's choice and three-run home run in FSU's 20-5 win over Maryland in game-two.

### SAVE AND START IN THE SAME WEEK

Two days after earning his eighth save in nine chances in 2007, junior Danny Rosen took the mound for the second time in three games against the University of Miami. But this time as the Sunday starter. Rosen made his first collegiate start as a Seminole throwing a career-high four plus innings in FSU's 7-1 loss. The Miami, Fla., native struck out three and walked four in suffering his first loss of the season.

### NO. 1 IN THE NATION

Florida State held the top spot in *Collegiate Baseball's* top 25 poll for six straight weeks before handing over the reigns to Vanderbilt. The Seminoles earned their first No. 1 ranking of the

season as released by *Collegiate Baseball* on Monday, March 19. FSU has posted a record of 16-7 while being ranked No. 1 in the nation. Florida State also held the top spot in the nation for six weeks starting on March 14, 2006.

### **BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY**

Florida State's 23-0 start was by far the best start in school history, surpassing the team's previous best start by eight games. The Seminoles have started a season with at least a 10-0 record seven times in the program's 60-year history. In the second game against Siena, the Seminoles moved to 16-0 with an 8-3 victory over the Saints, breaking the school record for the best start ever. In 1975, under then head coach Woody Woodward, Florida State began the year 15-0. They finished the '75 season with a mark of 49-10 advancing to the College World Series and finishing the season with a ranking as high as No. 7 by Collegiate Baseball. 1975 also marked the first year as an assistant coach for current head coach Mike Martin. This is the best start in 28 seasons under the legendary ball coach.

### **RUNSA-PLENTY**

The Seminoles have scored 535 runs through 58 games, an average of 9.2 runs per game. That run production through 58 games is the sixth highest total to start a season in the 60 years of Seminole baseball. The school record for most runs scored in a season is 752 set in 1982. That year the Seminoles advanced to the NCAA Regionals playing 74 games averaging 10.2 runs per game. Below is a listing of the top five seasons through the 55 games in Seminole baseball history:

### **RUNS IN BUNCHES**

Sure the Seminoles have scored 535 runs through 58 games this season, the sixth highest 58-game total in school history, but what is impressive is how they are scoring those runs. The Seminoles have posted multiple runs in 128 innings this season and have scored at least one run in 215 of the 465 innings they have played.

### **EARLY NOLE GETS THE 'W'**

Florida State has managed to put runs on the scoreboard in the early goings of the 2007 season outscoring the opposition 210-87 in the first three innings. The Seminoles have scored 70 or more runs in four innings this season, including the first (71), third (86), sixth (77) and seventh (73) innings. Florida State has scored in every inning that they have seen an at-bat this season including a run in extra innings.

### **TWO OUT RUNS**

When it comes to two out run production Florida State has produced so far this season. Through 58 games this season, the Seminoles have scored 208 runs with two outs. That's 38.9% of their run production in 2007 coming with two outs. FSU scored a season-high 11 runs with two outs twice. First coming in the series finale against UNC Asheville, a game the Seminoles won 15-1. The Garnet and Gold then scored 11 runs on two outs in a 15-3 victory over Duke in game one of the series in Durham. Against the Gators, FSU scored nine runs on two outs including four in the first two innings. The Seminoles scored another nine runs on two outs in a 10-2 win over Appalachian State in game two of that series. In the Seminoles first ACC series in 2007, Florida State outscored Wake Forest 22-10 as 12 of the 22 runs recorded came on two outs. The Seminoles finished out the regular season scoring 16 of the 44 runs posted against Georgia Tech on two outs including nine, two-out runs in game one.

### **AND TWO OUT HITS**

Probably the most overlooked stat is what the team is doing with two outs in an inning. FSU is batting .335 as a team posting 231 hits in 689 two-out opportunities. Four Seminoles are batting .370 or better, six have registered 20 or more hits and eight have tallied 10 or more RBI's. Junior Jack Rye leads the team with two-out RBI's as 29 of his 57 runs batted in have come in that situation. Freshman Jason Stidham leads the team with 28 two-out hits.

### **DOUBLE-DIGIT RUNS & HITS**

The Seminoles got off to a hot start in 2007 as they scored double-digit runs in 13 of their first 17 games. FSU had a string of eight straight double-digit run games earlier this year. In the 60-year history of Seminole baseball, Florida State registered double-digit runs in eight consecutive games just twice, the last time coming in 2003 when the Seminoles strung together nine straight games of 10+ runs. FSU has posted 25 double-digit run games this year.

