





### SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Carmarthen Town South, based on CACI's 2011 'PayCheck' data, is £23,562 which is the 36<sup>th</sup> highest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 19.2% below the Carmarthenshire mean of £29,156.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people on state benefit, unemployment or low grade workers (grade E) and a higher than average supervisory, clerical, junior managerial/professional workers (grade C1).

# WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2011 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2011 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire.

WIMD 2011 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived **Carmarthen Town South 1** ranks 25 out of 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 566 in Wales from 1896 LSOAs, whilst **Carmarthen Town South 2** ranks 104 in Carmarthenshire and 1437in Wales.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Carmarthen Town South 1** is the Housing domain, being ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 186<sup>th</sup> in Wales for this domain. In **Carmarthen Town South 2** the Physical Environment domain is the most prominent ranking 8<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 122 in Wales.
