







#### SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Lliedi, based on CACI's 2011 'PayCheck' data, is £20,796 which is the 7<sup>th</sup> lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 28.7% below the Carmarthenshire mean of £29,156.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people on state benefit, unemployed or low grade workers (grade E) and a slightly higher than average semi-skilled and unskilled manual workers (grade D) also the number of people classes as being supervisory, clerical, junior managerial/professional (grade C1) is slightly higher than the Carmarthenshire average.

#### WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2011 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2011 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire. Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Lliedi 1** ranks 30 in Carmarthenshire from 112 LSOAs and is ranked 635 in Wales from 1896 LSOAs. **Lliedi 2** ranks 95 in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 1277 in Wales, whilst **Lliedi** 3 ranks as the 10<sup>th</sup> most deprived area in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 273 in Wales from 1896 LSOAs.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Lliedi 1** is the Community Safety domain, being ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 293 in Wales for this domain. In **Lliedi 2** the Health domain is the most prominent, ranking 53<sup>rd</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 813 in Wales. In **Lliedi 3** it is also the Health domain that is the most prominent, ranking 2<sup>nd</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 50<sup>th</sup> in Wales.
