





## SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Glanymor, based on CACI's 2011 'PayCheck' data, is £19,246 which is the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 34% below the Carmarthenshire mean of £29,156.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people on state benefit, unemployment or low grade workers (grade E) and a higher than average semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers (grade D).

## WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2011 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2011 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire. Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived **Glanymor 1** ranks 4 out of 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 156 in Wales from 1896 LSOAs. **Glanymor 2** ranks 7 in Carmarthenshire and 192 in Wales. Whilst **Glanymor 3** ranks 3 in Carmarthenshire out of 112 LSOAs and is ranked 131 from 1896 LSOAs in Wales.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Glanymor 1** is the Education and Physical Environment domains, being ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 73<sup>rd</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> respectively in Wales for these domains. In **Glanymor 2** the Physical Environemnt domain is the most prominent ranking 2<sup>nd</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 21<sup>st</sup> in Wales. In **Glanymor 3** the Health, Education and Community Safety Domains are equally the most prominent, ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 107<sup>th</sup>, 150<sup>th</sup> and 220<sup>th</sup> respectively in Wales.
