# Submission of new manuscripts

The manuscript is included by the author who has been registered online in the "Journal of Biological Sciences and Medicine" Journal system. The author can register in the journal system at: <a href="http://jbscim.com">http://jbscim.com</a>

# General Terms of Writing

All articles submitted to the Journal of Biological Sciences and Medicine must be from original research results that have not been published previously and submitted specifically to Journal of Biological Sciences and Medicine. The manuscript is adapted to the format of the updated December 2015 Recommendations for the Conduct, Reporting, Editing and Publication of Scholarly Work in Medical Journals, developed by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE).

## Code of Conduct Publication

The Journal of Biological Sciences and Medicine follows the instructions of the committee on publication ethics (COPE) in all aspects of publication ethics, particularly in cases of unfavorable conduct in research and publication.

## **Text Formatting**

Manuscripts should be submitted in Word. Use a normal, plain font (e.g., 12 point Times Roman) for text. Use italics for emphasis. Use the automatic page numbering function to number the pages. Do not use field functions. Use tab stops or other commands for indents, not the space bar. Use the table function, not spreadsheets, to make tables. Use the equation editor or Math Type for equations. Save your file in docx format (Word 2007 or higher) or doc format (older Word versions).

## Title Page

The title page should include the names of the authors, concise and informative title, the affiliations and addresses of the authors, the email address, telephone and fax numbers of the corresponding author.

#### Abstract

Please provide an abstract of 100 to 250 words excluding any undefined abbreviations or unspecified references.

## Keywords

Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes.

## Introduction

In this section, the authors should provide the background information to clear about the purpose of the study, describing the main objectives of the study. All the relevant abbreviations should be defined and mentioned first and thereafter used consistently throughout the manuscript.

#### Materials and methods

All the information necessary to explain the experimental work should be given in this section. Whenever citing a modification of published methodology, please provide supporting references of the original source. Statistical analysis of the data wherever applicable is required, using appropriate methods must be cited.

#### Results

Results should be presented by referring to tables and figures described in the study carried out, excluding the discussion part.

## Discussion

This section includes a summary of the major findings, a discussion of the validity of the observations, how the findings relate to other published works dealing with the subject and significance of the work.

#### Conclusion

The manuscript should have relevant brief conclusion reflecting the importance and future scope of the study.

# Conflict of Interest

The prepared manuscript should have the declaration of conflict of interest including the following paragraph-

There are no conflict of interest.

## Acknowledgments

Acknowledgments of people, grants or funds should be placed properly and the names of funding organizations should be written in full.

#### References

#### Citation

Cite references in the text by name and year in parentheses such as (Thompson 1990); Becker and Seligman (1996); (Abbott 1991; Barakat et al. 1995; Kelso and Smith 1998; Medvec et al. 1999). Cite references in the text by name and year in parentheses.

All references cited in the text should be listed in the References section in alphabetical order according to the surname of the first author. For two-author papers with the same first author, the

order is alphabetical by the second author's name. For three-or-more-author papers with the same first author, the order is chronological. The References section should be double spaced like the rest of the manuscript. The following examples illustrate the format to be used for different types of references:

All tables are to be numbered using Arabic numerals and cited in the text in consecutive numerical order. For each table, please provide a table caption or title explaining the details of the table.

## **Figure**

The acceptable format for figures is PPT, TIFF or MS Office files. Name your figure files with "Fig" and the figure number, e.g., Fig1.

#### **Permissions**

If you include figures that have already been published elsewhere, you must obtain permission from the copyright owner(s) for both the print and online format. Please be aware that some publishers do not grant electronic rights for free and that journal will not be able to refund any costs that may have occurred to receive these permissions. In such cases, material from other sources should be used.

#### **Ethical Issues**

The authors who are including the usage of experimental animals and human subjects in their research article should seek approval from the appropriate Ethical committee in accordance with "Principles of Laboratory Animal Care". For this, the Materials and Method section of the manuscript should include a statement to prove that the investigation was approved and consented by the relevant authority.

# **Publication Charges**

As this is an open access journal and if the manuscript is accepted for publication, the authors has to pay Rs. 2000/- or US dollar \$ 50 per article towards processing, publishing and e-prints and this may be intimated within one week from the date of manuscript submission. The modes of fee payment will also be intimated in the acceptance email letter.