FSU has also posted double-digit hits in 46 of its 58 games played so far including a streak of 16 straight at one point in the season. Since 1996, the Seminoles have had a streak of eight or more double-digit hit games 10 times, including a more recent streak of 11 games in a row which came to an end in game two vs. UNC. This year's 16 straight double-digit hit games are the longest of record dating back to 1996. The previous best was 10 straight posted back in 2003.

### **HOLD IT RIGHT THERE**

Florida State is leading the ACC in limiting the opposition to the fewest number of stolen bases attempted in 2007. Opponents have attempted a league low 45 stolen bases against the Seminoles and catcher Buster Posey is a big reason for that. Through 58 games, Posey is throwing out 41.5% of attempted base stealers. He has had only 41 stolen base attempts against him all season. Posey also leads the team in pickoffs as he has recorded five in 2007. To put the number in perspective, North Carolina is second in the ACC as opponents have attempted 52 stolen bases against the Tar Heels.

### **FROM CATCHER TO PITCHER**

Sophomore Buster Posey made his much anticipated pitching debut at Florida State in the third game of the series against UNC Asheville. Posey went from behind the plate to the mound in the top of the fifth and pitched a scoreless inning. The Leesburg, Ga., native induced a pair of groundball outs including an inning ending 6-4-3 double play.

### **40 WINS AND COUNTING**

After going 1-2 in the ACC Tournament, Florida State moved to 47-11 on the year. The Seminoles were the first team to reach the 40-win plateau with a 9-3 victory over Maryland back on May 4. FSU and Charlotte both sit with 47 wins tied for sixth nationally in that category. After leading the country in winning percentage for a good portion of the season, the Seminoles currently sit fourth with a mark of .810.

### **SEEING DOUBLE**

FSU has hit 163 doubles through 58 games this season, that's an average of 2.8 doubles per game. If the Seminoles continue on their current doubles pace, they could hit 169 doubles, falling slightly off pace of the school record of 182 double hit in 72 games back in 1990, an average of 2.5 doubles per game that year.

### **LIMITING THE ERRORS**

At one stretch during the season, Florida State went six games without committing an error, a span covering 63.2 consecutive innings. It is the

longest errorless streak since 1993 when FSU went five straight games without posting an error. FSU also started the season with a streak of 36 consecutive innings without committing an error.

Through 58 games this season, FSU has posted a fielding percentage of .974 committing 58 errors in 2,204 total chances. The 2005 and 2006 squads rank as two of the top five best defensive teams in FSU history posting a .967 fielding percentage in each of the last two years. Here is a look at the top five fielding teams in school history dating back to 1973:

**FIELDING THE INFIELD**

Florida State's starting infield of Buster Posey at catcher, Brandon Reichert at first, Tony Thomas at second, Mark Hallberg at shortstop and Jason Stidham at third, have combined to post a fielding percentage of .977. Four of those five Seminoles have started all 58 games at the listed position, while Stidham has started in 57 games at third. Posey has committed the fewest errors (3) while Stidham has the most errors with 13.

**PERFECT FEBRUARY**

Florida State posted a perfect 14-0 record in the month of February for just the fifth time in the 60-year history of Seminole baseball. It was the first time the Seminoles went undefeated in the first month of the season since 1979 when the Garnet and Gold went 2-0. The previous record for the best undefeated mark in the month of February was 5-0 registered back in 1976.

**WALK-OFF JACK**

FSU played its first extra inning game of the season on March 16 against Wake Forest and came through with a victory defeating the Deacs 7-6 in 11 innings. Junior Jack Rye, who has come through in clutch situations for the Seminoles this season, provided FSU with its first walk-off hit of the season singling home the winning run with two outs in the bottom of the 11th. Rye registered his third RBI of the game as his single glanced off the glove of the leaping second baseman. The ball trickled away just enough to allow Rye to reach first and pinch runner Ryan Strauss to score from third for the game-winner.

**ONE IS A LONELY NUMBER**

Florida State was the last remaining unbeaten team in Division I baseball until a March 21 tilt against Jacksonville. JU handed the Seminoles their first loss of the season, snapping FSU's 23-game winning streak to start the season.

**FSU IN THE ACC**

Following the ACC Tournament in Jacksonville, Florida State ranks as the top hitting and second best fielding team in the conference. FSU has posted an average of .355 through 58 games, while registering a team fielding percentage of .974. The Seminoles are third in the ACC in team ERA at 3.55.

