





SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Burry Port, based on CACI's 2011 'PayCheck' data, is £20,938 which is the 9th lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 28.2% below the Carmarthenshire mean of £29,156.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people in Supervisory, clerical, junior managerial/professional employment (C1) and a high proportion of semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers (D) is higher than the proportion on state benefit (E).

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2011 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2011 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire. Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Burry Port 1** ranks 29 out of the 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and ranks 612 in Wales from 1896 LSOAs, whilst **Burry Port 2** ranks 14th in Carmarthenshire and 394 in Wales. **Burry Port 3** ranks 82 in Carmarthenshire and 1144 in Wales.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Burry Port 1** is the Income domain, being ranked 16th in Carmarthenshire and 406 in Wales for this domain. Whilst in **Burry Port 2** the Employment domain is the most promient both ranking 9th in Carmarthenshire and 223 in Wales. The Employment domain ranks as the highest level of deprivation in **Burry Port 3** ranking 53rd in Carmarthenshire and 861 in Wales.