Tony Thomas, Jr. leads the league in seven offensive categories, while ranking in the top 10 in four others including triples per game (2nd), stolen bases per game (3rd), home runs per game (6th) and walks per game (8th). Listed below are the following categories that Thomas leads the ACC in:

**FIRST COLLEGIATE HOME RUNS**

D'Vontrey Richardson and Jason Stidham each hit their first collegiate home run against the Florida Gators in the Seminoles 14-6 victory in Gainesville. Stidham connected on a solo shot in the top of the fifth off reliever Josh Edmondson. The freshman third baseman sent a 1-2 offering over the wall in right for his first digger of the season. Richardson hit a three-run shot in the top of the eighth to put a stamp on the Seminole victory. The freshman center

fielder sent a rocket shot that cleared the bleacher seats in left for his first career round tripper.

Stephen Cardullo got in on the action as he hit his first collegiate home run against North Florida. The freshman from Coral Springs, Fla., took the first offering he saw from Osprey reliever Paul Morales and sent the ball over the wall in left center for a three-run shot.

Ohmed Danesh registered his first collegiate home run in game two against North Carolina. Danesh blasted a solo shot over the right field to lead off the Seminole fourth.

**2007 HONORS & AWARDS**

**Bryan Henry** was named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week on Monday, February 5, 2007 for his performance on the mound against Tennessee on opening day. He added ACC Pitcher of the Week for his masterful performance against No. 2 North Carolina and again on May 14 in a win over No. 16 Clemson.

Rivals.com recognized first-year third baseman **Jason Stidham** as the Freshman of the Week for his performance against Tennessee. Stidham became the ninth Seminole to earn ACC Player of the Week honors as he hit .571 with 10 RBI's in leading FSU to a three-game sweep over GT. He was also honored as the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week for his performance against the Jackets.

**Tony Thomas, Jr.**, has been honored by the league office three times in 2007 (2/12, 3/5, 4/2). He was also honored as the Louisville Slugger and NCBWA National Player of the Week for his play at Duke.

**Brandon Reichert** received ACC Player of the Week honors thanks to his play against NC State. Catcher

**Buster Posey** joined the list of ACC honorees as he was recognized as the Player of the Week for his play against Jacksonville and Virginia Tech.

**Danny Rosen** received ACC Pitcher of the Week accolades for his 12-strikeout performance against Maryland - a season, team-high.

Thomas, Henry, Reichert and Posey have each received accolades on the National Honor Roll by the College Baseball Foundation.

Mike Martin is one of the most successful coaches in the history of college baseball. The field at Dick Howser Stadium was named after him on April 2, 2005 during his 26<sup>th</sup> season as head coach of the Seminoles and in 2007 he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame. Martin, who played center field for the Seminoles in 1965 and 1966, is by far the winningest coach in FSU history. He has led the Seminoles to 12 College World Series appearances and 28 consecutive NCAA Regional Appearances. He has won 15 conference championships since taking over as head coach in 1980 with 11 from the Metro Conference and four in the ACC. He was six-time Metro Conference Coach of the Year and has been the ACC Coach of the Year five times. In 2006 Martin won his 1,400<sup>th</sup> game becoming just the eighth coach in NCAA history to reach that milestone. With his win over Wake Forest on May 6<sup>th</sup>, he passed Cliff Gustafson and moved into seventh place for all-time wins. Sixty-two Florida State players have earned All-America honors under Martin and 112 players earned first team all-conference recognition. He has coached four players, Mike Fuentes, Mike Loynd, J.D. Drew and Shane Robinson, who were named national players of the year. He was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005.

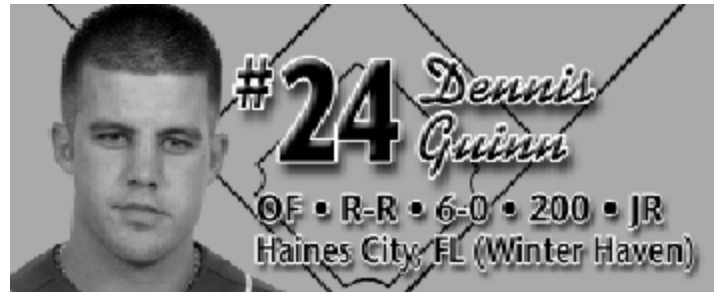
